For Freedom Christ Has Set Us Free

Proverbs 29:25 CSB

25 The fear of mankind is a snare, but the one who trusts in the LORD is protected.

Luke 12:11-12 ESV

11 And when they bring you before the synagogues and the rulers and the authorities, do not be anxious about how you should defend yourself or what you should say,

12 for the Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say."

Matthew 10:16-20 ESV

16 Behold, <u>I am sending you out</u> as <u>sheep</u> in <u>the midst of wolves</u>, so <u>be wise as serpents</u> and <u>innocent as</u> doves.

17 Beware of men, for they will deliver you over to courts and flog you in their synagogues,

18 and <u>you will be dragged before governors</u> and <u>kings</u> for my sake, to <u>bear witness before them</u> and <u>the</u> Gentiles.

19 When they deliver you over, <u>do not be anxious how you are to speak</u> or <u>what you are to say</u>, for <u>what you are to say</u> will <u>be given to you</u> in <u>that hour</u>.

20 For it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you.

Galatians 1:6-10 ESV

6 <u>I am astonished</u> that you are <u>so quickly deserting him</u> who <u>called you in the grace of Christ</u> and are <u>turning</u> <u>to a different gospel--</u>

7 not that there is another one, but <u>there are some</u> who <u>trouble you</u> and <u>want to distort</u> the <u>gospel of Christ</u>.

8 But even if we or an angel from heaven should <u>preach to you a gospel</u> <u>contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed.</u>

9 As we have said before, so now I say again: If <u>anyone is preaching to you</u> a <u>gospel contrary to the one</u> <u>you received</u>, <u>let him be accursed</u>.

10 For <u>am I now seeking</u> the <u>approval of man</u>, or <u>of God</u>? Or am I <u>trying to please man</u>? If I were <u>still trying to please man</u>, I <u>would not be a servant of Christ</u>.

- Living your life to please a man or woman, because they are requiring that you do so, means you are no longer living to please and serve God.
- Men and women usurp control over other's lives for selfish advantage: money, power, position, fame, ego.
- Men and women usurp control over other's lives by enticement or intimidation.

Matthew 20:25-26 ESV

25 But Jesus called them to him and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles <u>lord</u> it <u>over them</u>, and their great ones <u>exercise authority</u> <u>over them</u>.

26 It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant.

- 1 Peter 5:2-3 ESV
- 2 shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight...
- 3 <u>not domineering over</u> those in your charge, but <u>being examples</u> to the flock.

Matthew 23:1-7 CSB

- 1 Then Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples:
- 2 The scribes and the Pharisees are <u>seated in the chair of Moses</u>.
- 3 Therefore <u>do whatever they tell you</u>, and observe it. But <u>don't do what they do</u>, because <u>they don't practice</u> <u>what they teach</u>.
- 4 They <u>tie up heavy loads</u> that <u>are hard to carry</u> and <u>put them on people's shoulders</u>, but <u>they themselves</u> <u>aren't willing</u> to <u>lift a finger</u> to <u>move them</u>.
- 5 They <u>do everything to</u> be <u>seen by others</u>: They enlarge their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels.
- 6 They <u>love the place of honor</u> at banquets, the front seats in the synagogues,
- 7 greetings in the marketplaces, and to be called 'Rabbi' by people.

Matthew 23:13 CSB

13 Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! You shut the door of the kingdom of heaven in people's faces. For you don't go in, and you don't allow those entering to go in.

Hebrews 8:10-11 ESV

- 10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will <u>put my laws into their minds</u>, and <u>write them on their hearts</u>, and <u>I will be their God</u>, and they shall be my people.
- 11 And <u>they shall not teach</u>, each one his neighbor and each one his brother, saying, '<u>Know the Lord</u>,' for <u>they shall all know me</u>, from <u>the least</u> of them <u>to the greatest</u>.

Galatians 2:1-5 ESV

- 1 Then after fourteen years I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, taking Titus along with me.
- 2 I went up <u>because of a revelation</u> and <u>set before them</u> (though privately before those who seemed influential) <u>the gospel that I proclaim</u> <u>among the Gentiles</u>, in order <u>to make sure</u> I <u>was not running</u> or <u>had not run in vain</u>.
- 3 But even Titus, who was with me, was not forced to be circumcised, though he was a Greek.
- 4 Yet <u>because of false brothers</u> <u>secretly brought in--who slipped in to spy out our freedom</u> that <u>we have in Christ Jesus</u>, so that they <u>might bring us into slavery--</u>
- 5 to them we did not yield in submission even for a moment, so that the truth of the gospel might be preserved for you.

Galatians 2:11-13 ESV

- 11 But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned.
- 12 For <u>before certain men came</u> from James, he <u>was eating with the Gentiles</u>; but <u>when they came</u> he <u>drew back</u> and <u>separated himself</u>, <u>fearing the circumcision party</u>.
- 13 And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy.

Galatians 4:17 ESV

17 They make much of you, but for no good purpose. They want to shut you out, that you may make much of them.

Galatians 5:1 ESV

1 For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

Galatians 5:7-12 ESV

- 7 You were running well. Who hindered you from obeying the truth?
- 8 This persuasion is not from him who calls you.
- 9 A little leaven leavens the whole lump.
- 10 I have confidence in the Lord that you will take no other view, and the one who is troubling you will bear the penalty, whoever he is.
- 11 But if I, brothers, still preach circumcision, why am I still being persecuted? In that case the offense of the cross has been removed.
- 12 I wish those who unsettle you would emasculate themselves!

1 Peter 2:13-17 ESV

- 13 Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme,
- 14 or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good.
- 15 For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people.
- 16 Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God.
- 17 Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.

Acts 5:27-29 ESV

- 27 And when they had brought them, they <u>set them</u> <u>before the council</u>. And <u>the high priest questioned them</u>, 28 saying, "We <u>strictly charged you</u> <u>not to teach in this name</u>, yet here <u>you have filled Jerusalem</u> with <u>your teaching</u>, and you intend to bring this man's blood upon us."
- 29 But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men.
