# Holiness - The Imprint Of God

# 1 Peter 1:3-5 ESV

3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, <u>he has caused us</u> to <u>be born again to a living hope</u> through <u>the resurrection of Jesus Christ</u> from the dead,

4 to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you,

5 who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

# 1 Peter 1:13-16 ESV

13 Therefore, <u>preparing your minds</u> for action, and <u>being sober-minded</u>, <u>set your hope fully</u> on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

14 As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance,

15 but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct,

16 since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."

holy (hagios) sacred, worthy of reverence, consecrated, pure, set apart for God, exclusively His

- Holiness is not the result of some religious fervor or experience.
- Holiness is not the result of some ritual or formula, either self-inflicted or mandated by some religious order.
- Holiness is not the acquisition of spiritual status, rank or achievement.
- Holiness is not superhero powers nor spiritual elitism.
- Holiness is the indelible imprint left upon your soul by the very presence and power of God experienced in His Word.
- God's work in your heart by His Word is a sanctifying work of separating you from sin and separating you unto God.

# 2 Corinthians 4:6-10 ESV

6 For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," <u>has shone in our hearts</u> to give the light of the <u>knowledge</u> of <u>the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ</u>.

7 But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us.

8 We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair;

9 persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed;

10 always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies.

### John 17:16-17 ESV

16 They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world.

17 Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth.

sanctify (hagiaz $\bar{o}$ ) to make holy, to be venerable, separate from the profane, dedicate to God, consecrate

- 2 Corinthians 3:2-18 ESV
- 2 You yourselves are our letter of recommendation, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all.
- 3 And you show that <u>you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God</u>, <u>not on tablets of stone</u> but <u>on tablets of human hearts</u>.

Hebrews 8:10-12 ESV

10 For this is the covenant that <u>I will make</u> with the house of Israel <u>after those days</u>, declares the Lord: I will <u>put my laws into their minds</u>, and <u>write them on their hearts</u>, and <u>I will be their God</u>, and <u>they shall be my people</u>.

11 And they shall not teach, each one his neighbor and each one his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest.

12 For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more."

- The writing of the Word of God upon our hearts is:
  - the Holy Spirit illuminating our hearts and minds to understand the meaning
  - when the very life of Jesus Himself is birthed and grows within us
  - the power of God transforming our heart, separating us from sin and further uniting us with Christ.

#### 2 Corinthians 3:2-18 ESV

- 4 Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God.
- 5 Not that we are sufficient in ourselves to claim anything as coming from us, but our sufficiency is from God, 6 who has made us sufficient to be ministers of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit. For the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.
- 7 Now <u>if the ministry of death</u>, <u>carved in letters on stone</u>, <u>came with such glory</u> that the Israelites <u>could not gaze at Moses' face</u> because of its glory, which was being brought to an end,
- 8 will not the ministry of the Spirit have even more glory?
- 9 For <u>if there was glory in the ministry of condemnation</u>, the ministry of righteousness <u>must far exceed it in glory</u>.
- 10 Indeed, in this case, what once had glory has come to have no glory at all, because of the glory that surpasses it.
- 11 For if what was being brought to an end came with glory, much more will what is permanent have glory.
- 12 Since we have such a hope, we are very bold,
- 13 not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not gaze at the outcome of what was being brought to an end.
- 14 But <u>their minds were hardened</u>. For to this day, when they read the old covenant, that same veil remains unlifted, because only through Christ is it taken away.
- 15 Yes, to this day whenever Moses is read a veil lies over their hearts.
- 16 But when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed.
- 17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.
- 18 And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.

# James 1:18 ESV

18 Of his own will <u>he brought us forth</u> by the word of truth, that we should be a <u>kind of firstfruits</u> [to offer firstlings, consecrated to God] <u>of his creatures</u>.

# 1 Peter 1:22-23 ESV

- 22 <u>Having purified your souls</u> by <u>your obedience to the truth</u> for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart,
- 23 since <u>you have been born again</u>, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, <u>through the living</u> and <u>abiding word of God</u>;

# James 1:21 ESV

21 Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and <u>receive with meekness</u> the implanted <u>word</u>, which is <u>able to save your souls</u>.

#### Hebrews 4:12 ESV

12 For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

# 2 Peter 1:3-4 ESV

- 3 <u>His divine power</u> has <u>granted to us all things</u> that <u>pertain to life</u> and <u>godliness</u>, <u>through the knowledge</u> <u>of him</u> who <u>called us to his own glory</u> and <u>excellence</u>,
- 4 by which he has granted to us <u>his precious</u> and <u>very great promises</u>, so that <u>through them</u> you <u>may</u> <u>become partakers of the divine nature</u>, having <u>escaped from the corruption that is in the world</u> because of sinful desire.

# Romans 12:2 ESV

2 <u>Do not be conformed to this world</u>, but <u>be transformed</u> by <u>the renewal of your mind</u>, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

## Isaiah 55:10-11 ESV

10 For <u>as the rain</u> and <u>the snow come down from heaven</u> and do not return there but <u>water the earth</u>, <u>making it bring forth and sprout</u>, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater,

11 <u>so shall my word be</u> that <u>goes out from my mouth</u>; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.
