Godly Discernment Of Circumstances And People Is Vital

Philippians 1:9 ESV

9 And it is my prayer that <u>your love may abound more and more</u>, with <u>knowledge and all discernment</u>, 10 so that you may <u>approve what is excellent</u>, and <u>so be pure</u> and <u>blameless</u> for <u>the day of Christ</u>, 11 <u>filled with the fruit of righteousness</u> that <u>comes through Jesus Christ</u>, to the glory and praise of God.

- How desperately we need God's wisdom to accurately apply His Truth to the present circumstances and people!
- God's Word and Spirit will always break through the fog and the darkness to illuminate.

Hebrews 5:13-14 ESV

13 for everyone who lives on milk is <u>unskilled in the word of righteousness</u>, since he is a child.

14 But solid food is for <u>the mature</u>, for those who have <u>their powers of discernment trained</u> <u>by constant practice</u> to <u>distinguish good from evil</u>.

James 1:5 ESV

5 <u>If any of you lacks wisdom</u>, let him <u>ask God</u>, who <u>gives generously to all</u> <u>without reproach</u>, and <u>it will</u> <u>be given</u> him.

Proverbs 4:4-9 ESV

- 4 he taught me and said to me, "Let your heart hold fast my words; keep my commandments, and live.
- 5 Get wisdom; get insight; do not forget, and do not turn away from the words of my mouth.
- 6 Do not forsake her, and she will keep you; love her, and she will guard you.
- 7 The <u>beginning of wisdom</u> is this: <u>Get wisdom</u>, and <u>whatever you get</u>, <u>get insight</u>.
- 8 Prize her highly, and she will exalt you; she will honor you if you embrace her.
- 9 She will place on your head a graceful garland; she will bestow on you a beautiful crown."

Isaiah 30:20-22 ESV

20 And though the Lord give you the bread of adversity and the water of affliction, yet <u>your Teacher will</u> <u>not hide himself anymore</u>, but <u>your eyes shall see your Teacher</u>.

21 And <u>your ears shall hear a word behind you</u>, saying, "<u>This is the way</u>, walk in it," <u>when you turn to the right</u> or <u>when you turn to the left</u>.

22 <u>Then you will defile your carved idols</u> overlaid with silver and your gold-plated metal images. <u>You will scatter them as unclean things</u>. You will say to them, "Be gone!"

Acts 16:16-23 ESV

- 16 As we were going to the place of prayer, we were <u>met by a slave girl</u> who had <u>a spirit of divination</u> and <u>brought her owners much gain by fortune-telling</u>.
- 17 <u>She followed Paul</u> and us, <u>crying out</u>, "<u>These men are servants of the Most High God</u>, who <u>proclaim to</u> you the way of salvation."
- 18 And this <u>she kept doing for many days</u>. Paul, <u>having become greatly annoyed</u>, turned and said to the spirit, "<u>I command you</u> in the name of Jesus Christ <u>to come out of her</u>." And <u>it came out that very hour</u>.

 19 But when her owners saw that <u>their hope of gain was gone</u>, they <u>seized Paul and Silas</u> and <u>dragged them into the marketplace</u> before the rulers.
- 20 And when they had brought them to the magistrates, they said, "These men are Jews, and they are disturbing our city.
- 21 They advocate customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to accept or practice."
- 22 The crowd <u>joined in attacking them</u>, and the magistrates <u>tore the garments off them</u> and <u>gave orders</u> <u>to beat them with rods</u>.
- 23 And when they had <u>inflicted many blows upon them</u>, they <u>threw them into prison</u>, <u>ordering the jailer</u> <u>to keep them safely</u>.

What Man Calls Defeat And Failure, Is Victory And Success With God

Philippians 1:12-14 ESV

- 12 I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel,
- 13 so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ.
- 14 And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.
 - The greatest of all works among mankind, the advent of Jesus Christ, was deemed a failure by men.

Isaiah 53:2-3 ESV

- 2 For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; <u>he had no form</u> or <u>majesty</u> that <u>we should look at him</u>, and <u>no beauty</u> that <u>we should desire him</u>.
- 3 <u>He was despised</u> and <u>rejected by men</u>, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and <u>as one from whom men hide their faces</u> he was despised, and <u>we esteemed him not</u>.

John 1:45-46 ESV

- 45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."
- 46 Nathanael said to him, "<u>Can anything good come out of Nazareth</u>?" Philip said to him, "Come and see."

- Whenever the success or failure of a ministry is judged by human or worldly criteria:
 - the spiritual discernment of verses 9, 10 is not present and working.

Philippians 1:9 ESV

9 And it is my prayer that <u>your love may abound</u> <u>more and more</u>, with <u>knowledge</u> and <u>all</u> discernment,

10 so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ,

 the ministry is not pure, but corrupted by worldly business models, marketing strategies and metrics-driven standards. (Only in the U.S. are there so many pastors who are multi-millionaire celebrities.)

2 Corinthians 10:12 ESV

12 Not that we dare to classify or compare ourselves with some of those who are commending themselves. But when they measure themselves by one another and compare themselves with one another, they are without understanding.

<u>measure</u> (metreō) to judge according to a rule or standard, to mete out with a measurer's reed or rule

- 2 Samuel 24:9-13 ESV
- 9 And <u>Joab gave the sum of the numbering of the people</u> to the king: in Israel there were 800,000 valiant men who drew the sword, and the men of Judah were 500,000.
- 10 But <u>David's heart struck him</u> after <u>he had numbered the people</u>. And David said to the LORD, "<u>I have sinned greatly in what I have done</u>. But now, O LORD, <u>please take away the iniquity of your servant</u>, for <u>I have done very foolishly</u>."
- 11 And when David arose in the morning, the word of the LORD came to the prophet Gad, David's seer, saying,
- 12 "Go and say to David, 'Thus says the LORD, <u>Three things I offer you</u>. Choose one of them, that I may do it to you.'"
- 13 So Gad came to David and told him, and said to him, "Shall three years of famine come to you in your land? Or will you flee three months before your foes while they pursue you? Or shall there be three days' pestilence in your land? Now consider, and decide what answer I shall return to him who sent me."
- With God, there is <u>one</u> and <u>only one</u> standard of success: faithfulness to what God has appointed to you.
 - 1 Corinthians 4:1-5 ESV
 - 1 This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God.
 - 2 Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful.
 - 3 But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself [by human, worldly criteria].

- 4 For I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. <u>It is the Lord</u> who judges me.
- 5 Therefore <u>do not pronounce judgment before the time</u>, before the Lord comes, <u>who will bring</u> <u>to light</u> the <u>things now hidden in darkness</u> and <u>will disclose the purposes of the heart</u>. Then <u>each</u> <u>one will receive his commendation</u> <u>from God</u>.
- 2 Timothy 4:6-8 ESV
- 6 For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come.
- 7 I have <u>fought the good fight</u>, I have <u>finished the race</u>, I have <u>kept the faith</u>.
- 8 Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing.

Isaiah 55:8-9 ESV

8 For <u>my thoughts are not your thoughts</u>, <u>neither are your ways my ways</u>, declares the LORD.
9 For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are <u>my ways higher than your ways</u> and <u>my thoughts than your thoughts</u>.

• How do you judge your personal life:

- o by worldly standards of "success?"
- o by faithfulness to what God has appointed for you?

Matthew 25:14-30 ESV

- 14 For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property.
- 15 To one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability (dynamis strength, power, might, ability). Then he went away.
 - The person assigned 5 talents is not superior to the person with 2 talents.
 - God specializes in "load-balancing;" ability vs. load.
 - 1 Corinthians 3:5-7 ESV
 - 5 What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, as the Lord assigned to each.
 - 6 I planted, Apollos watered, but <u>God gave the growth</u>.
 - 7 So <u>neither he who plants</u> nor <u>he who waters is anything</u>, but <u>only God who gives the growth</u>.
 - 1 Corinthians 10:13 ESV
 - 13 No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and <u>he</u> <u>will not let you be tempted</u> <u>beyond your ability</u>, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

"When we truly live in 'the secret place,' it becomes impossible for us to doubt God. We become more sure of Him than of anyone or anything else. Enter into 'the secret place,'

and you will find that God was right in the middle of your everyday circumstances all the time. Get into the habit of dealing with God about everything. Unless you learn to open the door of your life completely and let God in from your first waking moment of each new day, you will be working on the wrong level throughout the day. But if you will swing the door of your life fully open and 'pray to your Father who is in the secret place,' every public thing in your life will be marked with the lasting imprint of the presence of God."

Matthew 25:14-30 ESV

16 He who had <u>received the five talents</u> <u>went at once</u> and <u>traded with them</u>, and <u>he made five</u> talents more.

17 So also he who <u>had the two talents</u> <u>made two talents more</u>.

18 But he who had <u>received the one talent</u> went and <u>dug in the ground</u> and <u>hid his master's</u> <u>money</u>.

19 Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them.

- Your eternal judgment will never be based upon, "Why didn't you bear witness to 200 more people in your life?" or "Why didn't you produce 5 more miracles in your life?" or "You should have cast out 43 more demons!"
- Your eternal judgment will be based upon, "Were you faithful to what God appointed in your life?"

Matthew 25:14-30 ESV

20 And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here, I have made five talents more.'

21 His master said to him, '<u>Well done</u>, good and <u>faithful</u> <u>servant</u>. You <u>have been faithful over a</u> <u>little</u>; I will <u>set you over much</u>. <u>Enter into the joy of your master</u>.'

22 And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me two talents; here, I have made two talents more.'

23 His master said to him, '<u>Well done</u>, <u>good</u> and <u>faithful</u> <u>servant</u>. You <u>have been faithful over a</u> <u>little</u>; I will <u>set you over much</u>. <u>Enter into the joy of your master</u>.'

24 He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed,

25 so <u>I was afraid</u>, and I went and <u>hid your talent</u> in the ground. Here, you have what is yours.'

26 But his master answered him, 'You <u>wicked</u> and <u>slothful servant!</u> You knew [?] that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I scattered no seed?

27 Then you <u>ought to have invested my money</u> with the bankers, and at my coming <u>I should have</u> <u>received</u> what <u>was my own</u> <u>with interest</u>.

28 So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the ten talents.

29 For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away.

30 And <u>cast the worthless servant</u> <u>into the outer darkness</u>. In that place there will be <u>weeping</u> and <u>gnashing of teeth</u>.'

James 2:17 ESV

17 So also <u>faith by itself</u>, if it <u>does not have works</u>, <u>is dead</u>.

James 2:24 ESV

24 You see that a person is <u>justified by works</u> and <u>not by faith alone</u>.
