Christians are to be peaceful, productive and law-abiding citizens.

- 1 Timothy 2:1-2 ESV
- 1 First of all, then, I urge that <u>supplications</u>, <u>prayers</u>, <u>intercessions</u>, and <u>thanksgivings</u> be <u>made for all</u> people,
- 2 for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.
- 1 Peter 2:13-17 ESV
- 13 Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme,
- 14 or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good.
- 15 For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people.
- 16 Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God.
- 17 <u>Honor everyone</u>. <u>Love the brotherhood</u>. <u>Fear God</u>. <u>Honor the emperor</u>.

Daniel 2:10-19 ESV

- 10 The Chaldeans answered the king [Nebuchadnezzar] and said, "There is not a man on earth who can meet the king's demand, for no great and powerful king has asked such a thing of any magician or enchanter or Chaldean.
- 11 The thing that the king asks is difficult, and no one can show it to the king except the gods, whose dwelling is not with flesh."
- 12 Because of this <u>the king was angry</u> and <u>very furious</u>, and <u>commanded that all the wise men</u> of Babylon <u>be destroyed</u>.
- 13 So the decree went out, and the wise men were about to be killed; and they sought Daniel and his companions, to kill them.
- 14 Then <u>Daniel replied</u> with <u>prudence</u> and <u>discretion</u> to Arioch, the <u>captain of the king's guard</u>, who <u>had</u> <u>gone out to kill the wise men</u> of Babylon.
- 15 He declared to Arioch, the king's captain, "Why is the decree of the king so urgent?" Then <u>Arioch made the matter known to Daniel</u>.
- 16 And Daniel went in and requested the king to appoint him a time, that he might show the interpretation to the king.
- 17 Then Daniel went to his house and made the matter known to Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, his companions,
- 18 and told them to seek mercy from the God of heaven concerning this mystery, so that Daniel and his companions might not be destroyed with the rest of the wise men of Babylon.
- 19 Then the mystery was revealed to Daniel in a vision of the night. Then Daniel blessed the God of heaven.

Christians are to provide financially and materially for themselves and their families.

Jeremiah 29:4-7 ESV

- 4 Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon:
- 5 <u>Build houses</u> and <u>live in them</u>; <u>plant gardens</u> and <u>eat their produce</u>.
- 6 Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease.
- 7 But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.
- 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12 ESV
- 7 For you yourselves know <u>how you ought to imitate us</u>, because <u>we were not idle</u> when <u>we were with you</u>,
- 8 <u>nor did we eat anyone's bread</u> <u>without paying for it</u>, but <u>with toil</u> and <u>labor</u> we <u>worked night and day</u>, that we <u>might not be a burden</u> to any of you.
- 9 It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an example to imitate.
- 10 For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat.
- 11 For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies.
- 12 Now such persons <u>we command</u> and <u>encourage</u> in the Lord Jesus Christ to <u>do their work quietly</u> and to <u>earn their own living</u>.

Jeremiah 17:5-8 ESV

5 Thus says the LORD: <u>Cursed is the man</u> who <u>trusts in man</u> and <u>makes flesh his strength</u>, whose heart <u>turns away from the LORD</u>.

6 He is like <u>a shrub in the desert</u>, and <u>shall not see any good come</u>. He shall dwell in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.

7 <u>Blessed is the man</u> who <u>trusts in the LORD</u>, whose trust is the LORD.

8 He is like <u>a tree planted by water</u>, that <u>sends out its roots by the stream</u>, and <u>does not fear when heat comes</u>, for <u>its leaves remain green</u>, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it <u>does not cease to bear fruit."</u>

Isaiah 30:1-3 ESV

1 "Ah, stubborn children," declares the LORD, "who carry out a plan, but not mine, and who make an alliance, but not of my Spirit, that they may add sin to sin;

2 who set out to go down to Egypt, without asking for my direction, to take refuge in the protection of Pharaoh and to seek shelter in the shadow of Egypt!

3 Therefore shall the protection of Pharaoh turn to your shame, and the shelter in the shadow of Egypt to your humiliation.

Isaiah 31:1 ESV

1 Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help and rely on horses, who trust in chariots because they are many and in horsemen because they are very strong, but do not look to the Holy One of Israel or consult the LORD!

Matthew 26:38-39 ESV

38 Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me." 39 And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will."

2 Corinthians 12:7-8 ESV

7 So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited.

8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me.

Christians know where their allegiance to a nation and government ends.

Daniel 3:16-19 ESV

16 <u>Shadrach</u>, <u>Meshach</u>, and <u>Abednego</u> answered and <u>said to the king</u>, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we <u>have no need to answer you</u> in this matter.

- 17 If this be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of your hand, O king.
- 18 But if not, be it known to you, O king, that we will not serve your gods or worship the golden image that you have set up."
- 19 Then <u>Nebuchadnezzar</u> was <u>filled with fury</u>, and the expression of his face was changed against Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. He <u>ordered the furnace heated seven times more</u> than it was usually heated.

Acts 5:27-29 ESV

- 27 And when they had brought them, they set them before the council. And the high priest questioned them,
- 28 saying, "We <u>strictly charged you not to teach in this name</u>, yet here <u>you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching</u>, and you intend to bring this man's blood upon us."
- 29 But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men.

Christians never resort to violence, even when attacked (for being Christians).

Proverbs 3:31 ESV

31 Do not envy a man of violence and do not choose any of his ways.

John 18:36 ESV

36 Jesus answered [Pilate], "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world."

Titus 3:1-2 ESV

- 1 Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work
- 2 to <u>speak evil of no one</u>, to <u>avoid quarreling</u>, to <u>be gentle</u>, and to <u>show perfect courtesy</u> toward <u>all people</u>.

Romans 12:14 ESV

- 14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.
- 15 Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep.
- 16 Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight.
- 17 Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all.
- 18 If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.
- 19 Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."
- 20 To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head."
- 21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
