The Christian's Peaceful, Godly And Dignified Life

August 13, 2020

1 Timothy 2:1-4 ESV

1 First of all, then, I urge that <u>supplications</u>, <u>prayers</u>, <u>intercessions</u>, and <u>thanksgivings</u> be <u>made for all people</u>, 2 for <u>kings</u> and <u>all who are in high positions</u>, that we may lead a <u>peaceful</u> and <u>quiet</u> life, <u>godly</u> and <u>dignified</u> in <u>every way</u>.

- We are to pray for all people for their salvation.
- We are to pray for kings and those in high positions <u>specifically</u> for the purpose that we may lead a peaceful, quiet, godly and dignified life.
- <u>peaceful</u> (*Ēremos*) tranquil, stillness, calm, free from disturbance
- <u>quiet</u> (hēsychios) keeping one's seat, quiet, undisturbed, sedentary
- godliness (eusebeia) godliness, holiness, piety towards God
- <u>dignified</u> (semnot ēs) dignity, respect, honor, purity, honesty

1 Timothy 2:1-4 ESV

- 3 This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior,
- 4 who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.
 - It is good and pleasing to God when:
 - we pray for all people
 - when we are able to lead a peaceful, quiet, godly and dignified life.
 - The Church being persecuted is good for the Church. The Church living in peace is good for the world.
 - Persecution is good for the Church because it:
 - purifies the Church
 - exercises the faith and conviction of its members
 - When we can live that peaceful, quiet, godly and dignified life, we can be the most effective as the salt and light of the world.

Matthew 5:13-16 ESV

13 You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet.

14 You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden.

15 Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house.

16 In the same way, <u>let your light shine before others</u>, so that <u>they may see your good works</u> and <u>give</u> glory to your Father who is in heaven.

1 Corinthians 5:9-10 ESV

9 I wrote to you in my letter not to associate with sexually immoral people-

10 not at all meaning the sexually immoral of this world, or the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters, <u>since</u> then you would need to go out of the world.

How Christians Are Salt and Light

1 Peter 2:9-17 ESV

- 9 But you are a <u>chosen race</u>, a <u>royal priesthood</u>, a <u>holy nation</u>, a <u>people for his own possession</u>, that you may <u>proclaim the excellencies of him</u> who <u>called you out of darkness</u> <u>into his marvelous light</u>.
- 10 Once you were not a people, but <u>now you are God's people</u>; once you had not received mercy, but <u>now you have received mercy</u>.
- 11 Beloved, <u>I urge you</u> as <u>sojourners</u> and <u>exiles</u> to <u>abstain from the passions of the flesh</u>, which <u>wage war against</u> your soul.
- 12 <u>Keep your conduct</u> among the <u>Gentiles</u> <u>honorable</u>, so that <u>when they speak against you as evildoers</u>, they may <u>see your good deeds</u> and <u>glorify God</u> on <u>the day of visitation</u>.
- 13 Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme,
- 14 or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good.
- 15 For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people.
- 16 Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God.
- 17 <u>Honor everyone</u>. <u>Love the brotherhood</u>. <u>Fear God</u>. <u>Honor the emperor</u>.

1 Thessalonians 4:9-12 ESV

- 9 Now concerning brotherly love you have no need for anyone to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love one another,
- 10 for that indeed is what you are doing to all the brothers throughout Macedonia. But we urge you, brothers, to do this more and more,
- 11 and to <u>aspire to live quietly</u>, and to <u>mind your own affairs</u>, and <u>to work with your hands</u>, as we instructed you, 12 so that you <u>may walk properly before outsiders</u> and <u>be dependent on no one</u>.

Jeremiah 29:1-7 ESV

- 1 These are the words of the letter that Jeremiah the prophet sent from Jerusalem to the surviving elders of the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar [king of Babylon] had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon.
- 4 "Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon:
- 5 <u>Build houses</u> and <u>live in them</u>; <u>plant gardens</u> and <u>eat their produce</u>.
- 6 <u>Take wives</u> and <u>have sons and daughters</u>; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; <u>multiply there</u>, and <u>do not decrease</u>.
- 7 But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.
