Why God Uses "Nobodies"

Matthew 1:18-25 ESV

- 18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit.
- 19 And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly.
- 20 But <u>as he considered these things</u>, behold, <u>an angel</u> of the Lord <u>appeared to him</u> <u>in a dream</u>, saying, "Joseph, son of David, <u>do not fear to take Mary</u> <u>as your wife</u>, for <u>that which is conceived in her</u> is <u>from the Holy Spirit</u>.
- 21 She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."
- 22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:
- 23 "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us).
- 24 When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife,
- 25 but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus.

Would it not have been better for Jesus to be born into a prominent family of privilege, preferably one of longstanding and respected elders of the Sanhedrin?

Isaiah 53:1-3 ESV

- 1 <u>Who has believed</u> what <u>he has heard from us</u>? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? 2 For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; <u>he had no form</u>
- (appearance) or <u>majesty</u> (ornament, decoration, honor, excellency) that <u>we should look at him</u>, and <u>no</u> <u>beauty</u> (sight, appearance, spectacle) <u>that we should desire him</u>.
- 3 He was <u>despised</u> and <u>rejected by men</u>, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and <u>we esteemed him not</u>.

John 1:45-46 ESV

- 45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."
- 46 Nathanael said to him, "<u>Can anything good</u> <u>come out of Nazareth?</u>" Philip said to him, "Come and see."

Mark 6:1-3 ESV

- 1 He went away from there and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him.
- 2 And on the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get these things? What is the wisdom given to him? How are such mighty works done by his hands?
- 3 <u>Is not this the carpenter</u>, the <u>son of Mary</u> and <u>brother of James</u> and <u>Joses</u> and <u>Judas</u> and <u>Simon</u>? And <u>are not his sisters here with us</u>?" And <u>they took offense</u> at him.

Why Does God Use "Nobodies?"

- The corruption to human nature from money, position and status.
 - Human nature is prone to trust in money, position and status instead of God.
 - Human nature will use money, position and status for selfish ambition and pleasure.
 - Human nature will deceive, manipulate and coerce to protect and keep money, position and status.

Matthew 20:20-28 ESV

- 20 Then the mother of the sons of Zebedee came up to him with her sons, and kneeling before him she asked him for something.
- 21 And he said to her, "What do you want?" She said to him, "Say that these two sons of mine are to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom."
- 22 Jesus answered, "You do not know what you are asking. <u>Are you able</u> to <u>drink the cup that I am to drink?</u>" They said to him, "<u>We are able</u>."
- 23 He said to them, "You will drink my cup, but to sit at my right hand and at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father."
- 24 And when the ten heard it, they were indignant at the two brothers.
- 25 But Jesus called them to him and said, "You know that <u>the rulers of the Gentiles</u> <u>lord it over them</u>, and <u>their great ones exercise authority</u> <u>over them</u>.
- 26 It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant,
- 27 and whoever would be first among you must be your slave,
- 28 even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
 - It is always remarkable how just a little of position and title can bring such a sense of <u>entitlement</u> (having a right to something, the belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment).
 - James and John (sons of Zebedee and Salome), as well as their mother, knew the advantages of wealth, position and title.

Mark 1:19-20 ESV

- 19 And going on a little farther, he saw <u>James the son of Zebedee</u> and <u>John his brother</u>, who were in their boat mending the nets.
- 20 And immediately he called them, and <u>they left their father Zebedee</u> in the boat <u>with the hired</u> <u>servants</u> and followed him.

John 18:15-18 ESV

- 15 <u>Simon Peter followed Jesus</u>, and <u>so did another disciple</u>. Since <u>that disciple was known to the high priest</u>, <u>he entered</u> with Jesus <u>into the courtyard of the high priest</u>,
- 16 but <u>Peter stood outside</u> at the door. So <u>the other disciple</u>, who was <u>known to the high priest</u>, went out and <u>spoke to the servant girl</u> who <u>kept watch at the door</u>, and <u>brought Peter in</u>.
- 17 The <u>servant girl at the door said</u> to Peter, "<u>You also are not one of this man's disciples</u>, <u>are</u> you?" He said, "I am not."
- 18 Now the servants and officers had made a charcoal fire, because it was cold, and they were standing and warming themselves. Peter also was with them, standing and warming himself.

Mark 15:39-41 ESV

- 39 And when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!"
- 40 There were also <u>women looking on from a distance</u>, among whom were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and <u>Salome</u> [wife of Zebedee, mother of James and John].
- 41 <u>When he was in Galilee</u>, <u>they followed him</u> and <u>ministered to him</u>, and there were also many other women who came up with him to Jerusalem.

Mark 3:16-17 ESV

- 16 He [Jesus] appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter);
- 17 <u>James the son of Zebedee</u> and <u>John the brother of James</u> (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, <u>Sons of Thunder</u>).

Luke 9:52-56 NASB

- 52 He sent messengers on ahead of Him, and they went and entered a village of the Samaritans to make arrangements for Him.
- 53 But they did not receive Him, because He was traveling toward Jerusalem.
- 54 When <u>His disciples</u> <u>James</u> and <u>John</u> saw this, they said, "Lord, <u>do You want us to command</u> <u>fire</u> to <u>come down from heaven</u> and <u>consume them?"</u>
- 55 But He turned and rebuked them, and said, "You do not know what kind of spirit you are of; 56 for the Son of Man did not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them." And they went on to another village.

Ezekiel 34:2-4 ESV

- 2"Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel; prophesy, and say to them, even to the shepherds, Thus says the Lord GOD: Ah, <u>shepherds of Israel</u> who have been <u>feeding yourselves</u>! <u>Should not shepherds</u> <u>feed the sheep</u>?
- 3 You <u>eat the fat</u>, you <u>clothe yourselves</u> with the wool, you <u>slaughter the fat ones</u>, but you <u>do not feed</u> <u>the sheep</u>.
- 4 The weak you have not strengthened, the sick you have not healed, the injured you have not bound up, the strayed you have not brought back, the lost you have not sought, and with force and harshness you have ruled them.

• Whenever there is harshness or force in the leadership, and people are afraid of reprisal, you will find a leader who is using his/her position for their own selfish ambition and gain.

John 8:3-11 ESV

- 3 The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery, and placing her in the midst
- 4 they said to him, "Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery.
- 5 Now <u>in the Law</u>, <u>Moses commanded us to stone such women</u>. So <u>what do you say</u>?"
- 6 This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him.
 - The scribes and the Pharisees were willing to see this woman put to death, just so they could gain some political or social leverage over Jesus.

John 11:47-54 ESV

- 47 So the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered the council and said, "What are we to do? For this man performs many signs.
- 48 <u>If we let him go on like this</u>, <u>everyone will believe in him</u>, and <u>the Romans will come</u> and <u>take away</u> <u>both our place</u> and <u>our nation</u>."
- 49 But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all. 50 Nor do you understand that it is better for you that one man should die for the people, not that the whole nation should perish."
- 51 He did not say this of his own accord, but <u>being high priest</u> that year <u>he prophesied that Jesus would</u> <u>die for the nation</u>,
- 52 and not for the nation only, but also <u>to gather into one the children of God</u> who <u>are scattered abroad</u>. 53 So <u>from that day on</u> they <u>made plans to put him to death</u>.
- 54 Jesus <u>therefore no longer walked openly</u> <u>among the Jews</u>, but went from there to the region near the wilderness, to a town called Ephraim, and there he stayed with the disciples.
 - For those who have tasted even the slightest advantage of position, title and wealth, they are willing, more often than not, to do whatever it takes to keep the advantages of their position, even if it means murder.

1 Corinthians 1:26-29 ESV

- 26 For <u>consider your calling</u>, brothers: <u>not many of you were wise</u> according to worldly standards, <u>not many were powerful</u>, <u>not many were of noble birth</u>.
- 27 But God <u>chose what is foolish in the world</u> to <u>shame the wise</u>; God <u>chose what is weak in the world</u> to <u>shame the strong</u>;
- 28 God <u>chose what is low and despised</u> in the world, even things that are not, to <u>bring to nothing things</u> <u>that are</u>,
- 29 so that no human being might boast in the presence of God.
