## Good News!

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand” (Matthew 3:2) is the message preached by Jesus after the arrest of John the Baptist. It is important to place this message in context. Jesus is not repeating the preaching of the Baptist. His message is unique and compelling.

Look closely at what Jesus is saying. Do not automatically fill in the blanks with the memories of every sermon you have heard. Try to hear Jesus’ words again, for the first time. Is the emphasis on “repent,” or is the emphasis on the announcement, “The kingdom of heaven is at hand”? Does it make any difference?

Repeat these words and change the emphasis each time. Play with the words. Let the words play with you. Notice how you respond. Notice what makes a difference. Notice how you react, and, most of all, notice whether you feel invited or you feel judged.

The Baptist made no bones about it. You are being judged: “Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees” (Matthew 3:10). Jesus, on the other hand, seems not to judge but to invite: “for the kingdom of heaven is at hand” (Matthew 4:17). In the invitation, we are challenged to see in a different way. Use different skills. Refrain from automatic judgments. Seek to understand but, most of all, to accept and to love. ●

## Deacon's Corner

Welcome to the Third Sunday of the year. We will have 6 Sundays, and then on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of February begins the First Sunday of Lent. We'll have 5 Sundays of Lent until March 22<sup>nd</sup>, then Palm Sunday. We will then celebrate 7 Sundays of Easter until May 17<sup>th</sup> and then we'll celebrate Pentecost on May 24 of this year. Then we'll go back to Ordinary time until the First Sunday of Advent, which will be November 29<sup>th</sup> this year. The most important and inspiring time to deepen our faith is from now until Pentecost, in my opinion. This will be the main message of Jesus according to Matthew. Today's readings are from Isaiah 8:23-9:3; [Psalm 27:1, 4, 13-14](#); [1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17](#); and Matthew 4:12-23. The shortened version ends at verse 17. The main message today is conversion or repentance. The Lord will continue to call us to conversion throughout the year, in different forms. He will require of us an accounting, toward the end of the year in Matthew 25. He will call our attention to the need to love neighbor, especially those most in need of God's mercy (the message that the Blessed Mother gave us at Fátima, by the way). And we will understand what "the good news announced to the poor" means. Matthew and Luke are about equal in their emphasis on this theme, but I think Matthew is stronger because he makes our salvation depend on our concern for the poor. Matthew is more adamant about God's requirement that we love the least in the kingdom. You will recall the words in Chapter 25—"depart from me, you accursed because I was hungry and you gave me no

food..." And Matthew is most severe with the Scribes and Pharisees (See Chapter 23, especially verse 33, where he calls them serpents and "brood of vipers. How can you flee from the judgment of Gehenna?"). I have formed the opinion in the last few years, that Jesus' baptism was not a sign of submission to the Will of God, but a sign of collaboration or sympathy for the proposition that *repentance* is the necessary ingredient for submission, and that the Baptism with the Holy Spirit, which Jesus will provide, is recognized by John the Baptist as the *real* Baptism. Jesus' submission to the baptism of John is a sign of solidarity with the requirement of repentance. After John's death, he makes that theme his main program for his disciples and for us to become "fishers of men." What is attractive about this program of Jesus? Repentance makes us recognize our limitations, our faults and weaknesses and our unworthiness to be the recipients of God's blessings. When we repent we see the misery we were in, and we see the satisfaction that submission brings. It's kind of a freedom that we've never known before, a spiritual freedom that takes away fears and uncertainties, a freedom that drives us to know Jesus better, and to develop a relationship with him that is personal and which gives us security in enduring life's obstacles. We learn to forgive and we learn to endure the crosses of life, like sickness, tragedy and even death. I think the readings today express these topics. See if you can spot them as you read. Godspeed on the journey. Deacon Cavada

# Dear Padre,

## Why can't a Protestant receive the Eucharist at a Catholic Mass?

United by baptism, fellow Christians are our brothers and sisters in the Lord. As such, they are always welcome at Catholic Mass, but they do not ordinarily participate in holy Communion. "Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to holy Communion" (Code of Canon Law, 844 §4).

When Catholics receive Holy Communion, they firmly believe the bread and wine are transformed into the Real Presence of Christ. In the Eucharist, we become part of the body of Christ and share in holiness and unity with one another. Our "Amen" to "The Body of Christ" and "The Blood of Christ" means, "Truly, so be it!" It indicates that we affirm our belief in this mystery, which is fundamental to our Catholic identity. If non-Catholics receive the Eucharist but do not embrace this identity and same belief, it may disrespect Catholics who do, as well as disrespect their own identity in the denomination to which they belong.

However, at Mass, fellow Christians can join their prayers with Catholics in praising God. Together, we also pray that the divisions which separate us will finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (John 17:21). ●
