The Christian confession of a triune God cannot be explained, it can only be believed. It is not a cop-out to proclaim that this belief is rooted in mystery. Mystery is the essential language and experience of belief. We lose something when we try to explain a mystery instead of embracing it. It may make us uncomfortable; it may provoke more questions than answers. Regardless, it does not suggest the weakness of mystery but rather the beauty, the wonder, and the awe.

Embracing belief and living as a person of faith is a singular journey. You cannot believe for someone else, and that person, even one you dearly love, cannot believe for you. It is also important to understand that as singular as the journey of faith may be, it ultimately ends in community. Belief does not isolate a person, but rather invites a person to connect with others who also walk in faith.

The community/communion of the triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—is the perfect witness to the truth that mystery creates. One God, three divine persons. The Eucharist that we celebrate on this day proclaims the unity of our belief—to the Father, through the Son, by the power of the Holy Spirit. ●

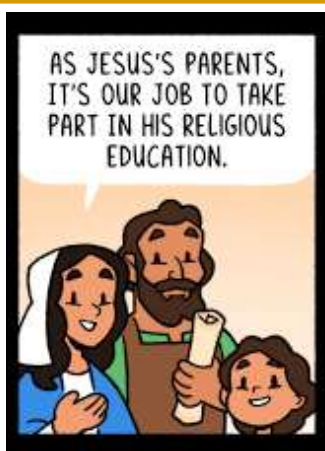

Deacon's Corner

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The readings are from Exodus 34: 46-6, 8-9; and the Response is from Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56; Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; and the Gospel is from John 3:16-18. The Holy Trinity is the first and most important mystery of our faith. I like to say the Acts of Faith, Hope and Charity at the beginning of the rosary. I've said them so often over the years that I have memorized them. Here is the Act of Faith: "O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine persons—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; that your divine Son became man and died for us, and that He will come at the end of time to judge the living and the dead. I believe this truth and all the truths which the Catholic Church teaches because you have revealed them, who can neither deceive nor be deceived." Hail Mary.... An Act of Hope: "O my God, relying on your almighty power, and your infinite mercy and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of your Grace, and life everlasting through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer." Hail Mary.... An Act of Charity: "O my God, I love you above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because you are all good and deserving of all love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured me, and I ask pardon of all whom I have injured." Hail Mary.... These are the Theological Virtues which are represented by the three beads preceding the bead for the Our Father of the first mystery of the rosary. It is good to pray the rosary everyday. Pray it slowly and deliberately, meditating on the theological mysteries and each mystery of the rosary for the day. As many of you know, we generally pray the Joyous Mysteries on Mondays and Saturdays, the Sorrowful Mysteries on Tuesdays and Fridays, the Luminous Mysteries on Thursdays, and the Glorious Mysteries on Wednesdays and Sundays. The purpose of that scheme is so that the universal church are praying the same mysteries on the same days. The mystery of the Trinity is the hardest truth for many world religions to accept. They cannot accept a Triune God, three in one. Each person of the Trinity is God, yet only one God! Who can understand that?

No one! We accept it in faith because Jesus has revealed it. The only place in scripture where I find it is in the passages about the baptism of Jesus—where the dove appears and the voice comes down from heaven. That image has come down through the ages, in the New Testament, as a revelation of the Blessed Trinity. About the best we can do to describe the Triune God is to assign functions to the Lord, known as "economy of salvation." The Father is the creator. The Son is the Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit is the enlightener or Paraclete (the Holy Spirit is "advocate" and "counselor"). We can assign ages or eras to each person—the age of the Father, from creation until Jesus comes into the world; the age of the Son, the 33 or more years he was on the earth; and we are now living in the age of the Holy Spirit, from now until the Second Coming. In 1959 Pope St. John XXIII called for a Council of the Church. It became known as "Vatican II" because Vatican I had been interrupted by war, and it was never finished. Even though the primacy of the pope was finally and definitively established, the main thrust of Vatican II was the centrality of the Lord Jesus. See the Letter written by Pope St. Paul VI, issued December 8, 1975 on the importance of the centrality of Jesus in the Church's evangelization: "There is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the kingdom and the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God, are not proclaimed." Paragraph 22 of *Evangelii nuntiandi*. What happened was that the nature of a Church that had concentrated on the Divinity of God changed to also think about the Humanity of Jesus, the God-man. The emphasis on Piety in order to make a connection with the Divine, changed to include Action (evangelization) which emphasized a connection with the humanity of Jesus and all of humanity. That's why I think this line from today's Gospel, "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him...." Is a call to evangelize the world.

Liturgy & Sacraments

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request – please call the office. Any person who is sick (either homebound or in the hospital) or about to have surgery, is encouraged to receive Anointing of the Sick. As current Federal Law prohibits hospitals from the release of any patient's name. Father will not know you are in the hospital unless you call the office.

Baptisms of Infants: (0 to 5 yrs.): Please bring the child's civil birth certificate to the parish office to register the child, their parents & the Godparents for the one-hour Pre-Baptismal Preparation Class. Godparents must be able to provide Certificates for Catholic Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation, & if married, Marriage Certificate in the Catholic Church. Donation for the class and Baptism is \$30.00, for the class only is \$15.00. Date & time for the Baptism is scheduled after attending the Baptismal Class.

Confessions: The Sacrament of Reconciliation (or Confessions) is available on Thursday from 5:30 PM—6:00 PM and on Saturdays from 5:00 PM—5:30 PM and at any time by appointment with the Priest.

Quinceañeras: The honoree and their family must be registered and participating in the parish for two years prior to the year of the Quinceañera (or Quinceañero). The young person must have Baptism & Communion in the Catholic Church, & be attending the parish Religious Education Program. The family is strongly encouraged to contact the Church for **2 years** before the intended date.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made with the priest or deacon, preferably one year before the intended date, (minimum of six months in advance) to complete the necessary requirements. At least one person must be an active and registered member of this parish. No wedding date is guaranteed until ALL diocesan requirements have been fulfilled.

Blessing of Civil Marriages – If you were married before a judge, or a non-Catholic minister, and wish to be readmitted to Holy Communion, there needs to be a Blessing of your Civil Marriage. Please call the parish office and set up an appointment with Father Patrick so he can hear your particular situation and can guide you through the process. Father Patrick is always saying “Don't wait! Start the process NOW!”

Dear Padre,

During Mass, is it proper for the faithful to raise our hands when pronouncing the words, “For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever”?


When the priest and people offer the Our Father together to God, the presider assumes an ancient posture of prayer, known as the *orans*—with arms extended and palms opened upward. After the Lord’s Prayer, the priest keeps his hands extended and says alone the embolism (“Deliver us, Lord...”). At the end, he joins his hands, and the people acclaim, “For the kingdom....” This acclamation is meant to be the people’s response to the embolism, and the priest remains silent for it. It would appear unnecessary for the faithful to now extend their hands during this acclamation—especially when it’s a response to an embolism prayer that just called for the presider to have extended his own hands and now has them joined together.

Although the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* doesn’t mention a specific congregational hand posture during this acclamation, it speaks in favor of “what serves the common spiritual good of the People of God, rather than private inclination or arbitrary choice,” stating that a common bodily posture “is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the sacred Liturgy: it both expresses and fosters the intention and spiritual attitude of the participants” (*GIRM* 42). ●

A WORD FROM POPE LEO XIV

To those in power, I repeat: listen to the voice of conscience! The apparent victories achieved with weapons, which sow death and destruction, are in reality defeats and never bring peace or security! God does not want war, he wants peace, and he strengthens those who are committed to leaving behind the spiral of hatred and taking the path of dialogue.
