Today's gospel passage is challenging. If anyone other than Jesus told you that if you love your own family "more than me," you are "not worthy of me," you would laugh in their face! Or, is this what scholars call a "semitism"—a culturally conditioned exaggeration used for effect? What about you are "not worthy of me" unless you "take up [your] cross and follow me," or "whoever finds his life will lose it"? Does Jesus mean these literally, or are these metaphors? And what is "a prophet's reward"?

A friend of mine tried an experiment. He took the Gospel of Matthew and read it through from start to finish as if he had never seen it before. He was astonished! Jesus was serious. He meant it—all of it. Try it yourself without looking for loopholes.

The key in the reading today is "for my sake." The standard, the rule, that absolute mark is "me," that is, Jesus himself, only Jesus, always Jesus. And Jesus sets that mark very high. Take up your cross? Jesus was abandoned on the cross. Jesus gave away his Mother from the cross. Jesus lost his life on the cross. But he found that life: resurrection! That is "a prophet's reward," is it not?

I have to love Jesus' promise, a special "reward" for just sharing "a cup of cold water" with a "little one." It reminds me of Honduras, where I live. Here, a cup of cold water can make the difference between life and death. And that is no exaggeration! •

A Note From Our Pastor

Father Patrick Donohoe, you will be greatly missed!

Father Patrick does not only work on Sunday mornings. Here is a tally of some of his ministry to us and our parish since he came to St. John of the Cross in July 2018. In those 8 years (2907 days), he celebrated 2,075 Sunday Masses, 1,660 weekday Masses, 96 First Saturday Masses, and 213 Funeral Masses. During his tenure there were 153 Baptisms, 254 First Holy Communions, 166 Confirmations, and 49 Sacramental Marriages. This does not include the numerous hours each week for counseling and confessions.

Deacon's Corner

Today is the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 28, 2026. On this day we are celebrating the retirement of Father Patrick Donohoe, St. John of the Cross, Orange Grove, Texas. Earlier in the week, June 24, 2026 we celebrated the Solemnity of John the Baptist, and I've included the readings for that celebration for those who receive the entire contents of this email. The readings are from Isaiah 49:1-6; Psalm 139: 1b-3, 13-14ab, 14c-15; and Luke 1:57-66, 80. The readings for the 13th Sunday are from 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a; Psalm 89:2-3, 16-17, 18-19; Romans 6:3-4, 8-11; and the Gospel of Matthew 10: 37-42. I want to invite you to read most or all of chapter 4 of Second Kings. The child that was born to the Shunamite woman died, and she went to Elisha for help. The Prophet went back to her house where the child was lying dead and brought him back to life—kind of like the raising of Lazarus in the New Testament. Both of those miracles are significant because they demonstrate that life is really never over. We come from God and we go back to God. Jesus says in John's Gospel that we will live forever. This idea of "forever" is contained in the Psalm reading for today: "Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord." Paul reinforces this important New Testament theme in his letter to the Romans, who are being killed ferociously by the Ceasars. "... just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him." This last part of the reading is

what we say at the beginning of each funeral. Next time you attend a funeral listen for it right after the greeting and the sign of the cross. I think this is the essence of our Catholic faith. It's identified as the "Paschal Mystery," I think first written by Paul in First Corinthians 13:12. These are the three great mysteries of our faith: (1) the Blessed Trinity, (2) the Resurrection, and (3) the Incarnation. See if you can fit these three mysteries into the Theological Virtues—Faith (Trinity), Hope (Eternal life), and Charity (Love your neighbor). Here are the Theological Virtues we are supposed to pray at the beginning of the Rosary: (1) Faith. "O my God, I firmly believe that you three divine persons in one God. I believe that your divine son because human and died for our sins and that he will come at the end of time to judge the living and the dead. I believe this truth and all the other truths which the Catholic Church teaches because you have revealed them, who can neither deceive or be deceived. Amen." (2) Hope. "O my God, relying on your almighty power and your infinite promises and mercy, I hope to obtain the pardon of my sins, the help of your Grace, and life everlasting, through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer." (3) Charity. "O my God, I love you above all things because you are all good and deserving of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured and ask pardon of all those whom I have injured." God bless you.

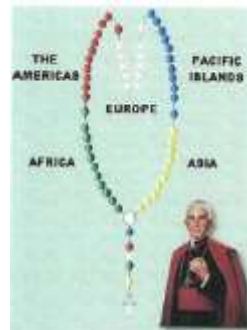


World Mission Rosary-Making Day ~ The Pax Christi Sisters and 87 others from different parishes gathered at Pax Chrsiti on Tuesday, June 23, and made 1000 World Mission Rosaries that will be distributed at Venerable Archbishop Sheen's Beatification on September 24, 2026.

Archbishop Sheen who is best known for his popular syndicated television program, ***Life is Worth Living***, is held today as one of Catholicism's most widely recognized figures of the 20th century.

In 1951, Archbishop Sheen designed and promoted the WORLD MISSION ROSARY. Each of the five colors on the Rosary represents a different area (continent) where the Church continues its mission of evangelization.

Liturgy & Sacraments

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request – please call the office. Any person who is sick (either homebound or in the hospital) or about to have surgery, is encouraged to receive Anointing of the Sick. As current Federal Law prohibits hospitals from the release of any patient's name. Father will not know you are in the hospital unless you call the office.

Baptisms of Infants: (0 to 5 yrs.): Please bring the child's civil birth certificate to the parish office to register the child, their parents & the Godparents for the one-hour Pre-Baptismal Preparation Class. Godparents must be able to provide Certificates for Catholic Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation, & if married, Marriage Certificate in the Catholic Church. Donation for the class and Baptism is \$30.00, for the class only is \$15.00. Date & time for the Baptism is scheduled after attending the Baptismal Class.

Confessions: The Sacrament of Reconciliation (or Confessions) is available on Thursday from 5:30 PM—6:00 PM and on Saturdays from 5:00 PM—5:30 PM and at any time by appointment with the Priest.

Quinceañeras: The honoree and their family must be registered and participating in the parish for two years prior to the year of the Quinceañera (or Quinceañero). The young person must have Baptism & Communion in the Catholic Church, & be attending the parish Religious Education Program. The family is strongly encouraged to contact the Church for 2 years before the intended date.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made with the priest or deacon, preferably one year before the intended date, (minimum of six months in advance) to complete the necessary requirements. At least one person must be an active and registered member of this parish. No wedding date is guaranteed until ALL diocesan requirements have been fulfilled.

Blessing of Civil Marriages – If you were married before a judge, or a non-Catholic minister, and wish to be readmitted to Holy Communion, there needs to be a Blessing of your Civil Marriage. Please call the parish office and set up an appointment with Father Patrick so he can hear your particular situation and can guide you through the process. Father Patrick is always saying "Don't wait! Start the process NOW!"

Dear Padre,

I raised my children in the faith, but two of them left the Church to embrace another denomination, and two others, although still Catholic, have not committed to regular church attendance. I worry about their salvation.

Your experience is not unknown to many Catholic parents. Many mothers and fathers could probably carry on a good conversation with you about their concerns for the faith lives of their children.

The journey of faith has many paths. An individual may think more deeply about the meaning of life or may find religion after a momentous experience or in the process of gathering with a community in which they find support, clarity, shared beliefs, or guidelines for living morally. For those of us who grew up believing, chances are, we were not introduced to religion through logic. Children are brought to church long before they are aware of their need for God. They learn doctrine and attend worship before questions of faith and religion form within them. Passing on the faith is a great gift that parents give, and it will serve these young people well. Your children have the tools to help them find their way, and God continues to be with them. Follow the example of St. Monica and pray for them. Trust this one to God and continue to be a good example. ●
