



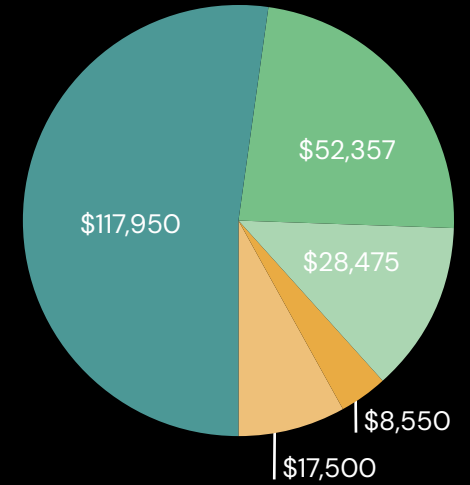

Total Amount Donated by Area of Giving

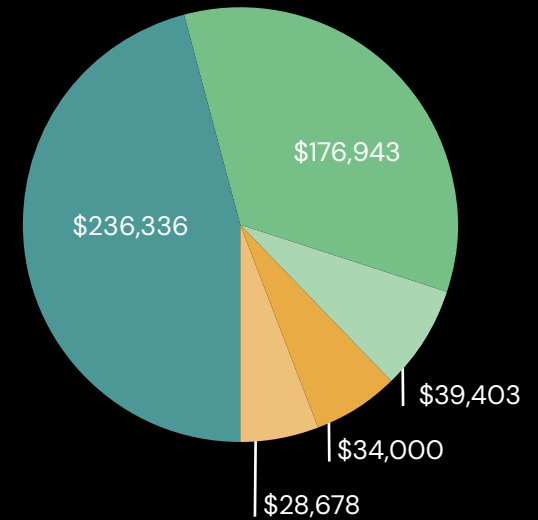

Grassroots Redeeming Love

On May 16, 2025, an EF-3 tornado ripped through St. Louis—leaving nearly \$1 billion of damage in its wake. Ginelle Bess headed to North City in the aftermath and was met with splintered homes, scattered belongings, and broken spirits.

Ginelle founded **Grassroots Redeeming Love**, a nonprofit organization devoted to supporting St. Louis' most underserved residents, bridging communities across neighborhood lines, and showing up in real ways for the people who need it most.

More than six months after the tornado, Ginelle and GRL have been a consistent source of love, labor, and support—assisting residents in relocating, refurbishing homes, and advocating for their basic needs to be met. They will be in North City for the long haul and we have been honored to champion their cause.

Last Prisoner Project

NGH partnered with the Last Prisoner Project to advance cannabis justice and support individuals directly impacted by the collateral consequences of offenses that are now legal. Together, we helped amplify the Cannabis Justice Initiative (CJI) and the organization's national efforts to pursue freedom and fairness.

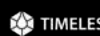
