



**Sunday, Mar 08, 2026**

**THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT; FIRST SCRUTINY OF THE ELECT  
Shower us with the water of life**

Today, catechumens experience the First Scrutiny, a ritual in which the whole church prays for them as they face squarely the power of evil and open themselves to Christ’s saving power. “Grant that these catechumens, who like the woman of Samaria, thirst for living water, may turn to the Lord as they hear his word and acknowledge the sins and weaknesses that weigh them down.” We who are already baptized should feel ourselves in the catechumens’ shoes and allow ourselves to be prayed for: “Protect them from vain reliance on self, and defend them from the power of Satan. Free them from the spirit of deceit, so that, admitting the wrong they have done, they may attain purity of heart and advance on the way to salvation.”

*Exodus 17:3-7; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42 (28). “If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked him and he would have given you living water.”*

**Monday, Mar 09, 2026**

**Tune out the noise**

Often the people around us try to undermine our resolve to get physically and spiritually healthy. As we try to avoid addictive substances, find time for quiet contemplation, volunteer one night a week, or whatever we’ve committed to, others try to thwart us. Some loved ones may be worried that the measures we’re taking are too extreme; others may be suffering from the misery-loves-company syndrome—they choose not to get healthy and don’t want to be on that path alone. Whatever the reason, we feel unappreciated and betrayed. But don’t let that distract you. Jesus knew that no prophet is accepted in his hometown, but that didn’t stop him from preaching in Nazareth.

*2 Kings 5:1-15ab; Luke 4:24-30 (237). “No prophet is accepted in his own native place.”*

**Tuesday, Mar 10, 2026**

**Reach deep for compassion**

In a women’s concentration camp in Nazi Germany, a prayer was found scrawled on a piece of wrapping paper. The anonymous writer commends to God “not only the men and women of good will, but also those of ill will. But do not remember all the suffering they have inflicted on us. Remember the fruits borne of this suffering: the loyalty, the humility, the courage, the generosity, the greatness of heart which has grown out of this. And when they come to judgment, let all the fruits which we have borne be their forgiveness.” May we cultivate such deep pockets of compassion for those who injure us.

*Daniel 3:25, 34-43; Matthew 18:21-35 (238). “How often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?”*

**Wednesday, Mar 11, 2026**

**Put your relationships in order**

Think of all the relationships in your life: family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, and others. They don’t always go smoothly, but without them life would be pretty empty. Then think about God. God is a relationship, too: the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The whole story of scripture, the whole story of the church, tells of God calling creation, especially people, into community and communion with one another and with God. “Love God, serve God; everything is in that,” says Saint Clare of Assisi. Put your relationship with God first, and all the others will fall into place.

*Deuteronomy 4:1, 5-9; Matthew 5:17-19 (239). “Whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the*

*Kingdom of heaven.”*

**Thursday, Mar 12, 2026**

**Check your freedom**

Sometimes we don’t know what hit us. Power comes into our lives and takes our breath away. Was this mighty attraction we just felt a good thing or a bad thing? Was that charismatic speaker who cast a spell over us an evil genius or a saint? It all depends on which direction the demons are headed, according to Jesus. The spirit of holiness is a liberating power, and the spirit of darkness one that constricts us. The freer you are to open your arms in love, the closer you are to God’s Holy Spirit. Take time to do a freedom check. *Jeremiah 7:23-28; Luke 11:14-23 (240). “If it is by the finger of God that I drive out demons, then the Kingdom of God has come upon you.”*

**Friday, Mar 13, 2026**

**Be a good neighbor**

When Jesus is asked by a scribe to name the single most important Commandment, he answers by citing not one, but two Commandments: to love God and to love neighbor. The scribe agrees with the answer. All this might seem a bit odd to us—wasn’t Jesus supposed to pick just one Commandment? Perhaps the message here is that we can’t really separate these two Commandments from one another—they come as a unit. It is impossible to “love God with all your heart” if you do not “love your neighbor as yourself,” and vice versa. God is in our neighbor—yes, even in the noisy one who plays loud music late at night. Do your best to live up to the greatest Commandment. Love God with all your heart—it’s the neighborly thing to do.

*Hosea 14:2-10; Mark 12:28-34 (241). “There is no other commandment greater than these.”*

**Saturday, Mar 14, 2026**

**A worthy practice**

Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque is best known for introducing the observance of nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. But she also had some wise words about how to put humility into practice: “Be humble towards God and gentle with your neighbor. Judge and accuse no one but yourself, and ever excuse others. Speak of God always to praise and glorify him, speak of your neighbor only with respect—do not speak of yourself at all, either well or ill.” Her advice makes for a worthy Lenten practice: praise for God, respect for the neighbor, and keep blessedly silent about yourself!

*Hosea 6:1-6; Luke 18:9-14 (242). “The one who humbles himself will be exalted.”*

Peace be with you!

Today we return to a story so familiar we can almost recite it by heart: Jesus and the woman at the well. At first hearing, it sounds like nothing more than an ordinary conversation between two strangers on a hot afternoon. But if you listen closely, you will discover it is far more. Jesus is gently, masterfully leading her on a journey—from suspicion to faith, from doubt to dazzling truth.

Cynicism runs deep in those who have lost hope in anything beyond this life. It is the natural fruit of a worldview that says, “This is all there is.” If the grave is the end, why strive for anything higher than self? Why sacrifice, why love, why even bother? And God? “Call me when He actually shows up,” they say with a shrug.

You’ve just met the woman at the well.

Jesus begins exactly where she is—on the surface—with a simple request for a drink of water. Yet with each exchange, the conversation descends deeper: past cultural barriers, past shame, past five failed marriages, straight into the hidden places of her heart. What starts as small talk becomes soul surgery. And when the light of truth finally breaks in, the darkness doesn’t just retreat—it explodes into joy.

She is so overwhelmed, so transformed, that she cannot contain it. The woman who came to the well alone and unnoticed leaves her water jar behind and runs back to town, shouting to everyone who will listen, “Come and see a man who told me everything I ever did!”

That, my friends, is what an encounter with the living Christ always does.






