TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Who's on your doorstep?

Long-standing images of the fires of hell owe much to the vivid description of the afterlife contained in a gospel story. A rich man (later sometimes named Dives) suffers tormenting flames after death because he ignored poor Lazarus on his doorstep throughout his life. Medieval artists loved to illustrate the story because of its drama and visual potential. But beneath all the fire and brimstone lies a clear and direct message: Living only for one's own wealth and comfort leads to a living hell. If we hope to rest in the bosom of Abraham, we need to pay attention to the Lazarus waiting at our doorstep.

Amos 6:1a, 4-7; 1 Timothy 6:11-16; Luke 16:19-31 (138). "My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad."

FEAST OF MICHAEL, GABRIEL, AND RAPHAEL, ARCHANGELS

Choose your side

The Bible sometimes reads like a chapter from Dungeons and Dragons. In the apocalyptic passages of Daniel and the Book of Revelation we meet serpents, angels, ancient ones, prophets, and warriors. These characters are set against a backdrop of fire, war, struggle, truth, and deceit. Such images paint a picture of a God who takes sides. In reality the world is deeply interconnected, one in which we can see the human suffering on all sides of violent conflict. What image of God can convey the truth that God is for everyone? Or more to the point, how can we refocus our vision to understand that there are no sides but God's?

Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 or Revelation 12:7-12ab; John 1:47-51 (647). "War broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels battled against the dragon."

MEMORIAL OF JEROME, PRIEST, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Savor these words

Saint Jerome, brilliant biblical scholar, patron of librarians and translators, was fascinated by the meaning of words. Unlike many translators of his day, he favored use of what modern scripture-scholar Father Leslie Hoppe, O.F.M. calls "dynamic equivalence." That is, Jerome sought to translate texts from their original Hebrew and Greek "sense for sense" rather than "word for word." Jerome's contributions to Catholics' understanding of the Bible are unsurpassed. But perhaps his most significant contribution was simply his love of the word. Spend some time today savoring the words and struggling with the meaning of scripture.

MEMORIAL OF THÉRÈSE OF THE CHILD JESUS, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Spiritual bouquet

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, known as the "Little Flower," is one of the most popular saints, owing to her inspirational simplicity. She spent almost a decade of her short life cloistered as a Carmelite nun expressing her thoughts in writings that were eventually shared with the world. "Love proves itself by deeds," she wrote, "so how am I to show my love? Great deeds are forbidden me. The only way I can prove my love is by scattering flowers and these flowers are every little sacrifice, every glance and word, and the doing of the least actions for love." Scatter some flowers of loving deeds in

honor of this great saint.

MEMORIAL OF THE HOLY GUARDIAN ANGELS

You've got a friend

Joan Wester Anderson has been writing about angels since 1989 after her son was mysteriously rescued from a devastating snow storm on Christmas Eve. That experience resulted in her first book of true stories of remarkable encounters with angels, *Where Angels Walk*. Since then, she has written many more books on the subject, and all of them offer spine-tingling, inspiring tales of ordinary people who have been rescued, healed, comforted, and sheltered by heavenly visitors. These amazing stories make the case that every one of us has a guardian angel. That's a proposition the church itself has made from the earliest times. Biblical scholar and Doctor of the Church Saint Jerome posited: "So valuable to heaven is the dignity of the human soul that every member of the human race has a guardian angel from the moment the person begins to be." It's nice to know we're not alone.

Models of what's possible

The biblical towns of Tyre and Sidon might bring to mind some modern-day big cities: prosperous, bustling, cosmopolitan—and spiritually hungry. Early in Jesus' ministry people from these distant port cities heard about the things Jesus was doing, and, though they were in some sense outsiders, they responded with more enthusiasm than many of those who were closer to Jesus. Jesus held up these "pagan" cities as models of what is possible when people express a genuine desire for spiritual nourishment. Respond to the gospel with enthusiasm, and your spirit will be rewarded.

Baruch 1:15-22; Luke 10:13-16 (459). "It will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you."

MEMORIAL OF FRANCIS OF ASSISI, RELIGIOUS

Do what you need to do

If Saint Francis of Assisi knew that his band of brother-beggars would one day be called Franciscans, he'd probably laugh, or sigh. He never set himself up as a model. Indeed, he admonished his brothers: "We ought to be ashamed of ourselves; the saints endured but we who are servants of God try to win honor and glory by recounting and making known what they have done." Good deeds are ours to do, according to Francis. At the end of his life, he made that point abundantly clear: "I have done what was mine to do. May Christ teach you what is yours to do." Time to get doing.

Peace be with you!

One of the first lessons we learn when reading Bible stories from the Book of Genesis is that all of us are made in the image and likeness of God. Later, through the Gospels, we discover that God loves each of us unconditionally and always forgives the repentant soul. In this Sunday's Gospel reading from Luke, we hear the story of Lazarus—not Jesus' friend, but a beggar who sat outside the palace gate. The story reveals that the rich man was never cruel to Lazarus or treated him unfairly; rather, he committed a more egregious sin: he never noticed Lazarus or paid any attention to his plight. The lesson unfolds as both men die, and their situations are reversed in heaven.

Speaking of heaven, last Sunday's combined parish picnic with our sister parish St. Marguerite was truly "heavenly" in terms of weather, food, turnout, and attendees' comments. Best estimates suggest over 500 picnickers attended, along with our dedicated volunteers. God certainly let His light shine upon all who participated.

We owe a deep debt of gratitude to chairpersons **Mike Carneglia** and **Bill Gonch**, along with their many committee leads and vast array of volunteers. Of course, we also thank our home chefs who so generously provided the delicious dishes that made the event special once again this year.
