November 30, 2025 First Sunday of Advent (A) Stav Awake!

Isaiah 2:1-5; Psalm 122:1-2,3-4,4-5,6-7,8-9; Roman 13:11-14; Matthew 24:37-44

"Stay awake!" These words are intended to awaken our minds and hearts to the Lord's coming, to be mindful of His presence in our daily lives, and to remind us that we never know when our time will be up.

The first Sunday of Advent marks the start of a new liturgical year. We use this season to renew our understanding of the image of God in which we were created and the likeness of Christ into which we were baptized. At first glance, Advent might seem like just a time to prepare for a birthday celebration. However, it is not solely about waiting for Jesus' birthday; it recognizes that Christ's presence in our lives is an ongoing process. Each year, we reveal more of ourselves to Christ. Therefore, each Advent is about expecting new light, new life, and Christ's renewed birth in our lives. We reflect on the ancient scriptures from Israel that express their longing for God's coming.

"Stay awake," because we do not know on which day our Lord will come (cf. Matt. 24:42). These words from our Lord refer to His coming in glory, but they also relate to our present situation. Christ's ongoing presence is experienced through daily encounters with His love, mercy, and guidance. Recognizing these signs helps us stay spiritually alert and connected to His continual coming in our lives.

Every time we read the Sacred Scriptures, the Lord speaks to us. When the Eucharist is celebrated, Jesus is present with his forgiving and redeeming love for the Church and each of us. Each time we receive Holy Communion, Jesus promises eternal life to those who acknowledge its significance. We do not need to shout to the heavens for Jesus to come into power; he has already come. Now, we must open or reopen our minds and hearts to Jesus to learn how to recognize the signs of his special presence and will in our lives.

Therefore, let us "stay awake" for God's movement in our lives. Staying awake is not a passive "wait and see what happens" approach. Our Lord desires our hearts and minds to focus on Him and His word. He wants us to be prepared for His action and grace in our lives and the world. Those who "wait" for the Lord will not be disappointed; He will surely come with His grace and saving help.


Let us "stay awake," for Advent is an ideal time to set spiritual resolutions as we prepare for Christmas. We may need to build bridges in our lives to renew respect in meaningful relationships. Our prayer life requires consistency and structure, and we need to better prepare ourselves for participation in the Eucharist. Honest self-reflection is essential as we get ready for our Christmas confession. There may be attachments in our lives that we need to release, and certain areas might require more self-control.

As we light the candles on the Advent wreath each week, their glow becomes brighter throughout the season, symbolizing the increasing presence of Christ's light in our lives. Remember, we are not celebrating the rebirth of Christ—Jesus was born once in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago and will not be born there again. We enter this season to actively renew our faith and commitment to Jesus and His Church. Our Lord did indeed enter our time and space and remains with us. Now, rekindle His birth in our hearts and minds

> by staying vigilant in prayer and charity. He is constantly drawing near, and life offers us surprising gifts to unwrap if we stay attentive and receptive.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE: "THE LORD BE WITH YOU."

In our Catholic Sacred Liturgy, we frequently hear the greeting, "The Lord be with you" during the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

This greeting has roots in ancient Jewish and Christian traditions, emphasizing God's presence among His people. We hear this greeting several times: at the introductory rite, before reading the Gospel, at the start of the solemn Preface prayer, before the sign of peace, and during the dismissal rite.

It is a solemn greeting that exceeds any ordinary human exchange, serving as a reminder of Christ's sacred presence among us. It would be unfortunate if it were mixed with the standard greeting of "good morning," which can happen during the introductory rite or at the beginning of the homily, thereby weakening its spiritual significance.

"The Lord be with you" is a greeting that expresses the Church's hope that the Lord becomes more present in her children—each of us—by deepening our awareness of His presence during prayer, listening to the proclamation of Sacred Scriptures, sharing the sign of peace, receiving the Holy Eucharist, and being sent out after the Holy Mass.

It's a greeting that carries a prayer that the fruits of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will effectively reach each of us — to inspire conversion and deepen our relationship with the Lord, so that we will always be ready, "whether He comes in the evening, or at midnight, or dawn, or in the morning," confident regardless of dark or difficult situations we face.


