August 10, 2025 - 19^{th} Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) Do Not Be Afraid Little Flock

Wisdom 18:6-9; Psalm 33:1,12,18-19,20-22; Hebrews 11:1-2,8-19; Luke 12:32-48

What happens when we express deep faith in God? The readings for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time offer us thoughts to reflect on.

This Sunday's gospel begins with a comforting message from our Lord Jesus: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom" (Luke 12:32). By referring to his followers as the "little flock," Jesus is expressing His closeness to those who are humble, meek, and child-like in their faith. His words bring assurance of the Father's joy in bestowing upon them the invaluable gift of the Kingdom. What an incredible gift it is for those who truly humble themselves before others and especially before God! Furthermore, these words of Jesus serve as a call for complete surrender to God.

Many times, we hear that faith is a gift from God, and indeed it is. Through this gift of faith, we are able to respond to God, who reveals Himself to us and offers Himself to us. This gift provides abundant light in our search for meaning in life (cf. CCC Sec. I, #26).

The Book of Wisdom, Chapter 18, verses 6-9, connects us to the Book of Exodus, specifically to the night of the Passover when the people of Israel were freed. The Book of Wisdom reflects on the events of the Exodus, highlighting that the faith of the Israelites guided them from captivity to freedom. Their trust in God sustained and nourished them in the face of their enemies, ultimately leading them from slavery to liberty.

This kind of faith is also evident in the life of Abraham, as mentioned in the Book of Hebrews. In Genesis Chapter 12, we see that God called Abraham, promising to bless him with a land flowing with milk and honey and that his descendants would be as numerous as the stars in heaven. Abraham obediently followed this call, leaving behind his country and relatives, unsure of where he was headed or what would happen along the way. What he did know was that God was calling him to leave behind what he loved and to journey to a place known only to God.

It was faith that filled him with hope and confidence on his journey. It was through his faith in God that he was blessed with a son, Isaac, and that he passed the ultimate test of offering his son as a sacrifice to God. This was a profound test of Abraham's faith, as he was asked to sacrifice his beloved son, Isaac, as a demonstration of his unwavering trust in God. This faith sustained his journey. Thus, the Book of Hebrews declares: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1-2).

The stories of the Israelites and Abraham remind us that, despite the evils and adversities of the world, a person of faith can remain resilient and hopeful due to the gift of God's presence in their life. St. Paul passionately stated in his letter to the Romans, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Rom. 8:31).

The followers of Jesus, described as the "little flock," the little ones, and the child-like, are assured of receiving the gift of the reign of God. This gift strengthens them, enabling them to stand firm against all adversities while keeping them spiritually prepared. Fear will have no place in their lives, and the anxieties of this world will hold no power over them. They will : "(remain faithful stewards of God's mysteries, joyfully sharing these gifts with others and

expressing their gratitude by diligently fulfilling their spiritual responsibilities. They approach their everyday work and responsibilities with the same reliable and faithful spirit.

Let us pray, through the intercession of St. Therese of the Child Jesus, that we may possess the faith of the "little flock" to whom the Father is pleased to grant His Kingdom.


