Visiting a Loved One's Place of Rest

Cemeteries play many roles in communities, but one of the most important is creating a place where loved ones can visit those they miss most. When you visit a loved one, we understand you may want to leave gifts or memorials. It's a beautiful way to preserve the memory of a loved one.

For the safety of all our guests and to maintain the beauty of the cemetery for all, funeral flowers, holders, containers, baskets, and easels will be removed between the seventh and tenth day after the burial of a loved one. If your loved one is placed in a mausoleum crypt or columbarium niche, funeral flowers will be displayed close to the structure for between seven and ten days.

When you bring fresh flowers on your visit, please remember that they will be removed when they start wilting. Planting any flowers is not allowed, as their growth can disturb burial sites. Please do not place flowers or any other objects in the walkway around our mausoleums and columbariums, as they may present a tripping hazard.

Some items are not allowed as they can present a danger to guests and our staff:

- Glass
- Breakable containers
- Ceramic or porcelain figures
- Statues
- Balloons
- Any object placed on the memorial or the surrounding ground

Our team strives to preserve the beauty of our cemetery, including our mausoleums and columbariums. As such, we do not allow anything to be taped to the outside of mausoleum crypts or columbarium niches.

Did You Know?

Our cemeteries are part of a perpetual care program, which means you can rest assured that the beauty and tranquility of your loved one's resting place will be preserved for generations to come.



DATES TO KEEP IN MIND

Spring - Fall (March 15 - October 30)



From spring through fall, we experience a variety of conditions. Our professional staff takes great pride in caring for the grounds as we move from the warm spring and summer days to the chilly start of autumn.

To help keep our cemeteries beautiful, we ask that guests refrain from placing any objects on the memorials or grounds around them. Winter & Holidays (November 16 - March 16)

As we approach the cold winter months, we know that many families are missing the ones they love throughout the holiday season. We strive to keep our locations accessible, so a bit of snow won't keep your family apart.

We welcome families to pay tribute to their loved ones with holiday decorations, including in the space on and around the memorial, provided they aren't prohibited items, don't infringe on others' memorials, and don't pose a danger to others. Please remember that all holiday arrangements must be removed by February 28. Our staff will remove them on this date to usher in spring and the beauty it brings.

Annual Beautification Days (March 1-14)

While we maintain the beauty of our properties year-round, our staff takes a spring cleanup period to perform additional beautification. We will also remove items during mowing season—aside from this time period, please decorate your loved ones' grave as you wish, while being mindful of other graves nearby.

Holiday Exceptions

Decorations may be placed one week before and will be removed one week after the following holidays: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, and July 4th.



Memorial Day

Our veterans have made great sacrifices to protect our freedom. We work to give back to our veteran community throughout the year, but Memorial Day marks a special time to pay tribute.

Our staff places flags on the graves of veterans with military markers, a symbol of our thanks. If your loved one is a veteran without a military marker, please come to the office and request a flag for placement. We would love to ensure that all of the veterans in our care are properly honored. These flags are permitted on graves one week before and one week after Memorial Day. Any flags left in the ground or not in an approved cemetery vase will be removed one week after Memorial Day.

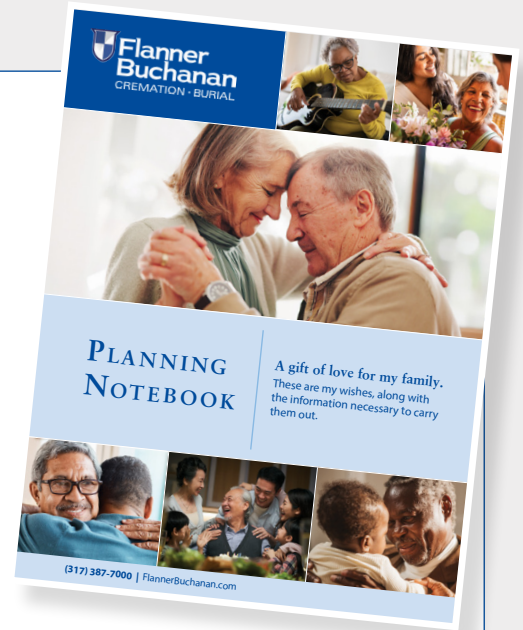

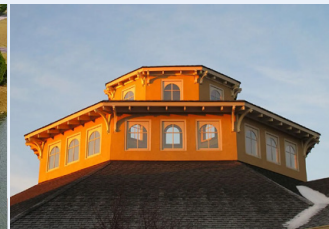
