
Church Office Requests

From Pastor Marissa Becklin

Preparing For Baby Becklin

As I prepare to take my 12 week family leave at the end of August through the end of November (if timing goes to plan, of course), my heart is full of gratitude, hope, and prayer for each of you. Faith United is not only a spiritual home, but a true family to me—and it is from that deep place of care that I thank you for your support, compassion, prayer, and care throughout this pregnancy.

As you may have heard at the forum on June 22nd, our congregation has a Family Leave Policy of 12 weeks. My intent is to begin my leave as soon as our son is born (and I hope to continue working until that point). He is due the last week of August, but Council and I have procured supply for you "just in case" starting as early as August 10th. I will be away for 12 Sundays after the beginning of my leave, so my return will likely not be later than the end of November. I fully anticipate being back in the congregation for the full duration of Advent, Annual Meeting season, and Christmas.

You are in good care while I am on this leave—you'll see included in this newsletter (and all newsletters moving forward, in addition to the bulletin and posted in the back of the Sanctuary) a schedule of who is supplying on Sunday mornings throughout this leave. These are people you know, who know and love you, and who look forward to sharing the Sacrament with you. If you are in a state of emergency, please consult the schedule for information about who is covering for emergencies that month. Laypeople are visiting our homebound folks during this time with Holy Communion; if you become homebound during this time and would like to be added to the rotation of visits, please call our office.

Weekly Sunday Bible Study and monthly Bible and Breakfast will be led by Scott Gola during this time of leave. Confirmation will be taught by laypeople in our congregation as well.

The Council and I have prepared and pre-approved the agendas for their gatherings during this leave (allowing them to meet and self-lead), and have also prepared Annual Meeting supplies so that everything will be ready when I return from leave.

This time of leave is a sacred one for my family, a season to rest, to grow together, and to cherish the gift of presence. I will not be answering work messages, emails, and texts during this time. However! If you would like to send a card or make a meal, our address is on the front of the newsletter and you are welcome to message us to schedule a drop-off. I will also be sending Shirley a picture of our little guy each month for the newsletter.

Even as I step back for a time, I carry each of you in my heart and in my daily prayers. I trust that the Spirit will continue to guide, nourish, and strengthen you in ways both seen and unseen.

My hopes and prayers for our congregation during my leave are these:

- -That you continue to gather faithfully around Word and Sacrament, remembering the promises of God that never fail.
- -That your care for one another deepens, bearing one another's burdens with gentleness and joy.
- -That new leaders feel called and empowered to step forward in service and that each member recognizes their role in the body of Christ.
- -That our congregation remains rooted in Scripture and bold in love—welcoming the stranger, feeding the hungry, and proclaiming the gospel with clarity and compassion.
- -That laughter, music, prayer, and holy curiosity continue to fill our spaces—reminding us that even now, God is doing a new thing in our midst.

Transitions are never without a little uncertainty, but I have every confidence in the Spirit's faithfulness and in the love that binds this community together. I also know that you will hold me and my family in prayer, just as I will hold all of you.

Thank you for your support, your understanding, and the grace you extend every day as disciples of Jesus. I look forward to returning to you with a new little one to introduce—and ready to step back into the rhythm of life together.

Until then, may the peace of Christ dwell richly among you.

FUEL Council Members Present: Tim Wise, Terry Burkholder, Scott Gola, Bob Gates, Kelly Lesher, Adrianne Arment, Rich Billings, Carol Wallace and Pastor Marissa Becklin.

<u>Devotions:</u> Bob Gates read a passage from James 1:5. This passage emphasizes seeking wisdom from God. The idea of starting each meeting with humility and asking for guidance was emphasized.

Treasurer's Report:

Scott Gola reported on the Account Balances: Main Checking Account, \$121,536.18; Money Market Account, \$48,580.47; Endowment: \$72,455.00.

The offerings have been consistent this year and more online giving is occurring. Scott is checking into the possibility of rolling some of the money in the main accounts into a CD to get a higher return of interest. He will get more information about this and report back.

Endowment Information:

Information from the most recent Endowment Fund Committee meeting was presented to members. In addition, Tim Hegeman, one of the members of the Committee spoke with the Council members regarding a grant request. This request was for \$10,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a playground to be used by Luthercare and other children in the Cocalico area. This playground would be at the current site of the existing playground at the Reamstown Park. The Endowment Fund Committee had unanimously agreed to granting \$5,000.00 for this project. The Council members discussed this grant proposal. A motion to grant the \$5,000.00 to the project and to support two (2) other \$1,000.00 projects was approved. The other grants were for \$1,000.00 to Disciple Makers to support a Mission Trip for a Peter's Porch volunteer (Manuel Rosario Martinez) and \$1,000.00 for the Jan's Circle of Friends Organization.

Heating Systems Maintenance Contract Discussion The Property Committee received two quotes for maintenance contracts for the church's heating and cooling systems. One quote was from Rodney Good and the other quote was from CPH. The Committee would like to use Rodney Good due to the fact that they are familiar with the church's heating and cooling system and because they provided a more thorough contract and recommendations. All Council members agreed to moving forward with the contract with Rodney Good.

Roof - The roof over the new part of the church will most likely need replaced in two (2) to five (5) years. The Committee will get a quote for this replacement in the fall.

Bathroom Update - The Property Committee will be getting a quote for upgrading the bathroom in the current nursery area to make it handicap accessible.

ALTAR: This central furnishing in a Christian worship

space is usually large, with a solid front that may be decorated with symbols or words. The flat surface, often covered with a cloth, is where the Communion elements are prepared and placed,



elements are prepared and placed, reminding us of Jesus' sacrifice as the Lamb of God. In some churches, the altar looks more like a table, with open legwork. We remember that Jesus invites us into fellowship with God now and to the heavenly banquet for eternity. We place offerings on the altar to symbolize our sacrificial response to God's redeeming love.



As part of a grant from our Endowment Fund, Terra Cycle recycling containers have been purchased and placed in places within our building.

Terra Cycle is an international leader in innovative sustainability solutions. Their mission is to eliminate the idea of waste and keep trash out of landfills or from incineration. They offer many free recycling programs on their website, Benebone, Burts Bees, Dunkin Donuts, Gatorade, Febreeze and many, many more. Please check the options and see how you can help at home!

The Zero Waste boxes that have been purchased by Faith United are used for recycling hard-to-recycle waste that isn't typically accepted by traditional services. Have profound faith and trust in God and he will see you through.





Make this candle to keep uninvited insects from your outdoor summer meals.

What you need:

- Lime
- 10-20 whole cloves
- Birthday candle
- 4 toothpicks
- Adult help



- 1. Have an adult slice the lime in half. Cut off the rounded end of one half so it can stand without rolling.
- 2. Insert 10 cloves into the cut sides of each half.
- 3. Stand the bottom half on a plate. Insert the candle in the center.
- 4. Insert the 4 toothpicks in the cut side of the bottom half. Then place the other half atop the toothpicks.
- 5. Before dinner, have an adult light the candle that's between the two lime halves. The flame's heat will warm the lime and create a smell that insects don't like.
- 6. Supervise the flame. Blow it out when it reaches the bottom lime.
