From the Rector's Desk

And we're off! Many of us associate this phrase with the horse races, or at least I did as a youth. It is an appropriate phrase to use as we begin our new calendar year and the second month of the Christian year.

Yes indeed, the race has begun. We accomplished many goals in 2023 as a parish family. Many firsts materialized, and things that were once wishes and dreams came to fruition. As we close out the Christmas season this week and enter the season of Epiphany (January 6th), we continue to march toward the light that is Christ. Christ in this upcoming Epiphany season calls us to look beyond the familiar, to look beyond ourselves and our comfort zones, and to look beyond the horizon for that which we seek.

Whether we seek peace, harmony, and love, or whether we seek growth, expansion, and financial stability, it all begins with acknowledging the savior of the world and the light which is Christ the Lord. This same concept also applies in our own personal lives. Signs of endings and new beginnings are all around us. Does not this remind you of the spring season? It is a season of new life and new birth; a time for shedding that which weighs us down and a sign to put on a new inner and outer armor of light which will guide us throughout the year. The season is almost upon us. We still have time to prepare for its arrival.

This concept also reminds me of a verse in a gospel anthem that we heard on Christmas Eve night, "Jesus, What a Wonderful Child." The lyricist wrote, "New life, new hope, to all he brings won't you listen to the angels sing ..." As we journey throughout this year, will not you listen not only to the angels but even to the birds when they sing? Birds, like angels, soar beyond our realm and our sense of reality; they soar to heights unknown.

We at St. Luke's can take note of what the birds already know. They know that to soar beyond their wildest hopes and dreams, you must have faith. It's an innate survival instinct. We must think and behave like eagles! Eagles soar to heights unknown. They do not dabble with the simple and mundane. Eagles are leaders! When threatened, irritated, or driven with a purpose, eagles soar higher and higher until the threat and irritant can no longer weigh it down. Eagles soar until their purpose is accomplished.

When you begin to soar like an eagle, you do not look back or down; you only look forward and upward. As the hymnwriter wrote, "New heights I'm gaining every day...Lord plant my feet on higher ground." St. Luke's has been aiming for and gaining higher ground since Sunday, May 21, 1871. A few families (eagles) initially gathered in their homes to worship God and to aim for higher ground. Much ground has been gained, but God has much more in store for us if we (the beneficiaries of those first eagles) will just open our eyes and hearts to him and look forward with faith and thanksgiving.

Today, we are standing on that ground with a vision and a purpose. We are standing on the hopes, dreams, and accomplishments of those who first took off to the races. The baton has now been passed to us. What we do with it or not do with it will not only reflect on us; but, will also be a reflection of us to our youth, our community, and to those who come after us of our faith and trust or lack thereof in God through his son, Jesus Christ.

As your Rector and Priest, I am overjoyed and thankful for that which we have accomplished together with God's help. Let us continue to keep our eyes, hearts, and minds open to that which God is calling us to do, to be, and to become. We are now officially in the race and have our eagle wings. Let us begin to soar to heights unknown!
