### From the Desk of the Rector

Last month we were fortunate to hear two Stewardship messages given by persons from outside of the Church; Dr. Baron Davis, and Mr. Chris Rey, J.D., President of Barber-Scotia College in Concord, NC. Dr. Davis spoke on "Faith without Work." President Rey used our Vestry Theme and wove it into telling of his own story, the resurrection of Barber-Scotia College, and challenged us to look at Stewardship through a different lens.

He began his talk by reading II Corinthians 9:6-8 "But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:"

The following are excerpts from his presentation. I've listened to his presentation at least four times over the week.

#### He said...

The New Normal requires New Resets: When the work resets; God reveals. He challenged us to reset our Stewardship, to tithe/give even when it doesn't make sense on paper, and to give God your first; not your last. We were reminded to trust. Stewardship is not about giving what you have left over.

Using the example of the Widow's Mite, found in Luke 21:1-4, he stated the Stewardship should be viewed similarly. "And he looked up, and saw the rich men casting their gifts into the treasury. And he saw also a certain poor widow casting in thither two mites. And he said, "Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all: For all these have of their abundance cast in unto the offerings of God: but she of her penury hath cast in all the living that she had."

Stewardship should not be measured by the size of the gift, but by the size of the sacrifice. It is not about what is in your hand, but what is in your heart. We should practice faithful giving, for if we sow sparingly, we will reap sparingly.

Lastly, we were encouraged to reset our vision, trust, and joy. Resetting our vision requires not giving just to maintain; but giving to expand. We should plant seed for ministries not yet imagined. We should dream bigger.

Resetting our trust requires not giving out of fear, but giving out of faith. Resetting our joy requires us to not give grudgingly, but to give with cheerfulness. Giving should not be perceived as a task; giving should be experienced as a part of worship. Every offering should be seen as a "Thank you, God." God has not changed. He will provide.

As mentioned earlier, his presentation has remained with me all week. Whether you heard it in person or watched it on your television or computer, hopefully something that you heard resonated with you; awakened something anew in you and your thoughts on Stewardship.

The service ended with the singing of two hymns which we as parishioners and a body should keep close to our hearts: "Revive Us Again," and "All my Hope on God Is Founded."

I will end my reflection with his words that you read earlier: "Giving is not about the size of the gift, but the size of the sacrifice." God sacrificed his Son for our salvation. Can't we sacrifice so that God's house can be maintained, new dreams imagined, and visions made clearer. We can if we change our hearts.





# St. Luke's Episcopal Church 154th Anniversary




Thankful for the mutual relationship between St. Luke's and Voorhees University, one of two Episcopal sponsored HBCUs left in the United States
