3rd West Bridgford (Friary) Scout Group celebrated its 90th anniversary in 2017 and is continuing to provide all our members with Skills for Life through an interesting and educational program. As of January 2025, we have just over 100 young people across two Beavers colonies, two Cubs packs and a Scout troop supported by an adult volunteer team numbering over 30.

Sections

Beaver Scouts: 6 - 8 Years

We meet weekly on a Thursday and Friday evening to take part in a wide range of activities including games, crafts, singing, visits and good turns, along with plenty of outdoor activities. We also have the opportunity to take part in the fun and excitement of camps and sleepovers. It may be the first time they spend a night away from home, so it's a real adventure for them

Cub Scouts: 8 – 10½ Years

Our Cub Scout Packs are split into smaller groups called Sixes and meets on a Monday and Wednesday evenings. Cubs take part in a wide range of activities designed to be interesting and challenging. Our Cub Scout meetings consist of games and activities with plenty of time spent outdoors. Camps and holidays are some of the most memorable events of the year for Cubs.

Scouts: 10½ - 14 Years

Our Scout Troop consists of small units of six to eight Scouts called a Patrol, led by Patrol Leaders. We meet on a Thursday evening. Outdoor activities feature prominently, with the highlight being camping. Throughout the year, Scouts learn various skills, such as map reading, camp cooking and first aid in preparation for camp. Rock climbing, potholing, gliding, photography and international experiences are just some of the things we get up to.

Subscription

The annual cost of Scouting membership with 3rd WB is £162 per person. It is the same whether a Beaver, a Cub or a Scout. In the same month that your child joins us, please organise a recurring monthly payment of £13.50 by completing a Standing Order form using the Group's bank details. Please ensure you include your child's name in the reference box.

Gift Aid

Gift Aid is a simple government initiative which allows donors who are taxpayers to increase the value of their donations at no extra cost to them. For every pound given, charities can get an extra 25 pence from HM Revenue & Customs, helping donations go further. Online Scout Manager (OSM)

OSM is the online tool that we use for section and group administration. In here we store contact details, session plans, badge records and basically everything we need to run our scout group. OSM has a parent portal which your section leader will send you a link to login. Once logged in there is a self-service area for updating contact details and any other information we need to know, plus you can see your child's badge progress, the programme and events that are planned. We **particularly do need to know**, in confidence, of any health information regarding your child so we can better understand any needs they have – if we don't know we cannot make allowances! We also send e-mail communications from OSM so please check your junk mail folder in case they don't come directly into your in-box to begin with.

Uniform & Scout Shop

During meetings we expect your child to attend in uniform 'from the waist up'.

- **Beavers** - Turquoise sweatshirt and Group neckerchief
- **Cub Scouts** - Dark green sweatshirt and Group neckerchief
- **Scouts** - Teal green smart shirt and Group neckerchief

For events where the full uniform is required, Scout activity trousers or dark grey / black 'school' type trousers / skirt would be more than adequate. Kit lists and other clothing requirements will be provided for events and camps.

A Group Neckerchief and Group Badge is provided when your child is invested. All the additional badges they will attain are also provided by us as part of your subscription.

To purchase the uniform, it is available from a number of sources but the official scout association website, [Scout Store | A Scout Shop for all your Scouting essentials](#), is as good as any other and probably better value.

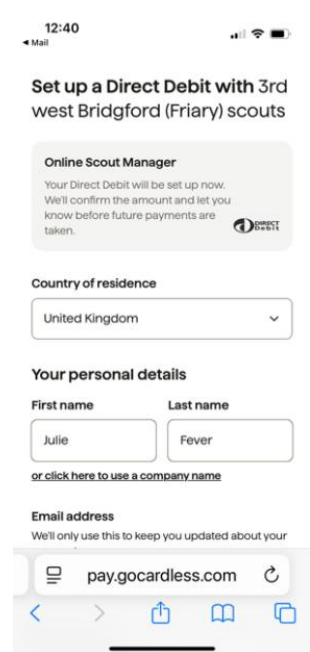
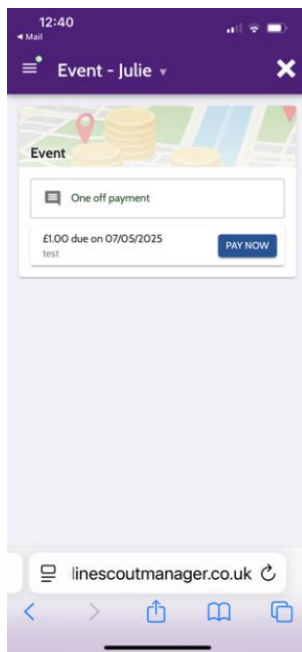
Go Cardless online payment method via OSM

For **events** only (camps / activities) we collect payments via OSM rather than bank transfers into the Friary account. Using Go Cardless makes it easy for Parents to pay for events and monitor what is still outstanding.

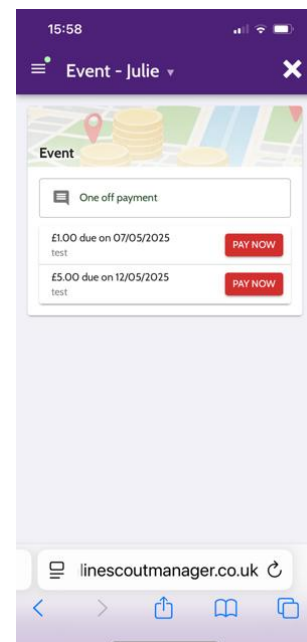
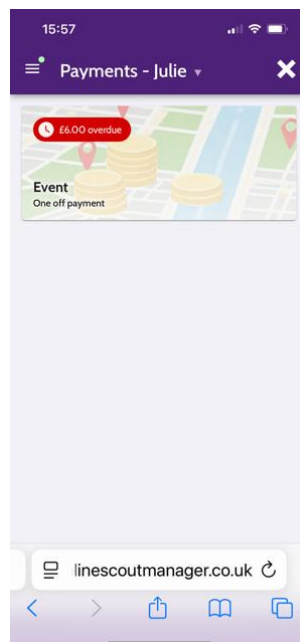
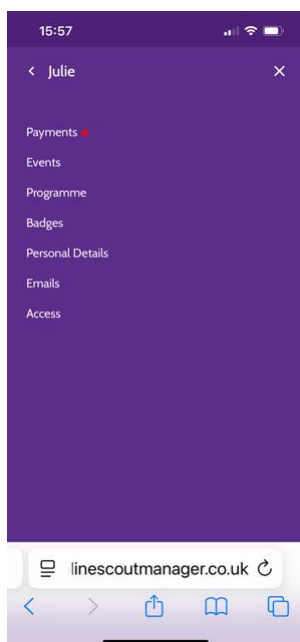
Please note there is no change to subs, this only effects payments for events and activities.

Step 1 – when you accept the event in OSM it will give the ‘pay now’ option which is a one off payment. It is not a recurring direct debit.

Step 2 – on the first occasion it will ask you to set up a direct debit. Please note this is not a recurring direct debit but Go Cardless will save your details for future payments.



In OSM you will be able to view the Payment screen to see what payments are outstanding or have been paid.



Trustee Board

The Group Trustee Board plays a vital role in the running of a Scout Group. Trustee Boards make decisions and carry out administrative tasks to ensure that the best quality Scouting can be delivered to young people in the Group.

Safeguarding, Data Protection & DBS

The Scout Association and the Group are all committed to the safety and security of our young people. We consider the safety of our Beavers, Cubs & Scouts to be of paramount concern. Disclosure and Barring Service checks (formally CRB checks) are therefore an important part of our approach to safeguarding young people. Adults who help regularly are DBS checked, Parent helpers on our rota do not need to be unless they stay on overnight activities.

Fundraising – 200 Club

A monthly Prize Draw designed to raise extra funds for all sections of the group so that Beavers, Cubs and Scouts can participate in additional events and activities. Membership is entirely voluntary, and members (parents and family members) may join and leave at any time.

Every month we guarantee someone will win a 1st Prize of £25, 2nd Prize of £10 and 3rd Prize of £5. A total of 200 numbers are available but only 'live' numbers allocated to members are entered into the draw to guarantee that all prizes are won. Members keep the same allocated number(s) for each prize draw. Each number cost just £1.00 per month payable by Standing Order or Cheque (for the year).

There is no limit on the quantity of numbers held by a member. Since the 200 Club began, over £20,000 has been raised and donated to the Group. Membership is currently less than 100, so your chances of winning are considerably better than you might think.
