



# Capacity Building Request for Proposal

Brené Brown's Dare to Lead™ Three-Day Workshop

### Opportunity for Organizations in West Central Illinois & Northeast Missouri

The Tracy Family Foundation (TFF) seeks Capacity Building Grant applications from nonprofit and educational professionals ready to lead positive and sustainable transformations in their organizations, teams, and communities. Nonprofit organizations and schools serving West Central Illinois in the counties of Adams, Brown, Cass, Greene, Hancock, McDonough, Morgan, Pike, Scott, or Schuyler, or Northeast Missouri counties of Clark, Lewis, Marion, Ralls, Pike, Knox, Shelby and Monroe are eligible to apply. Successful applicants will receive a grant of \$770 to participate in the three-day workshop. The cost of the workshop is \$850 per participant, thus a 10% matching cash contribution of \$80 is required from applicants. Additional expenses, such as travel to the workshop, may be considered. Each qualifying nonprofit can send up to 4 participants.

Dare to Lead™ is the ultimate playbook for developing brave leaders and courageous cultures. Based on the research of Dr. Brené Brown, leaders learn the critical skills required to do brave work, have tough conversations, and show up in a meaningful way daily.

Facilitated by Dare to Lead Certified™ facilitator Julie Boll, this program is designed to help individuals:

- Develop deep self-awareness.
- Increase their level of awareness and understanding of others.
- Recognize their impact on others.
- Articulate their call to courage.

If approved, grant payments are issued approximately 30 days after the Capacity Building Grant has been awarded. A final report will be due within one year after the grant is awarded.

**NORTHEAST MISSOURI:** Nonprofit organizations and schools need to submit a **Dare to Lead Grant application** to the Community Foundation by March 1, 2024 at <a href="https://www.mycommunityfoundation.org/grants">www.mycommunityfoundation.org/grants</a>. If approved, grant payments are issued approximately 30 days after the Dare to Lead Grant has been awarded. A final report will be due within one year after the grant is awarded.

**Payment:** Payment is due on or before the start of the workshop.

Dr. Brown is a research professor at the University of Houston where she holds the Huffington Foundation – Brené Brown Endowed Chair at The Graduate College of Social Work. She has spent the past two decades studying courage, vulnerability, shame, and empathy. Most recently, she completed a seven-year study on courageous leadership. She is the author of five #1 New York Times bestsellers: The Gifts of Imperfection, Daring Greatly, Rising Strong, Braving the Wilderness, and Dare to Lead, which also debuted at #1 on The Wall Street Journal and Publisher's Weekly list.
