Greetings in Christ as we wait in joyful hope for the birth of our Messiah! Happy Advent and Merry Christmas! I pray your holiday season is going well and that you can experience and appreciate many meaningful moments.

The other day, I was visiting someone in a neighboring town. As I was leaving, I said, "Hope to see you soon." They smiled and responded

with, "Maybe I'll see you on the way up." I was confused at first, and then I realized what they meant. They were referring to the second coming of the Lord. That idea when the rapture occurs, people will be taken up into the sky and others will be left behind. I confess, I was amused by the comment. But it got me thinking.

During this time of the year, we celebrate the birth of the Messiah, the coming of the Lord, a historic event. Then, there is the Lord's second coming, which scripture tells us, no one will know when it will occur, not even the angels in heaven. These are two dramatic and paramount occurrences in the human race. One which already happened, and one which is still anticipated. But what if there was a "Middle coming of the Lord?" A coming that happens in between those two extremes? A coming of the Lord that is hidden?

There are times in our lives when we have fallen asleep spiritually. It happens to all of us. For some reason or another, we forget that we are spiritual beings having a natural experience, rather than the other way around. We get caught up in our busy schedules and routines, focusing more on self than on helping others. Our Prayer and devotion time has slipped away from us. The worldly news sinks us into some sort of despair. Even Christmas becomes a burden because of worldly expectations.

And yet, we eventually reach a point where things begin to turn around. The burden is lifted. Life begins to improve. Our problems are resolved, or even if they're not, some sense of peace has come upon us. There is now a feeling of hope once again. This is the middle coming of the Lord. Often, we don't even know it is happening until we look back and see how things have worked out.

We are people who like drama. We think of the birth of Jesus and how he was born under extreme humbleness, in a barn, in a feeding trough. We think of the second coming with it's flash of lighting, sounds of trumpets, the sun darkened, and Jesus coming down in the clouds! The middle coming, however, is quiet, hard to observe, and elusive.

During those hard times in our lives when everything seems to be a struggle, especially during the Christmas season, try to remember to ask the Lord to come into your heart once again. Did he leave it before? No, he was with you the whole time, but ask him to come into your life, into the situation, into all that you are experiencing. Acknowledge that we can't do it without him. And you will experience the middle coming of the Lord. Merry Christmas!
