
Greetings in Christ! Happy November everyone! Halloween is past and we had a fun and successful time passing out treats with a reminder to the kids that Jesus loves them. And so, Thanksgiving time is upon us! Let's talk about thankfulness and kindness for a moment.

In Mark 1:40 a leper asked, or rather, told Jesus that he could heal him if he would be willing. Jesus said, I am willing, and reached out and touched him, and he was healed. He reached out and touched the leper! This leper was near the gate of the city, because he was an outcast due to the contagiousness of his disease. He was unclean and untouchable. Many who would pass by the gate and perhaps offer help, but probably usually not.

When Jesus and the disciples came to the city, he was certainly one of the many Rabbis and "religious elites" that would have passed near him coming and going. When he recognized Jesus as one of these "elites" and called out to him, we can imagine his expectations weren't too high that Jesus would help.

But of course, Jesus was different. He didn't see the man as a leper but a human being who was sick and needed help. His kindness went beyond social stereotypes.

Jesus calls us to do acts of kindness, no matter what they look like or act like. Even if it makes us uncomfortable, we should try to look at where they're coming from and understand their circumstances. Only then can we develop genuine compassion. In the words of Mother Teresa, "If you judge people, you have no time to love them". Let's make November a month of acts of kindness. Let's also gather together and share these stories of kind acts and support one another. These acts of kindness, either random or not, can be difficult. I can affirm this. One Thanksgiving, we were trying to spread some holiday cheer by giving away a \$20 gas cards at a gas station. It took several attempts because people were either confused, or they said "No thank you". I believe their thought was, what's the catch?! No catch, just trying to spread kindness. 


A NOTE FROM CHIPPY HAPPY THANKSGIVING TO ALL!
