Lights up on Broadway as our NYC public school students gather to share their collective artistry for an evening. When making theater together, students often quickly realize that their individual roles and journeys are uniquely and intrinsically linked to every other member of the class, cast or crew. What an early and profound lesson to know that one matters—the impact, the safe place to take creative risks, the community. Ask any participating student tonight and they will share that theater ensembles, like teams, provide them educational experiences in real time to learn that dedication matters, that their contributions matter, that their attitude matters and that there is "a place to fit in" for every teen on the chorus line (or backstage).

A shout out to our incredible, dedicated theater teachers who invest in our students, encouraging them to strive but also to have "Paciencia y fe" in the process.

Tonight's productions, selected from over 30 strong submissions, reinforce the power of theater to enable us to examine new perspectives creatively. And beyond performance, these plays and musical numbers challenge and inspire students to consider context, history, culture and human nature. Theatre in our schools provides our participating teens and all students a place and time to explore big issues safely through targeted theater exercises or substantial theatrical works in dedicated classes, rehearsals, and performances.

Jake Gyllenhaal

Host

An Academy Award and Tony Award nominee, Gyllenhaal has starred in over forty feature films and multiple theatre productions bringing an unparalleled passion for his craft to every project. Following his breakout role in *Donnie Darko* (2001), Gyllenhaal's groundbreaking performance in Brokeback Mountain (2005) earned him Oscar and SAG nominations and a BAFTA win for Best Supporting Actor, cementing his status as one of Hollywood's most versatile and fearless actors. Other notable film credits include: Nightcrawler (2014) which garnered BAFTA, Golden Globe and SAG nominations for Lead Actor, Spider-Man: Far From Home (2019), Road House (2024) and its upcoming seguel where Gyllenhaal will reprise his role. Gyllenhaal executive produced and made his series debut in Apple TV+'s "Presumed Innocent," earning a Golden Globe nomination for Best Actor. The show remains the #1 most viewed drama of all time on Apple TV+. Gyllenhaal has performed in numerous stage productions, including Nick Payne's Constellations, the Roundabout Theatre Company's If There Is I Haven't Found It Yet, This is Our Youth, Sunday in the Park with George and Sea Wall/A Life, for which he received a Tony nomination for lead actor. Currently in a three-year first-look film deal with Amazon MGM, Gyllenhaal's work as a producer through his company, Nine Stories, is equally noteworthy with producing credits for the stage and screen including Stronger (2017), Wildlife (2018), The Devil all the Time (2020), The Guilty (2021), Amazon's upcoming sequel to Road House, and Broadway's Sea Wall/A Life and Slave Play.

His play *Gnit*, an adaptation of *Peer Gynt*, will have its Canadian Premiere at the Shaw Festival in 2025. 











