### **Beyond Decorations**

I once crafted a cast of characters to populate a cheerful tabletop Nativity scene using colorful polymer clay. I made it as a gift for a youngster in my life, a former 5-year-old who is now a full-fledged grownup. I made it with the hope that the little guy and his family would display the putz each year and that it would become a cherished tradition in that household. And it did! The sweet, cartoonish, three-inch tall figurines have weathered 25 years of being bubble-wrapped for safe storage, unbubble-wrapped when Advent came around, and bubble-wrapped again when the calendar advanced to Epiphany.

I guess you could say that the tableau has become an heirloom. Knowing that brings about a sense of gratification. After all, putting that set together was not without effort! I stippled the clay bodies of all the small sheep to look fluffy. I shaped folds into the robes of the Magi to give them a fabric-like drape. I crisscrossed stacks of clay slivers into a mound of hay for the manger and rolled other slivers into tiny ringlets to fashion the angel's hair. I imagined it all in vivid detail.

And as I went about the project, molding each character into existence, I gave a lot of thought to the actual lives of the storied people the figures were meant to represent. I was a young parent myself back then and considered thoughtfully what it might have been like for Jesus' parents to endure the challenges of their inconvenient situation while yet having a heart full of hope for the infant Child of Promise. What would have Joseph been experiencing? Would he have been feeling panicked as Mary's water broke? Embarrassed that the accommodations were so rustic? Shameful that the baby wasn't "his?" Proud that he was "doing the right thing" in the odd situation? Nervous? Stoic? Loving? Nauseous?

And Mary? Was she startled by her labor pains? Was she frightened? Or was fear overshadowed by the misery factor of discomfort? Was she eager to get it over with? Was she determined to savor her role between contractions? Was she anxious about the baby's future? Was she confident that all would be well?

Pondering these questions right now stirs me even more than when I first held the malleable clay in my hands. That might be because I've experienced 25 more years of my own life since then. I've accumulated moments of elation, and moments of desolation, and the memories of all these moments influence my worldview in the present.

Will you be putting up a Nativity scene of your own in the coming days? Perhaps you have one that stirs your nostalgia or touches your heart. Whether you made it yourself and know the pieces full well, or whether the pieces arrived recently from Amazon, I invite you to make a spiritual practice of setting them out. Imagine the story for yourself in vivid detail. Reflect on what the characters mean to you. Reflect on what the story means to you today in contrast to what it may have meant to you in the past. Which aspects may have faded for you? Which have gained in potency?

My worldview these days is readjusted by all that I find disheartening in the current age—an age coated in gold-leafed greed and vulgar corruption bearing a resemblance to the age into which Jesus was born. In my more naïve days, I never grasped why it was so important that a Savior should arrive on the scene to lift anyone and everyone from despair. I think I get it now.

### TREX Plastic Recycling

There is a very **significant reduction** in our plastic collections!

Thank you! You must be accumulating less plastic. You are using your own bags for your shopping! (Some merchants offer a small credit for using your own bags, or they are no longer using plastic bags.) That's great! It keeps that much more out of our landfills.

OH NO! Is this downturn because you are forgetting to recycle? We need to do better! Until last year, we were collecting about 40+ pounds of plastic each month. Now we are collecting only 10 to 12 pounds.

I am excited about keeping plastic out of the landfills and environment. The reward is the occasional free bench. Whatever the motivation, bring your #2 and #4 plastic bags to church for our recycling program.

TREX has doubled the amount needed to receive a bench to 1,000 pounds. The BAM churches are continuing to work together. We take the #2 and #4 plastic bags that the Recycling Center is unable to take. BAM began this program over 5 years ago. Thus far, the six churches each have received several free benches in exchange for over 22,000 pounds of plastic. And, we have kept that 11 tons of plastic from polluting the waterways and roadways of our world.

Thank you for your continued efforts and plastic contributions. Plastic for our donation needs to be clean and dry. I put my donations in a bag hanging from a hook, then tie it up and drop it at church. The collection point is under the table by the stage in Fellowship Hall that is closest to the kitchen.

Many thanks to all who bring their plastic, the young people who help pack it up, and Kevin Harstine who helps with weighing and transporting the plastic for delivery.

### Plastic NOT acceptable:

- ✓ Degradable/compostable bags
- ✓ Prewashed salad mix bags
- ✓ Frozen food bags
- ✓ Candy bar wrappers
- ✓ Chip bags
- ✓ Dried fruit & nut bags
- ✓ Produce bags such as used for grapes
- ✓ Six-pack rings
- ✓ Pouch packaging
- ✓ If material easily is shiny & crinkles or crunches
- ✓ If material does not stretch easily

#### MISSION MINUTE: MEDICAL SUPPLIES REACH THE AHUAS CLINIC

In September, the Clínica Evangélica Morava in Ahuas, Honduras, received a long-awaited shipment of medical equipment and supplies that will strengthen its ability to care for thousands of patients each year. The container, donated by Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach, arrived in the remote region of La Moskitia after months of coordination, preparation, and prayer.

Getting these supplies to Ahuas was no small feat. After crossing the country and clearing customs, the shipment still had to be ferried across the lagoon—a process that required four trips and three boatloads. The final load arrived around midnight and was unloaded by flashlight into the clinic.

Among the donations were dozens of hospital beds to replace unsafe, deteriorated equipment, as well as thousands of syringes and other essential items that will significantly reduce costs for the clinic. Each piece of equipment represents life-saving potential and renewed comfort for patients.

This effort was made possible through many hands and hearts. Deep thanks to Rick Nelson, who coordinated the shipment on behalf of the BWM and traveled to Honduras to support its delivery in person; to Hospital Sisters for their continued ministry of sharing medical resources worldwide; and to all of the people who donated to the BWM to make the transportation of these supplies possible. We trust that God will multiply these gifts for the health and wholeness of many.

### THERE WAS NO ROOM AT THE INN...

Since 1987, MORAVIAN OPEN DOOR (MOD) has provided a temporary home for homeless adults in Manhattan, NYC.

This ministry provides safe and affordable transitional housing for 40 homeless adults. MOD provides a healthful breakfast and supportive social services to rebuild our residents' lives. MOD helps them to obtain jobs and benefits, with the goal of finding permanent affordable housing and learning the life skills to maintain it.

Residents at Moravian Open Door pay a small monthly fee for their room and services (often much of their limited income); this covers only about 50% of the operating costs for the facility and its full-time staff of three.

### FIVE WAYS TO GIVE

The Moravian Ministries Foundation in America has generously agreed to begin paying all processing fees charged for online gifts made through the Moravian Giving Portal. While the Foundation itself has never charged any kind of fee, the backend processor, Blackbaud Merchant Services, charged a processing fee like others who perform this service. Now, this processing fee will no longer be withheld, so our church will get the full balance of gifts given via the Moravian Giving Portal. As a reminder, there are several different ways to provide your offerings:

- 1. Bring your offering to Sunday worship. Gifts can be offered whether you attend via "Parking Lot Worship" or worship in the pews.
- 2. Mail your offering to the church office at College Hill Moravian Church, 72 W. Laurel Street, Bethlehem, PA 18018.

- 3. Use your bank's "bill pay" service. A one-time or recurring payment can be made by a bank on your behalf. Banks that offer this service typically cut a check and mail it to the church at no cost to you. Contact your bank for details.
- 4. Make an online payment through the Moravian Giving Portal at <a href="https://mmfa.info/giving-portal/">https://mmfa.info/giving-portal/</a>
  Go to this link, click on our church's name, and follow the instructions to make a one-time gift or a recurring monthly gift. Donations can be made by members and non-members via direct debit of a bank account or by credit card. All donation processing fees for portal gifts are now paid by the Moravian Ministries Foundation, so your full donation will be received by our church.
- 5. Make an online payment through Realm. Members can direct debit funds monthly from their bank account to the church's bank account.
