Clearing the Way for Wonder

Have you ever seen the famous LIFE magazine photo of Albert Einstein's messy desk? First published in 1955, the picture was captured by Ralph Morse on the day the renowned theoretical physicist died. The surface was memorialized in its most authentic condition, being that Professor Einstein, his abdominal aortic aneurism beginning to rupture, did not have an opportunity to tidy up the space on his way to the hospital. (He did manage to scoop up a speech he was preparing at the time and take it with him edit in case he started feeling better.)

Alas, he never returned to that Princeton office. And even if he had, it's not likely he would have shuffled the strewn paper piles into neat stacks, or organized the professional journals, or put away his tobacco tin and pipe just for the sake of the camera. This was, after all, the man who said, "If a cluttered desk is a sign of a cluttered mind, of what, then, is an empty desk a sign of?"

This quote, you will not be surprised to learn, has been my mantra and my rationalization for decades. I also abide by research "proving" that people who operate in chaotic environments are among the most creative. I wear the badge proudly!

Periodically, though, I imagine even Einstein looked around, ran his fingers through his crazy mop of absent-minded-professor hair, and said to himself, "I have got to do something about this." Sometimes he needed to sweep out the mélange of ideas and untangle the thought threads in his head as much as in his physical space.

Einstein thrived on curiosity and imagination, qualities resulting in creativity. And above all that, he spoke of *wonder*. "The most beautiful thing we can experience is the mysterious. It is the source of all true art and all science. He to whom this emotion is a stranger, who can no longer pause to *wonder* and stand rapt in awe, is as good as dead; his eyes are closed." And he spoke of taking advantage of stepping out of community sometimes to be solitary: "Be a loner. That gives you time to *wonder*, to search for the truth. Have holy curiosity. Make your life worth living."

I don't know that Einstein ever drew inspiration from Jesus directly. Being culturally Jewish, perhaps not. But Jesus practiced similar breakaways and instructed his disciples to do the same. He said, "'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves." (Mark 6: 31–32 NRSV)

For similar reasons, I am using the month of June to take a short sabbatical leave. The Moravian Church allows for and encourages pastors to take such breaks periodically—as often as once every five years. Blessed to have been carrying out ministry with you at College Hill for 5½ years now, it's the right time for me to catch my breath, clear the mind clutter, and open myself to *wonder* so that, when I return, I can continue serving with renewed curiosity, imagination, and creativity. I'm pretty sure my desk will still be cluttered, but my body, mind, and spirit will have had a fresh reset.

WORLD HERITAGE IS OUR HERITAGE: A COMMUNITY CELEBRATION OF MORAVIAN CHURCH SETTLEMENTS-BETHLEHEM WORLD HERITAGE INSCRIPTION

On Saturday. September 6, 2025 (12 PM-7 PM) we will take time as a community to come together to celebrate the Moravian Church Settlement's new World Heritage Status. We understand that our strength is in our diverse Bethlehem community and our living heritage is best celebrated by our arts and music, community gatherings, and sharing in food and fun.

So come out for a block party on Church Street, starting from music and programs especially for families on the city's Payrow Plaza and sharing in food trucks along Church Street, free activities for families all throughout Central's church green, free Moravian Museum tours and a chance to see inside the Old Chapel, Sanctuary, and other historic buildings, and lots of great music throughout the day both at Payrow Plaza and around Central Moravian Church's green.

The day begins on the lower church green with an opening ceremony at 12 PM, followed by an unveiling of a new city mural and World Heritage inscription plaque. The Johnston Music Festival concert will be held within Central's Sanctuary at 3 PM. A free ice cream social, sponsored by the Bethlehem Area Moravian churches, will be held from 5 PM-**7 PM** on the church green. And if you are a Moravian sugar cake baker, or want to test out a recipe, consider submitting your sugar cake to be judged on September 6 as well! The day will end with a Community Lovefeast outside on the church green at 5:30 PM.

We are counting on you to include only acceptable plastic so that our donation is not rejected. Everyone is doing a good job of sorting your plastic to make sure our donation is acceptable. The Bethlehem Area Moravians thus far have kept several tons of plastic from polluting the earth in the past 5 years! That is a LOT of plastic! With our churches working together, we have made an impact.

GUIDELINES FOR #2 AND #4 PLASTIC COLLECTION

Acceptable plastics:

- Plastic shopping bags
- Produce and bread bags
- Grocery bags
- Cereal box liners
- Ice bags

- Ziploc & other recloseable bags
- Sandwich bags
- Newspaper sleeves
- Plastic e-commerce mailers
- Dry cleaning bags
- Bubble wrap & air pillows
- Case overwrap
- Salt & wood pellet bags
- Pallet wrap & stretch film

Plastic NOT acceptable:

- Plastic bottles (water, soda, etc.)
- Degradable/compostable bags
- Prewashed salad mix bags
- Frozen food bags
- Candy bar wrappers
- Chip bags
- Dried fruit & nut bags
- Produce bags such as used for grapes
- Six-pack rings
- Pouch packaging
- If material easily is shiny & crinkles or crunches
- If material does not stretch easily

As our music ensemble season has come to a close for the 2024–2025 year, we offer thanks to all the wonderful musicians who give so generously of their time and talent to enhance our worship throughout the year.

Thanks to the **Choir**, the members of which devote hours each week in rehearsal and worship to serve as music ministers for our congregation, providing the foundation for our worship. The choir year culminated Sunday, May 18, in a wonderful celebration of *Moravian* music, focusing on the talents of our own congregation with hymns by Willard Harstine, Shirley Cox, and Pastor Chris as well as organ prelude and postlude by Becky (Kleintop) Lepore and Ben Wallace. A moving addition this year was the choir's premier of an arrangement of BLESSED

ASSURANCE, written by Brian Henkelmann (son of the congregation) in honor of his cousin, Chuck Stoltz, who is sorely missed and whose presence remains with us each Sunday.

Thanks to our amazing **Handbell Choir** whose talents add beautifully to our worship each time they ring. The Handbell Choir wrapped up their season, bookending our worship Sunday, June 1, with their elegant tintinnabulation. (Look it up!) This ensemble is lovingly and masterfully led by Co-Directors, Ben and Krysti Wallace. Rehearsals are always exciting with Little Ringers Amelia Olver, Milo Wallace, and Parker Diehl-Mongold in attendance.

Thank you from **Gwyn**: What an unexpected and humbling surprise greeted me at the end of Moravian Music Sunday with the proclamation changing my title from Organist/Director of Music to *Minister of Music* at College Hill! I am so blessed to be at College Hill and feel unworthy of this title, but am tremendously grateful to the Elders and the congregation for honoring me in this manner. With God's help and that of the congregation, I will strive to live up to my new task.

Organ Update: After months of planning, on Thursday, May 22 (just days after Moravian Music Sunday), Pete Gerger, our organ tuner and contractor, disconnected the organ console from the pipe chamber. He has visited many times since, with tremendous progress being made with each visit. Unfortunately, we weren't able to find a congregation to take our old console (also featured during this year's Moravian Music Sunday), but we have been able to harvest its parts. The keyboards (manuals) have been donated to another organ builder and the metal is being recycled. Work is also progressing inside the organ chamber - old relays (the parts which directly open the organ pipes to create sound) are being replaced by new, wiring is being updated to current standards, and preparations are being made for a new rectifier. Watch for a bulletin board coming soon, focusing on the organ project. Excitement is in the works!

THERE WAS NO ROOM AT THE INN...

Since 1987, MORAVIAN OPEN DOOR (MOD) has provided a temporary home for homeless adults in Manhattan, NYC.

This ministry provides safe and affordable transitional housing for 40 homeless adults. MOD provides a healthful breakfast and supportive social services to rebuild our residents' lives. MOD helps them to obtain jobs and benefits, with the goal of finding permanent affordable housing and learning the life skills to maintain it.

Residents at Moravian Open Door pay a small monthly fee for their room and services (often much of their limited income); this covers only about 50% of the operating costs for the facility and its full-time staff of three.

Moravian Open Door receives no government funds. Donations from individuals, congregations, and other private sources must cover the rest of operating expenses.

Your gift can help the vital ministry of MOD, the only transitional housing ministry of the Northern Province of the Moravian Church. Please consider a generous financial gift to MOD.

FIVE WAYS TO GIVE

The Moravian Ministries Foundation in America has generously agreed to begin paying all processing fees charged for online gifts made through the Moravian Giving Portal. While the Foundation itself has never charged any kind of fee, the backend processor, Blackbaud Merchant Services, charged a processing fee like others who perform this service. Now, this processing fee will no longer be withheld, so our church will get the full balance of gifts given via the Moravian Giving Portal. As a reminder, there are several different ways to provide your offerings:

- 1. Bring your offering to Sunday worship. Gifts can be offered whether you attend via "Parking Lot Worship" or worship in the pews.
- 2. Mail your offering to the church office at College Hill Moravian Church, 72 W. Laurel Street, Bethlehem, PA 18018.
- 3. Use your bank's "bill pay" service. A one-time or recurring payment can be made by a bank on your behalf. Banks that offer this service typically cut a check and mail it to the church at no cost to you. Contact your bank for details.
- 4. Make an online payment through the Moravian Giving Portal at https://mmfa.info/giving-portal/
 Go to this link, click on our church's name, and follow the instructions to make a one-time gift or a recurring monthly gift. Donations can be made by members and non-members via direct debit of a bank account or by credit card. All donation processing fees for portal gifts are now paid by the Moravian Ministries Foundation, so your full donation will be received by our church.

5. Make an online payment through Realm. Members can direct debit funds monthly from their bank account to the church's bank account. Realm charges a fee for processing the contribution, so users may wish to add 1% more to their offerings to offset this fee.
