Heaven on Anderson Campus

*If the setting of heaven turns out to be a boundless sunflower field
on a humidity-free, blue-sky kind of day, I won't be disappointed.*

This is the thought that kept returning to me as I meandered the neatly mulched pathways through St. Luke's Sunflower Garden, the seasonal wonder that has been decorating the southeastern edge of Northampton County for a few weeks each summer since 2020. Rising enchantingly and existing for an all-too-short stay, its glowing acreage as ephemeral as Brigadoon, the golden field is nothing less than a limited engagement sensation. Pure inspiration.

It's not only the striking beauty of 172,000 symmetrical, honey-colored discs fringed in audacious yellow petals all facing expectantly eastward that leaves me in awe. It's also the reverend hush that overcomes the field even though semitrucks rumble on nearby I-78 and strolling visitors whisper and chatter from the depth of the display. All these sounds blend into a barely noticeable, murmuring undertone. A heartbeat. A pulse.

And there's the prevailing atmosphere, a benevolent aura that settles gracefully upon the expanse, rendering it at least holy if not sacred. People's collective demeanor seems to shift once they've parked their cars and stepped through a wooden arbor, a defining portal. To duck into the maze is to leave something of the world behind. Inside the sunflower realm, everyone is kind, pleasant, and peaceful. Every single person smiles. No one scowls. Folks give the right-of-way to other folks at every pedestrian intersection. Dog walkers offer bottled water to one another's animal companions. Strangers strike up conversations. Children sing cheerfully. Families dressed in coordinating clothing pose among the towering stalks to take selfie portraits and passersby approach and offer to snap the shot for them. There is an unforced camaraderie, a gentle fellowship, a tender humanity.

The Kindom of Heaven is like...a swath of wonder to wander in. (If you missed it this year, put it on your calendar now for next year.)

FIVE WAYS TO GIVE

As a reminder, there are several different ways to provide your offerings:

1. Bring your offering to Sunday worship. Gifts can be offered whether you attend via "Parking Lot Worship" or worship in the pews.
2. Mail your offering to the church office at College Hill Moravian Church, 72 W. Laurel Street, Bethlehem, PA 18018.
3. Use your bank's "bill pay" service. A one-time or recurring payment can be

made by a bank on your behalf. Banks that offer this service typically cut a check and mail it to the church at no cost to you. Contact your bank for details.

4. Make an online payment through the **Moravian Giving Portal** at <https://mmfa.info/giving-portal/>. Go to this link, click on our church's name, and follow the instructions to make a one-time gift or a recurring monthly gift. Donations can be made by members and non-members via direct debit of a bank account or by credit card. All donation processing fees for portal gifts are now paid by the Moravian Ministries Foundation, so your full donation will be received by our church.

5. Make an online payment through Realm. Members can direct debit funds monthly from their bank account to the church's bank account. Realm charges a fee for processing the contribution, so users may wish to add 1% more to their offerings to offset this fee. 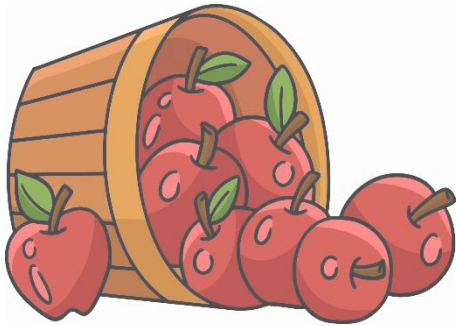
