1 million residents by 2050

WHAT WE CAN DO

The risk isn't just change — it's disconnection. Local news creates a shared understanding of what's happening, why it matters and who it affects. It turns growth from something happening to communities into something they can actively shape.

We are seeking **\$200,000 annually for three years** to build the Growth Lab.

An investment will support a team of three reporters who will produce data-driven journalism and human-centered storytelling focused on the forces reshaping the region. Beyond reporting, the Growth Lab will host community conversations, listening sessions and public forums to ensure residents are part of the discussion.

Together, we can ensure that rapid growth is met with transparency, understanding and meaningful public dialogue.
