Petaling Jaya, 15 September 2021 - Malaysia Productivity Corporation (MPC) urges businesses to embrace digital technology to gain competitive advantage in the marketplace and hasten productivity growth.

Those in the leadership positions need to take the risk and make brave decisions to achieve a lofty goal. Digital adoption will require these leaders to renew their mindset and set lofty targets not just to survive the pandemic but to come out stronger by leveraging on the opportunities brought forth by digitalisation" he added.

According to Maresa Ng, Chairman of Community Engagement & Development, Small and Medium Enterprises Association (SAMENTA) Central, "At SAMENTA, we are a strong advocate

for businesses turning to automation and digitalisation to increase productivity. This will enable Malaysian SMEs to continue being competitive among our regional peers, and more critically to swiftly recover in the aftermath of surviving the COVID-19 pandemic. Prior to the pandemic, going digital was nice-to-have, but today, it is a "must-have" to survive and thrive in the onward months to come".
