President's View: Protecting Our Neighborhood Animals

As we settle into the deep freeze of a Kansas City winter, it's crucial to remember that the bitterly cold temperatures pose a severe risk to our four-legged neighbors. Whether they are beloved indoor pets who slipped out or community cats navigating the elements, the drop in temperature requires us all to be vigilant. A quick check under your car hood before starting the engine or offering a warm shelter can save a life, but sometimes more help is needed. Fortunately, our city has a robust network of resources ready to assist.

For general concerns or urgent issues, **KCMO**Animal Services remains our primary line of defense for animal welfare and public safety. Additionally, we know that winter heating bills can tighten budgets, making pet care difficult. If you or a neighbor are struggling to afford supplies, **Pet Help Finder** is an excellent tool for locating financially friendly pet resources. For those looking to network or find placement for strays, the **KC and Surrounding Area Cats Needing Homes or Help** Facebook group is a valuable community hub for connecting animals with the help they need.

We are especially excited to highlight two **new** resources that are making a massive difference in the Kansas City area this season. First is **Mad Cat Circle**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to humane population stabilization. They focus on Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) to ensure that community cats—mad or not—live safer, healthier lives. By building trust within neighborhoods, they are not just managing populations but actively improving the welfare of our outdoor feline friends.

Another groundbreaking addition to our local rescue network is **Sky Fetch K9 Rescue**. This new group brings high-tech solutions to lost pet recovery by combining thermal drone technology with a personal passion for dogs. If a pet goes missing in the freezing cold, their thermal imaging can be a lifesaver. Best of all, Sky Fetch is a free service, powered entirely by generous donors who believe that the dogs they rescue often end up rescuing us in return.

FORKS & RAKES by Stephanie Murrell

Almond Ricotta Cake

A traditional Italian dessert, perfect with espresso, tea, or coffee.

Servings: 12 Prep Time: 12 min Cook Time: 50 min

Equipment: 9-inch springform

pan

Ingredients:

Cake:

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour

3/4 tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

½ cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, softened

1 ½ cups sugar

15 oz whole milk ricotta cheese

2 large eggs

1 tsp almond extract

½ cup almonds, finely chopped

Topping:

¼ cup sliced almonds1 tbsp powdered sugar

For greasing pan:

1 tbsp butter, softened

1 tbsp powdered sugar

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F and place rack in the middle. Grease a 9-inch springform pan with 1 tbsp butter, then sprinkle with 1 tbsp powdered sugar, shaking out excess.

In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, and salt. Set aside.

In a large bowl, use a hand or stand mixer to cream the butter, sugar, and ricotta until light and fluffy (about 5 minutes).

Beat in eggs and almond extract for another minute.

Gradually mix in the flour mixture until just combined. Fold in the finely chopped almonds. Pour batter into the prepared pan. Bake 45–55 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool in pan 10 minutes before releasing the springform. Transfer cake to a wire rack to cool completely.

Sprinkle sliced almonds on top of the cooled cake. Dust lightly with powdered sugar using a fine-mesh sieve.■

Quick Winter Driving & Home Safety Tips

Improve Traction: If your rear-wheel-drive vehicle struggles on icy hills or fishtails around curves, add a few bags of water softener salt to the trunk to increase rear weight and traction. (Not needed for front-wheel drive, though keeping emergency salt on hand is helpful.)

Quiet Your Wipers: Clean wiper blades with soap and water, then spray the moving parts with silicone lubricant to keep them running smoothly and quietly. Reapply throughout the winter.

See Better While Driving: Wipe wiper blades with a rag soaked in glass cleaner to remove grime and improve visibility during winter storms.

Emergency Ice Fix: No scraper? A quick saltwater mix can melt thin windshield ice so you can clear it with your wipers—just use this method sparingly since salt is tough on your car.

Smart Snow Blowing: Start in the center of your driveway and blow snow toward one side, then alternate directions. This reduces chute adjustments and often eliminates a second pass.

Carbon Monoxide Safety: With furnaces, stoves, and fireplaces running overtime, winter is prime season for carbon monoxide buildup. Make sure you have a working UL-listed CO detector in your home.

Easy Salt Spreading: Make a simple sidewalk deicer shaker by poking holes in the lid of a large plastic coffee container. Fill with salt, sand, or cat litter and shake for even coverage. ■

Do I feel uplifted and nurtured, or do I feel downtrodden and less-than? I consciously gravitate towards the former in any case.

Especially in this season of family gatherings, it is valuable to remind yourself that you have options in any situation.
