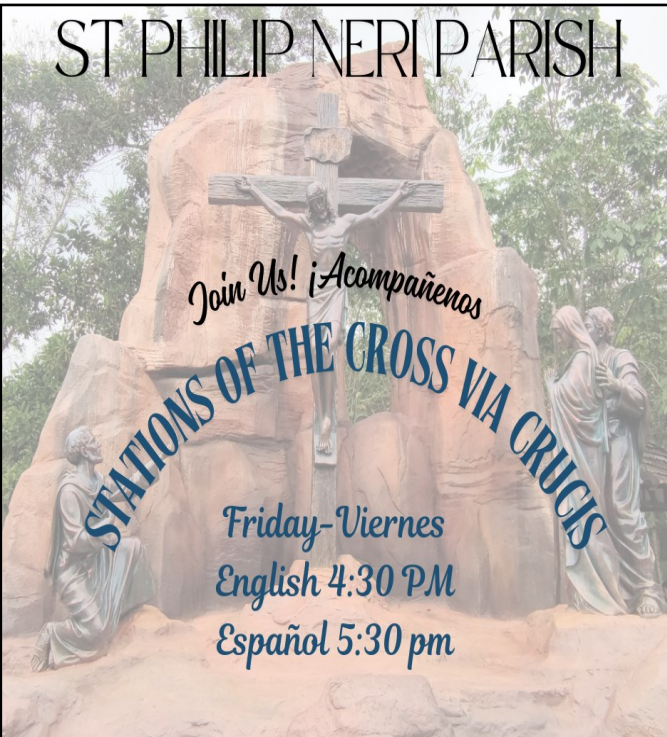

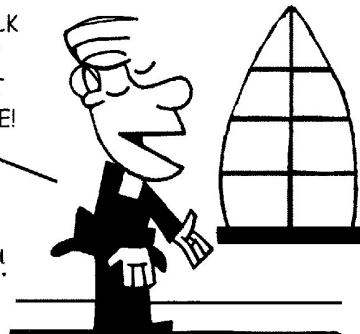

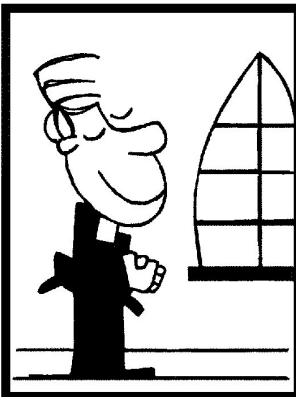

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## (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

**Mini Reflection:** It's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust when we're facing a situation that confuses or alarms us. But we all have a divine confidante that can help us sort through anything we're dealing with. Are we taking advantage of that?

### The Divine Confidante

My husband pretty much knows that if he tells me something — anything — he's also telling my sister.

Most of us have that person that we run to when we have important information. I'm not even talking about gossip; I'm talking about stuff we just have to discuss. We joke that I don't really know how I feel about something until I've run it by my sister first.

There's not really anything wrong with that. When we're trying to figure out how to think about something that has happened or how to react to a certain situation, it's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust.

But what if we ran as quickly to discuss the situation with God as we did to discuss it with our "person?" Wouldn't that be ideal?

After witnessing the transfiguration — an event that had to have been as confusing as it was astounding — we hear that the disciples "fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen."

When something profound, frightening, or confusing happens, our first confidante should be God. I'm reminded of Luke 2:19: "Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart." There is something to be said for taking a moment to keep that information sacred between ourselves and the One who can really help us confront it.

Sure, maybe we don't understand what just happened. Maybe we're scared by it. We don't really know how we feel about it. And that's totally okay. The divine confidante knows how to help us pray through that confusion, that fear.

If you're someone's "person" and they come to you wanting to talk, that's great. Talk it out. But remind them — and remind yourself — to pray about it as much as you talk about it.

Let the love of those things carry you through this Lent, and beyond.

**(PRACTICANDO) CATÓLICA: RECONOCE A DIOS EN TUS MOMENTOS ORDINARIOS**

**Mini Reflexión:** Cuando nos enfrentamos a una situación que nos confunde o nos alarma, es útil obtener la opinión de alguien en quien confiamos. Pero todos tenemos un confidente divino que puede ayudarnos a resolver cualquier cosa con la que estamos lidiando. ¿Nos estamos aprovechando de eso?

**El Divino Confidente**  
Mi esposo sabe que, si me dice algo, cualquier cosa, también se lo está diciendo a mi hermana.

La mayoría de nosotros tenemos a esa persona a la que acudimos cuando tenemos información importante. Ni siquiera estoy hablando de chismes; Estoy hablando de cosas que tenemos que discutir. Bromeamos diciendo que realmente no sé cómo me siento acerca de algo hasta que primero se lo he contado a mi hermana.

Realmente no hay nada malo en eso. Cuando estamos tratando de averiguar cómo pensar sobre algo que ha sucedido o cómo reaccionar ante una determinada situación, siempre es útil obtener la opinión de alguien en quien confiamos.

Pero ¿qué pasaría si corriéramos tan rápido a discutir la situación con Dios como lo hicimos para discutirla con nuestra "persona"? ¿No sería lo ideal?

Después de presenciar la transfiguración, un evento que tuvo que haber sido tan confuso como asombroso, escuchamos que los discípulos "se quedaron en silencio y no le contaron a nadie lo que habían visto."

Cuando sucede algo profundo, aterrador o confuso, nuestro primer confidente debe ser Dios. Esto me recuerda Lucas 2:19: "María guardaba todas estas cosas, meditándolas en su corazón." Hay algo que decir sobre tomarse un momento para mantener esa información sagrada entre nosotros y Aquel que realmente puede ayudarnos a enfrentarla.

Claro, tal vez no entendamos lo que acaba de suceder. A lo mejor nos asusta. Realmente no sabemos cómo nos sentimos al respecto. Y eso está totalmente bien. El confidente divino sabe cómo ayudarnos a orar a través de esa confusión, de ese miedo.

Si eres la "persona" de alguien y se acerca a ti queriendo hablar, eso es genial. Háblalo. Pero recuérdales, y recuérdate a ti mismo, que oren al respecto tanto como hablan de ello.
