The Chosen: Last Supper

Season 5, Episode 4:

④ The Same Coin

What stood out to you in this episode?

The beginning of this episode Jesus and the disciples are reciting the Dayenu. A song that tells the story of the Exodus that Jews were commanded to remember?

How does this apply to us?

We see Judas struggling with what he thinks of as Jesus not doing what he thinks Jesus should be doing?

How do you think this plays into his betrayal?

Women played an important part in Jesus' ministry. In their modified Dayenu, we see how Jesus' interactions with the women, and each of the women's gifts had a role to play. What are the gifts you have that you can utilize for the spreading of the Kingdom of God?

The Chosen, Season 5, Episode 4, The Women's Dayenu

In Bethany, Jesus gathers all of his female disciples for a special meal. Going around the table, he thanks each of them for how they have served him along the way: for Mary Magdalene holding a Shabbat, even when she felt ill-prepared and unworthy; for Mother Mary being long suffering and forgiving him when he stayed in the Temple when he was twelve; for Mary and Martha enduring the pain of Lazarus' death and believe he had a purpose; for Eden putting up with the sacrifices of Peter's ministry, for Tamar as a stranger in a strange land putting up with slander and showing beautiful faith; and for Joanna helping Andrew meet John in prison and supporting his ministry. As a final request, he asks them to keep their distance from him during the next few days and Passover, during which he will impart special words to the Apostles. Though the others question why this is, Mary Magdalene recognizes what's been going on, since she's been listening.

In response, the women recite a **new version of the Dayenu**, based on their experiences with Jesus:

Mother Mary: If I had only been given the joy of holding you in my arms and you had not performed signs and wonders (it would have been enough).

Mary Magdalene: If you had only performed signs and wonders and not called me by name (it would have been enough).

Eden: If you had only healed Mary of demons and not called my husband (it would have been enough).

Tamar: If you had only called Simon Peter and not healed my friend (it would have been enough).

Martha: If you had only healed Ethan and not raised my brother (it would have been enough).

Mary of Bethany: If you have only raised my brother and not defended my honor when I worshipped you (it would have been enough).

Joanna: If you had only defended Mary but not given meaning to my life that had been so unfulfilled by letting me support you and this miraculous family that I believe will change the world (it would have been enough).

The Chosen: Last Supper

Season 5, Episode 5:

Because of Me

What stood out to you in this episode?

Jesus tells them that they would eat with him in his kingdom and have thrones from which they were to judge the 12 tribes of Israel. What do you think the apostles were all thinking after being told this, after all that has happened so far this week?

They pass the fig tree Jesus cursed on their way back to Jerusalem. Jesus answers their unasked question about why he did it. Giving the example of the power of faith and the need to produce good fruit what do you think of these interpretations?

We see Pilate's wife deeply distressed by dreams including a garden, olives, and broken graves. Telling Pilate they have to leave the city? The only mention of this actually happening is in the Gospel of Matthew 27: 19. What do you think she might have been seeing in her dreams?

At the end of this episode, we see Judas approaching Caiphas, offering to betray Jesus for money. We also find out who the cloaked figure was spying for, Nicodemus. We have all heard and read about Judas' betrayal. What is it actually like to see it unfold before our eyes?

Reunions

What Characters stood out to you in this episode?

We see the institution of the Eucharist in this episode as Jesus offers His body and blood for the establishment of a new covenant.

As a Christian how does understanding the Jewish passover enrich our understanding of the Eucharist?

Nicodemus and Matthias recite various prophets whose words Jesus is fulfilling. What events are they referring to?

Caiphas asks Judas why he is doing this and Judas that he has seen to much yet not enough. How is this a challenge to trust in God even when we do not understand?

Nicodemus is quoting Isaiah 53 when he say, "He was a man of sorrows acquainted with grief". Do you think Nicodemus has any idea of what is coming for Jesus?

Bonus question: Does anyone know the importance of the name of Nicodemus' spy?

In the gospels Peter and John are told to follow a man carrying a jar (an anomaly), and follow him to the house where a large upper room is furnished and ready. In this episode, the future disciple Mark, is that man. What do you think of this?

We see flashbacks of the various apostles lives before they met Jesus? How were they led to meet Jesus? Look back and see how God has worked in your life?
