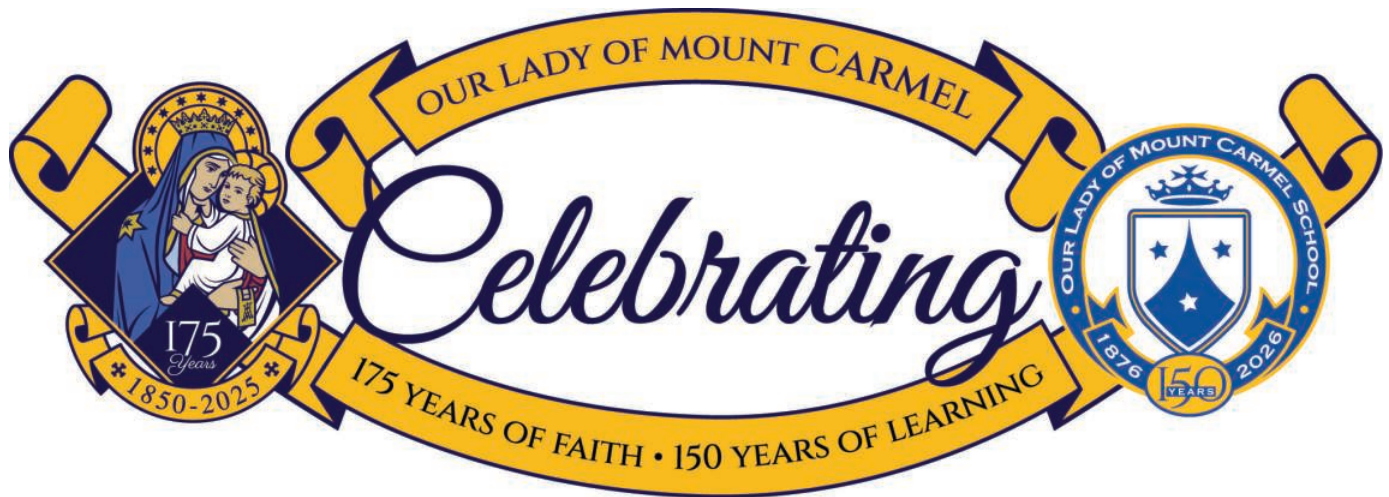




Did you ever wonder how the Bible was constructed and who put it together?

The Church – at the Council of Rome in 382 – determined the list of 73 books and letters that make up the Bible. This is known as the *canon* of Sacred Scripture. The Church, under the promised guidance of the Holy Spirit, affirmed that these books were written during the time of the Apostles and inspired by the Spirit.

The antiquity alone of the Church (i.e., the fact that it *still* exists after countless scandals and persecutions) is evidence that the promise of Christ that the “gates of hell will not prevail against it” assures us that the Holy Spirit *does* guide us.

If we consider the letters of Saint Paul it’s important to note that, in each letter, Paul was addressing some specific issue. In *Colossians* he addressed the supremacy of Christ, in *First Thessalonians* he encourages the people to persevere amid persecution, and in his letter to the *Philippians* he teaches how to suffer with joy.

The Church, in her inspired wisdom, noted the timelessness of Paul’s themes ... how they are applicable to all Christians in every age.

In our second reading at Mass this weekend we begin to listen to Paul’s *First Letter to the Corinthians*. This letter is most famous for Paul’s beautiful poetic discourse on love



(Love is patient, love is kind, ...). But the letter begins by identifying a major problem within their community: division among its members.

There are rivalries among you. Each of you is saying, “I belong to Paul,” or “I belong to Apollos,” or “I belong to Cephas,” or “I belong to Christ.” Was Paul crucified for you? Were you baptized in the name of Paul?

Paul’s solution to this division? A radical focus on Christ-centered love. He urges us to bear with the failings of the weak and to prioritize reconciliation.

Given the current cultural and political climate, Paul’s words would go a long way toward healing!

Subject: A Simple Way to Support Our Church – and Reduce Taxes

Dear Friends,

I hope you are doing well. I wanted to share a helpful planning idea that some of our OLMC members have found beneficial—Qualified Charitable Distributions, often called QCDs.

A QCD allows individuals age 70½ or older to make a gift directly from their IRA to a qualified charity, including our church. The key advantage is that the amount donated does not count as taxable income, even if you take the standard deduction. For those already taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs), a QCD can also satisfy all or part of that requirement.

Many people appreciate QCDs because they can:

- Lower taxable income
- Potentially reduce Medicare IRMAA surcharges
- Provide meaningful support to the church in a tax-efficient way

If you're already making charitable gifts—or if you're required to take RMDs—this can be a simple way to give while receiving a real tax benefit.

If you'd like more information or guidance on how a QCD works, please feel free to reach out. We're happy to help you explore whether it might be a good fit for your situation.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux



The last Wall on the right of the main walkway stands the St. Thérèse of Lisieux Wall. *The Little Flower of Jesus* was born in 1873 France. Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin was the youngest of nine children. She had a simplistic approach to the spiritual life and became a cloistered Carmelite nun at age 15. She unfortunately died young of tuberculosis.

After her death, the story of Thérèse's spiritual development was written from her epistolary essays and made her popular by showing holiness in ordinary life. In her writings she often compared herself to a simple wildflower. Her example that a life of holiness can be attained by consistent acts of love and charity has made her one of the most beloved Saints of the Church.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux, is the patron saint of florists, pilots, and priests.

If you would like a statement from the parish of your contributions/donations to use when preparing your tax return, please call the rectory office at **(215) 348-4190**.

Be prepared to give your full name, correct mailing address, and phone number. It would be helpful to have your envelope number available. Signed statements will be mailed to you within 3 weeks of your request. **Please request your statement no later than March 20, 2026.**

PLEASE NOTE: If you donate solely through Parish Giving, you will be emailed a statement from them, on our behalf for you to use for tax preparation. There would be no need to have a statement from OLMC. However, if you have made any contributions at Mass or through the mail, you should request a statement from us which would include both the Parish Giving contributions and your envelope and/or mail-in contributions.

Caring for Friends

Caring for Friends (CFF) is one of the largest food banks and most comprehensive senior meals delivery programs in the five-county Greater Philadelphia region. It provides meals and visits to individuals who are homebound.

Currently CFF provides over 40,000 meals weekly with the support of pantry and shelter partners.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel has had a longstanding relationship with Caring for Friends. Dr. Maryann Galletta, an OLMC parishioner and coordinator of CFF at OLMC, is responsible for delivering frozen meals to the main hub in Philadelphia -- thanks to all the individual cooks who provide meals prepared with care in their own homes.

Help us fill our OLMC Caring for Friends freezer by preparing meals and freezing them. Cooking for CFF is a wonderful opportunity for discipleship that does not require meetings or time outside the home.

How to help:

1. Pick up a pack of Caring for Friends trays. These trays can be found in the room to the right of the Church Narthex (main vestibule) where the bathrooms are located. The trays are in a labeled wicker basket under the Information Center.
2. Return the filled trays (one at a time or as many as you have prepared) to the black soft-sided cooler under the bulletin board in the Church Narthex. The cooler is available during all weekend Masses.

Focused Discussion: Prayer Garden Revitalization

Mike and Liz Dineen, Charlie and Janice Pollina, and Mike Andaloro all shared how the ministry's "journey" of renewing the Prayer Garden came to fruition. The goal was to refresh the garden that over the years was becoming unsafe due to unstable walkway bricks, failing lighting for the stations, along with other concerns. Several weeks were spent researching, planning and creating the desired imaging. Fundraising and determining parishioner interest in donations to fund the project were discussed and planned. A great response from parishioners resulted in an extremely successful outcome. The ministry had a very positive experience with the construction aspect of the revitalization due to the responsiveness and expertise of Clarke's Landscaping and Lawn Care, Telford, PA.

Staff/Team Updates

School-Dawn Parker: Year two of "Friendzy" is underway, a social and emotional learning program that is biblically-based and taught by the religion teachers. A different theme every month, parents receive informative letters/resources about what the students are experiencing. Once a month, upper grade students get together with their younger student "buddies." Catholic Schools Week begins Sunday, January 25, with the noon Mass. Many activities are planned: a book fair, breakfast for all students and a birthday party celebration for the school's 150th anniversary. In addition, there will be a pizza party and all-school bingo. The festivities will close on Friday with service projects in the morning.

Parish Engagement - Mary Eileen Baltes: Feedback on the communications and messaging used during the Christmas season is being requested by Mary Eileen as there were changes in some of the parish activities, including Mass times. She is very interested in any feedback.

Parish Discipleship - Mary Eileen for Christine Weyer: There will be both a men's and women's retreat during Lent, presented by Father Guckin. A presentation on Death and Dying will be offered on March 7, to include moral discussion and decisions around end of life. Funeral directors and attorneys will be present, similar to that which took place two years ago. Save the date info. coming. Father Flanagan will also discuss planning a funeral Mass.

Sara Jane McFadden: ROCKs is planning for "Hearts of Love," crafting Valentine's for nursing homes etc., an activity for both parish and school, multiple ages welcome, service hours available.

PREP: Julianne Donahue: Second graders will be making their First Reconciliation. Mini-retreat for catechists rescheduled for May 7. Catechetical formation process required of all catechists. Three who have already completed, will present the program for the others on one future evening. MLK Day to be spent at PREP office making sandwiches for donation. Father Dennis Gill, Director of the Office for Divine Worship at the Archdiocese, will be coming to St. Mary's Hall on February 6. He will speak on Sacramental Catechesis and OCIA.

Deacon William: Looking forward to presenting to the catechists in May. Considering speaking about the fundamentals of our faith and the importance of what we do "because many children are undergoing difficult things" and the pressures they are experiencing must be addressed.

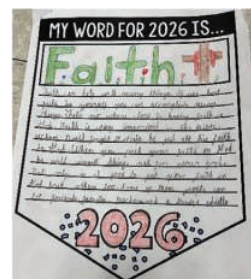
