

This weekend in our Gospel we encounter one of the most dramatic moments in the ministry of Jesus Christ: the raising of Lazarus. A man has been dead for four days. The stone is sealed. The mourners are grieving. By every human measure, the story is over.

Yet Jesus walks straight toward the tomb.

Before anything happens, we are told that Jesus weeps. It's the shortest verse in the entire Bible. The Son of God stands before the brokenness of the world—before death itself—and He is moved. This reminds us that God is not distant from our suffering. He sees our losses, our fears, our grief, and he stands with us in them.

Then Jesus gives a command: "Take away the stone."

That stone is not only on Lazarus' tomb. It represents every stone that seals us in: sin, despair, guilt, resentment, hopelessness. So often we believe the lie that our situation is final, that nothing can change, that parts of our lives are already buried.

But Jesus stands before the tomb and cries out with a loud voice: **LAZARUS, COME OUT!!**

And the dead man walks out.

Notice something extraordinary: Jesus calls



him by name. Lazarus is not just a body in a grave; he is someone known and loved. The voice of Christ reaches into the darkness and calls a person back to life.

This is not only Lazarus' story. It is our story.

Every one of us has places in our hearts that feel sealed in a tomb—habits we cannot break, wounds that will not heal, sins we think God is tired of forgiving, family problems that appear endless. Yet, Christ still stands before those tombs and calls out to us.

"COME OUT."

The voice of Christ is stronger than darkness. The voice of Christ is stronger than death. Let us listen to His voice and allow Him to bring us to life again!

St. John Paul II

Pope John Paul II was one of the most popular and influential leaders in modern times and the third longest serving Pope in history. Born

Karol Wojtyla in Poland he was the first non-Italian Pope in 455 years.

Young Karol Wojtyla saw many dark days when Germany invaded Poland during WWII. He worked as a laborer in a stone quarry and chemical plant. When his father died in 1941, he felt the calling to become a priest. Ordained in 1946, he became a Bishop in 1958 and later Cardinal in 1967. During the years of Vatican Council II, 1962-1965, he was an active participant.

He was elected pope on the third day of the October 1978 conclave.

Pope John Paul II is credited with fighting against dictatorships and helping to end communist rule in his native Poland and across Europe. He also took many trips abroad to promote understanding between religions and countries. During his long pontificate John Paul II also directed the rewritings of several major church texts.

Pope John Paul II was slowed by Parkinson's disease in the 1990's but still retained a busy schedule simply saying, "Si crollo, crollo," (If I collapse, I collapse). His papacy ended with his death on April 2, 2005. He was canonized with Pope John XXIII on April 27, 2014.

In St. Mary's Cemetery the St. John Paul II Wall is the first wall to the left as you enter the Columbarium. Come visit and pray with St. John Paul II this Spring when the flowers start to bloom.

If someone is in danger of death, call for the priest so he may administer the sacrament. But it may take awhile since there are so few of us. Please don't wait until the hour of death to arrive.

Peace and Justice Ministry – Barbara and Angela presented an overview of the ministry, which has been 30+ years in the parish and currently has a shared leadership. Catholic Social Teaching is their “guide and center” for living together in social and political situations as children of God. They work to raise awareness of the many needs of the poor and marginalized with a call to action. Peace and Justice partners with and supports local organizations that share its goals and provide volunteer opportunities aligned with Catholic Social Teaching: “that we are made to the image & likeness of God,” uplifting the life and dignity of the human person and treating them with respect, regardless of circumstances.

The four key principles of Catholic Social Teaching are:

- 2) **Option for the Poor & Vulnerable;**
- 3) **Call to Family, Community & Participation/Solidarity;**
- 4) **Care for Creation.**


