Sharing God's Grace

The Bicentennial Campaign has been an historic undertaking that owes its success to the devotion and generosity of thousands of faithful families from all across our state. We are pleased to report that over 12,000 Catholic families have made gifts to the Bicentennial Campaign since 2018, resulting in over \$62 million raised, which is 104% of our \$60 million goal. These funds enable the Catholic Community Foundation of SC's purpose and we are deeply thankful for the support provided by South Carolina Catholics.

Over 50% of the overall funds raised will be provided back to the parishes and missions to meet their critical needs. The remaining share will be

allocated and provided to the elements that will strengthen the Diocesan programs across our seven deaneries while also sustaining our growing Diocese for generations to come.

This newsletter will provide semi-annual updates to our Diocese about how the funds are being administered by the Catholic Community
Foundation of SC to the parishes, programs, schools, and endowments that will evangelize our brothers and sisters and enable us to act as the hands of feet of Christ.

Success Across the Deaneries

AIKEN

Good Shepherd Catholic Church in McCormick, SC ran a very successful Bicentennial Campaign in 2019, raising 126% of their \$220,000 goal from nearly 40% of their registered parishioners. With security upgrades for their campus at the forefront of their needs, the parish has since used their campaign funds to implement the first phase of their Facility Security Plan, which will ensure the safety of the buildings, parishioners, and staff of Good Shepherd as they gather to worship Jesus Christ.

BEAUFORT

St. Anthony Catholic Church in Ridgeland, SC is the spiritual home to multiple diverse communities in South Carolina's Lowcountry. In early 2019, the parish came together to raise over 200% of its Bicentennial Campaign target, allowing them the means to conduct repairs, modernize their campus facilities, and increase comfortability for parishioners and guests. A flourishing parish such as St. Anthony's serves as a shining example of the Bicentennial Campaign bringing a parish family together to address their church's significant needs.

CHARLESTON

The Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Charleston, SC stands as the "mother church" of the Diocese of Charleston. After being destroyed in a fire in 1861, a slow rebuild took place, but a lack of funding kept crucial design elements such as the steeple and interior paint from being finished. Numerous initiatives throughout the years have helped upkeep the church to its originally-intended state, however a major, much-needed rejuvenation project was initiated using Bicentennial Campaign funds in late 2019. Once complete, the nearly \$2,000,000 project will exhibit and emphasize the beautiful elements of the Cathedral as it was originally conceptualized.

Our first steps

Living the Gospel Through Social Outreach

Catholic Charities of South Carolina promotes self-sufficiency and strives to break the cycle of poverty in South Carolina by serving our neighbors in need. Strengthening our outreach to individuals stricken by homelessness, food insecurity, unemployment, mental illness, and inadequate access to healthcare is what led to the creation of the Outreach Program Fund. The CCFSC is pleased to provide grants to the Outreach Program Fund for the following initiatives that enable Catholic Charities to act as the Body of Christ:



Food Pantry Operations

Catholic Charities currently operates 5 food pantries statewide (Greenville, Gloverville, Hardeeville, Charleston, Conway), and has identified a pressing need for an additional location in Columbia. Since the rise of COVID-19 in March 2020, client demand has increased by 50%, and the resources of several locations were quickly depleted. The CCFSC has granted \$100,000 to complete the muchneeded Columbia facility and to ensure these crucial pantries remain stocked with food for those who have been gravely impacted by hardship.



Clean of Heart Mobile Ministry

This pilot ministry seeks to implement a nationwide best practice by taking its shower and laundry ministry to the homeless populations that are commonly on the move. Endorsed by regional pastors and local government authorities, Greenville-Spartanburg will be the launching point for this ministry that will serve the growing number of tent communities across our state. \$75,000 has been granted by the CCFSC to implement this important new initiative by Clean of Heart.

Forming Catholics to Believe in the Gospel

Catholic schools need to remain affordable, accessible, and attainable for all who value the opportunity to be educated in an academic environment that centers on a relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. The Diocese of Charleston School Modernization Project seeks to provide 28 schools across our state with modern internet infrastructure that supports each school's fully-enrolled capacity for the next 7-10 years. The CCFSC will disburse \$200,000 to this essential project that maximizes our students' access and connectivity to the internet and 21st century educational and communication platforms. The project aims to be fully-implemented in 2021.

COLUMBIA

Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Orangeburg, SC established itself as one of the earliest examples of success in the beginning of the Bicentennial Campaign. In 2018, Holy Trinity and its mission church, St. Theresa in Springfield, both exceeded over 220% of their campaign targets, and set the stage for the successes other parishes would enjoy. Since their campaigns, Holy Trinity has begun to implement a viable youth ministry, where the youth of the Orangeburg area can learn and grow in Christ. At St. Theresa, their funds have allowed for renovations to the church and parish hall to take place.

GREENVILLE

St. Augustine Catholic Church in Union, SC was the first parish to surpass 100% of its Bicentennial Campaign target in 2020. With under 40 registered families, St. Augustine carried the successful momentum that many other smaller parishes have experienced since 2018. As funds begin to be returned to St. Augustine, the parish intends to maintain a "rainy day" fund to allow for a quick response to any emergency maintenance situation.

MYRTLE BEACH

Precious Blood of Christ in Pawley's Island, SC had a robust list of needs they hoped to address through the Bicentennial Campaign. Recognizing that more than half of the raised funds would be returned to Precious Blood if 125% of their target was achieved, the parish executed an overwhelmingly successful campaign, and raised over \$1,000,000. This achievement allows the parish to take the initial steps in adding new storage space for their parish outreach kitchen, as well as other campus improvements.

ROCK HILL

St. Catherine of Siena Catholic Church in Lancaster, SC has begun the process of bringing in architects to address the various church renovations the parish would like to conduct. With a Bicentennial Target of \$130,000, the parish was motivated to exceed this figure to ensure more funds would come back for these renovations. In late 2019, St. Catherine completed their campaign with 120% raised and the excitement of their future projects becoming reality.
