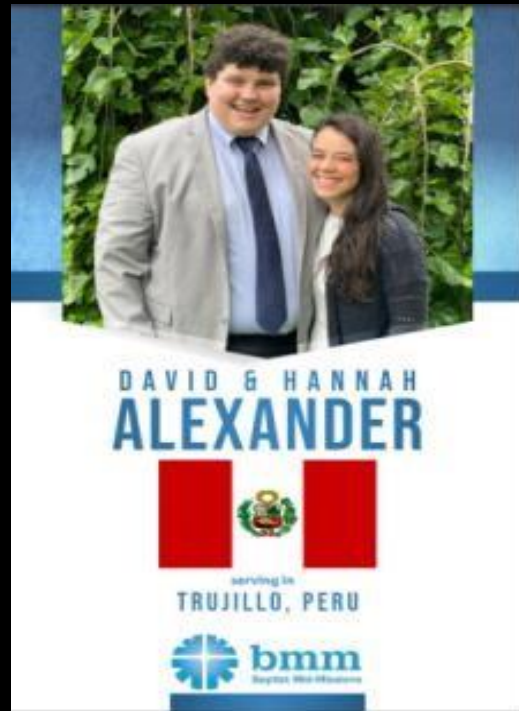


Alexanders to Peru

Greetings from the land of moose and lobster, Maine! July has been a month packed full of travel and blessings.

We started off in Indianapolis, providing music for a partnering church. Early July always includes some patriotic music, which is different from our usual song choices.

The second week of July was our much anticipated Family Conference with BMM- a week of fellowship, preaching, and workshops targeted at encouraging and refreshing missionaries. We were very blessed to be able to attend and reconnect with some of our Peru co-laborers, as well as others on deputation and many people who have done the things we're doing and understand the unique challenges and joys. We came away encouraged and ready for several weeks of travel and ministry.

The third week of July saw us heading up to Maine to present in a church there. They were as much a blessing to us as we hope we were to them.

This last week of July, we headed down into upstate New York to present at a bilingual church. This is an opportunity we enjoy, but one that makes us nervous. We have headed back up to Maine for this week, before heading to see family and meet a new pastor of a supporting church in the coming weeks.

We are praising God for many things we've been praying about. We are continually praying for Sebastian, our van, as he carries us along. The week of Family Conference, the brakes went out, and we had to replace all 4 calipers, rotors, and pads. It was quite an expense, but God's timing, as always, was perfect- it happened while surrounded by friends and people who could help, and it happened right before our long drive up north, and not during. God is good even in our troubles!

We have crossed to 28% of our needed support! We praise God for new partners, both in prayer and in financial support.

We were able to empty our storage unit! That is an expense eliminated. Now it's just a matter of whittling down our accumulated stuff.

Hannah's foot is healing just fine. All the long drives have been good rest.

We would ask prayer for a few things: We are on the road for a couple more weeks. Please pray for safety as we drive.

The fall is the "busy season" for missionaries, with many missions conferences scheduled. Pray that our calendar will be full, as always, but also that we'll have the endurance to manage this time.
