Jewellery Policy

At Little Footsteps we prohibit and discourage all children from wearing jewellery, including earrings, necklaces, and bracelets.

Any jewellery that is chosen to be worn, must pose no risk, such as removing dangling items. We prioritise health and safety and are vigilant in ensuring that all risks to children are recognised and reduced. Please note jewellery poses a risk choking, strangulation, accident and injury during play, as well as loss of possession.

Safety Hazards: Jewellery can get caught during climbing or running, leading to injury to the child or others.

Choking Risks: Small items, such as beads or broken pieces, pose a significant choking hazard.

Alternatives: If earrings are essential (e.g., for religious reasons), small, smooth stud earrings are the only allowed exception.

Procedure: If a child arrives with jewellery, staff may ask parents to remove it, or in some cases, remove it themselves and store it safely until pickup.

Responsibility: Little Footsteps for not take responsibility for lost, stolen, or damaged personal property.
