ARE YOU TALKING TO ME?

Last summer I was at the National Eucharistic Congress when Fr. Mike Schmitz delivered an impassioned call to repentance in his keynote address during an evening revival session. The crowd received his message with great enthusiasm. Their applause and the cheers shook the Lucas Oil Stadium.

The next night, Sr. Josephine Garrett took the stage and, in her address, got into the nittygritty of what it means to be a disciple, what it means to live repentance — or, as she so beautifully put it, to embrace the hunger.

And in doing so, she called back to the previous night's thunderous approval of Fr. Mike's message.

"When I heard you clapping when Father said we need repentance, I was worried you thought he was talking about your neighbor's repentance, she said. "He is not."

In other words: he's talking about your repentance.

Answer to this week's Trivia question:

- A. The list of seven deadly sins, as we have it now, seems to have been more or less finalized by Pope Gregory I around 590. He gave them as lust, gluttony, avarice (greed), sloth, anger (wrath) envy and pride. This is the order in which they are repeated in Dante's Divine Comedy, though the Catechism of the Catholic Church lists them in this order: pride, avarice, envy, wrath, lust, gluttony, and sloth Each of these sins has a corresponding and contrary virtue that, if cultivated, will help to keep one from committing the in. The contrary virtue to gluttony is temperance, so answer a is not the right answer to the question.
- B. Wrath (also called anger) has as its contrary virtue patience, not kindness, though kindness in some ways seems to be appropriate too. It's hard to be angry toward someone to whom you're being kind. Nevertheless, the correct contrary virtue to wrath is patience, so this pairing is incorrect, which makes this the right answer.
- C. Charity indeed is the contrary virtue to avarice (greed).
- D. Diligence is the contrary virtue to sloth.
- E. Answer b is correct.


