

Be Ready for God to Stop By

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't.

For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by." They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case an-

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things.

Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready.





DEACON HAROLD BURKE-SIVERS

Deacon Burke-Sivers, known around the world as the "dynamic deacon," is one of the most soughtafter speakers in the Church today.

He is a powerful, passionate evangelist and preacher whose no-nonsense approach to living and proclaiming the Catholic faith is sure to challenge and inspire those who hear him.

He travels across the United States and around the world speaking at conferences, workshops, retreats, parish missions, high schools, and young adult events to people of all ages and from all walks of life who desire to know Jesus intimately and enjoy a deeper personal relationship with him.

His areas of expertise include marriage and family life; discerning the will of God; the sacraments; vocational choices and how they are lived out; male spirituality; pro-life issues; evangelization; prayer; and many others.

Deacon Burke-Stivers has a bachelor of arts degree in economics and business administration from the University of Notre Dame and a master of theological studies degree from the University of Dallas.

He co-hosts a weekly broadcast, Living Stones, every Monday on Mater Dei Radio, and has appeared as a guest on many other national and international radio programs, including Catholic Answers Live and Vocation Boom Radio. In addition, he is the host or co-host of several popular series on EWTN television, including Made in His Image: Family Life Today; Priests and Deacons: Ministers of Mercy; and Grace Filled Living.

He also is the author of the bestselling book Behold the Man: A Catholic Vision of Male Spirituality, published by Ignatius Press.

Retaining a deep love of Benedictine spirituality that he gained during his time discerning a call to that religious community, he is a Benedictine Oblate of Mount Angel Abbey in Oregon.

He is also a member of the Fellowship of Catholic Scholars and the Confraternity of Catholic Clergy.

He and his wife, Colleen, have four children. They live in Portland, Oregon, where Deacon Burke-Sivers is assigned to Immaculate Heart Church.

Answer to this week's Trivia question:

- C. This is the correct answer: to get to heaven, you must die with sanctifying grace in your soul. If you die without accepting that grace you go to hell. If you die in the state of sanctifying grace with some attachment to sin, you go to purgatory first, to rid yourself of that attachment. After that, you head for heaven.
- D. Frequent confession is meritorious. The sacrament of confession returns sanctifying grace to the soul. It is that grace that is needed for salvation, not the participation in the sacrament.

MARY MAGDALENE

Question:

July 22 is the feast of Mary Magdalene. I've heard a lot of stories about her, but who was she really?

Answer:

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2. She is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession. Whatever her life looked like before she met Jesus, it wasn't good! Because of this association with being a repentant sinner, Mary Magdalene has been associated with other similar stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the resurrection. She is one of the women who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing his body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the resurrection! While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, and intimate love for Christ.
