SOME SAY

At first, the Apostles try to dodge the question.

"You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." - Mt 16:18-19

When Jesus confronts them — and make no mistake, it is a confrontation — with the question "Who do you say that I am?" they act like a man whose wife has just asked him if she looks fat in these jeans.



The evasiveness of their answer puts politicians to shame: "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

Some say.

But Jesus doesn't let them off easy. He repeats himself. He wants an answer. "Who do you say that I am?"

They all know the answer. They all believe the answer. And they all know the answer could get them thrown in prison or killed. Only Peter is brave enough to say it: "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God."

People have a lot of opinions about God. They always have. They have a lot of opinions about Jesus and the Bible, about the

Catholic Church and the Pope. Some of these opinions are well-founded, well-researched. Some of them are based in ignorance. Many are born of painful misunderstandings. But they are all just that: opinions.

Some say.

We know who Jesus is. We know who the Eucharist is. We know what the truth is. Amid the chaos and the violence and the excruciating *loudness* of this fallen world and all the words it shouts into the void about God and Jesus and right and wrong, *we know*.

But will we answer?

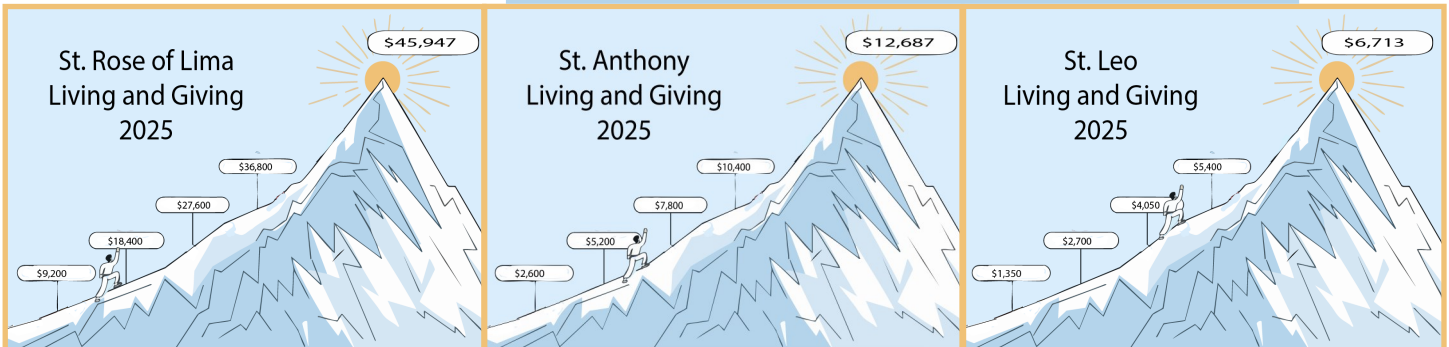

Devotions, Explained!

PILGRIMAGE

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to "a high mountain by themselves," indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints. Some of the most iconic pilgrimage destinations include Fatima, Lourdes, and the Santiago de Compostela in Spain. ©LPi



JUNE 25 | THE POWER OF PILGRIMAGE

Saint William of Vercelli

A.D. 1085–1142

Life is a pilgrimage, but sometimes you need a pilgrimage to discover life.

William gets his name from the Italian city he was born in: Vercelli. His parents died when he was only 14 years old, and with the special intention of mourning their loss, William set out on a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela—commonly called "The Camino." It was a journey that would profoundly change the course of his life.

With every day that passed, William stepped into a deeper relationship with God. As he traversed through the mountains and rugged landscapes, his spirit was shaped by the trials and blessings he encountered on the road.

By the time he returned, William was a different man. The things he wanted out of life had completely changed. William sought solitude and natural beauty, choosing the remote mountains of southern Italy to be his new home as a hermit. Here, his pilgrimage continued, but it was not across lands that he traveled—it was deeper and deeper into his own soul.

Saint William of Vercelli went on to found a new religious order and become the spiritual counselor to kings and popes. And it all began with his pilgrimage on the Camino.

What pilgrimage—physical or spiritual—is God inviting you to make at this time in your life? Will you embrace the sacred journey?

SAINT PETER

1. St. Peter's name was originally Simon and he was a fisherman of Galilee.

2. He was one of the 12 apostles. His brother, Andrew, introduced him to Jesus.

3. St. Peter struggled with doubt and human weakness, yet Jesus still chose him!

4. St. Peter was the first Pope. The Catholic Church can trace the succession of every pope back to St. Peter!

5. The Acts of the Apostles illustrate his role as Church's head—the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

6. He died by crucifixion. Tradition says he requested an upside-down crucifixion because he considered himself unworthy to die the way Jesus did.

St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

THE CONVERSION OF PAUL

SAINT PAUL

1. Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem.

2. He underwent a huge conversion on his way to persecute Christians in Damascus. He instead went on to be baptized there and dedicated his life to spreading the Gospel.

3. St. Paul was imprisoned and beheaded under Emperor Nero.

4. His letters are in the New Testament. These writings shed light on the faith of the early Church.

5. He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

6. St. Paul is the patron saint of missionaries and evangelists!



Before his Conversion:

Saul was a devout Jew, deeply committed to the Jewish faith and known for his persecution of Christians.

The Encounter on the Road to Damascus:

As he was traveling to Damascus with the intention of arresting Christians, Saul was struck by a sudden, blinding light and heard Jesus' voice asking, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?"

Saul's Blindness and Obedience:

Saul was blinded by the light and had to be led into Damascus. He fasted and prayed for three days while he waited for instructions.

Ananias of Damascus and Restoration of Sight:

A disciple named Ananias, directed by the Lord, went to Saul and laid his hands on him, restoring his sight.

Baptism and New Life:

Saul was baptized and began to preach Jesus to the Gentiles.

Impact and Aftermath:

Paul's conversion marked a turning point in early Christianity. He went on to become a major missionary and writer, significantly shaping Christian theology and spreading the gospel.

Different Accounts:

While the Acts of the Apostles provides a detailed account, Paul also mentions his conversion in his epistles, often highlighting the transformative power of God's grace.
