

How Much Is Enough?

During a conversation about good stewardship of money and time, my daughter shared that sometimes doing the best thing was so hard for her to do. It wasn't always a matter of right and wrong, black and white, but a matter of better and best. I began to reflect on the truth of her statement. When confronted with a decision, we can sometimes be given a choice of good, better, and best. We fool ourselves into believing that the good choice is not a bad one, so it must be enough. However, we have essentially placed a limit on our generosity or commitment with our false sense of good stewardship.

Jesus calls us in different ways every day. Sometimes the cost to us is clear. Yet sometimes there is no clear metric. When called to love, how much love is enough? When someone needs our time, how many hours is enough? When a small gift will bring about a positive outcome, what could a larger gift accomplish?

Don't be fooled by Jesus' teaching of the mustard seed. He was speaking to those who were caught up in concerns of status, uncertainty of heart, and lack of true faith. Jesus taught

with parables and then demonstrated true faith and generosity by his crucifixion. Perhaps the mustard seed of faith allows us to move mountains and trees so that we may see through to the horizon of the cross. In the cross, we find the real metric of love and generosity that is for all who follow Him.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Question:

Who invented the Stations of the Cross?

Answer:

The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus.

This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations and some churches present Passion plays or Living Stations. But anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us.

- † Realizing Your Life Is Not About You



FIVE SAINTS TO PRAY TO IF YOU ARE FEELING LONELY

Despite being seemingly "connected" to hundreds of people at any given moment through our phones and social media, we live in an age of unprecedented loneliness.

Especially as the days begin to shorten and darken, we can all start to feel a bit lonely. However, just because you're lonely doesn't mean you have to be alone! Many saints experienced profound loneliness and they want to be your friends and guides during this difficult season.

St. Rita of Cascia – Known as the "Saint of the Impossible," St. Rita endured a difficult marriage and the loss of her children, yet found solace in her deep relationship with God. She's a powerful intercessor for those feeling abandoned or in impossible situations.

St. Dymphna – St. Dymphna is the patron saint of mental health and her life speaks to those suffering from emotional and psychological distress, including loneliness. She encourages turning to Christ for inner peace.

St. Benedict Joseph Labre – St. Benedict lived a life of extreme poverty and isolation, wandering the streets as a pilgrim. Though people passing by would hardly look at him, St. Benedict found his true home in God. If you are feeling like an outcast in this season, St. Benedict Joseph Labre will offer you comfort, understanding, and intercession.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton – After the death of her husband and separation from many friends, St. Elizabeth faced loneliness as a widow and single mother. She converted to Catholicism and found her strength in God, eventually founding the Sisters of Charity. St. Elizabeth's example can show you how God wants to use your pain and loneliness to bring you consolation in Him.

St. John of the Cross – A mystic and Doctor of the Church, St. John of the Cross wrote extensively about the "dark night of the soul," a time of deep spiritual desolation and loneliness. His writings and intercession will show you how to unite your own isolation and loneliness with Christ Crucified and find deeper union with our loving Father.

Loneliness is difficult. God created us for community, so the experience of feeling alone is painful, but that doesn't mean you can't find goodness and strength in your struggle!




