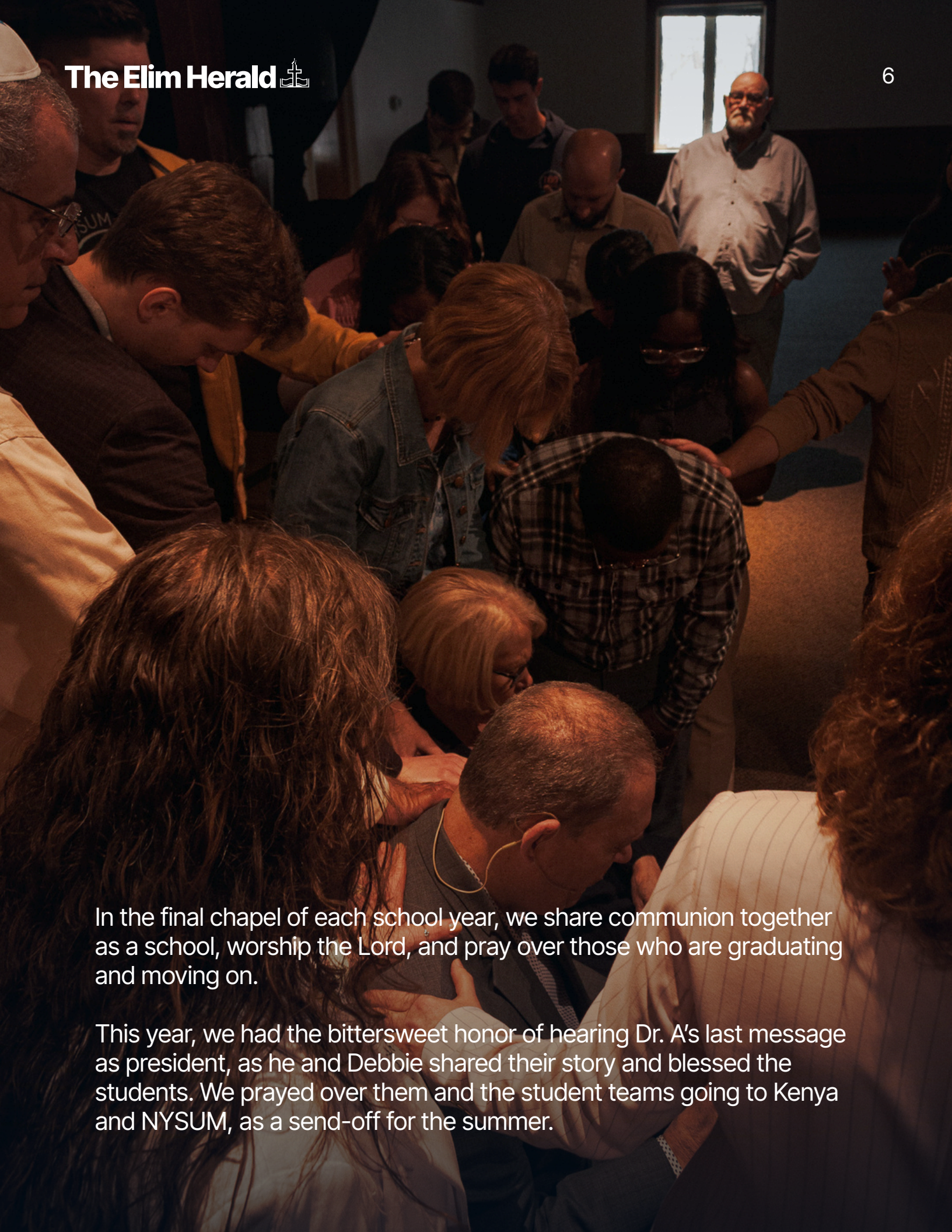

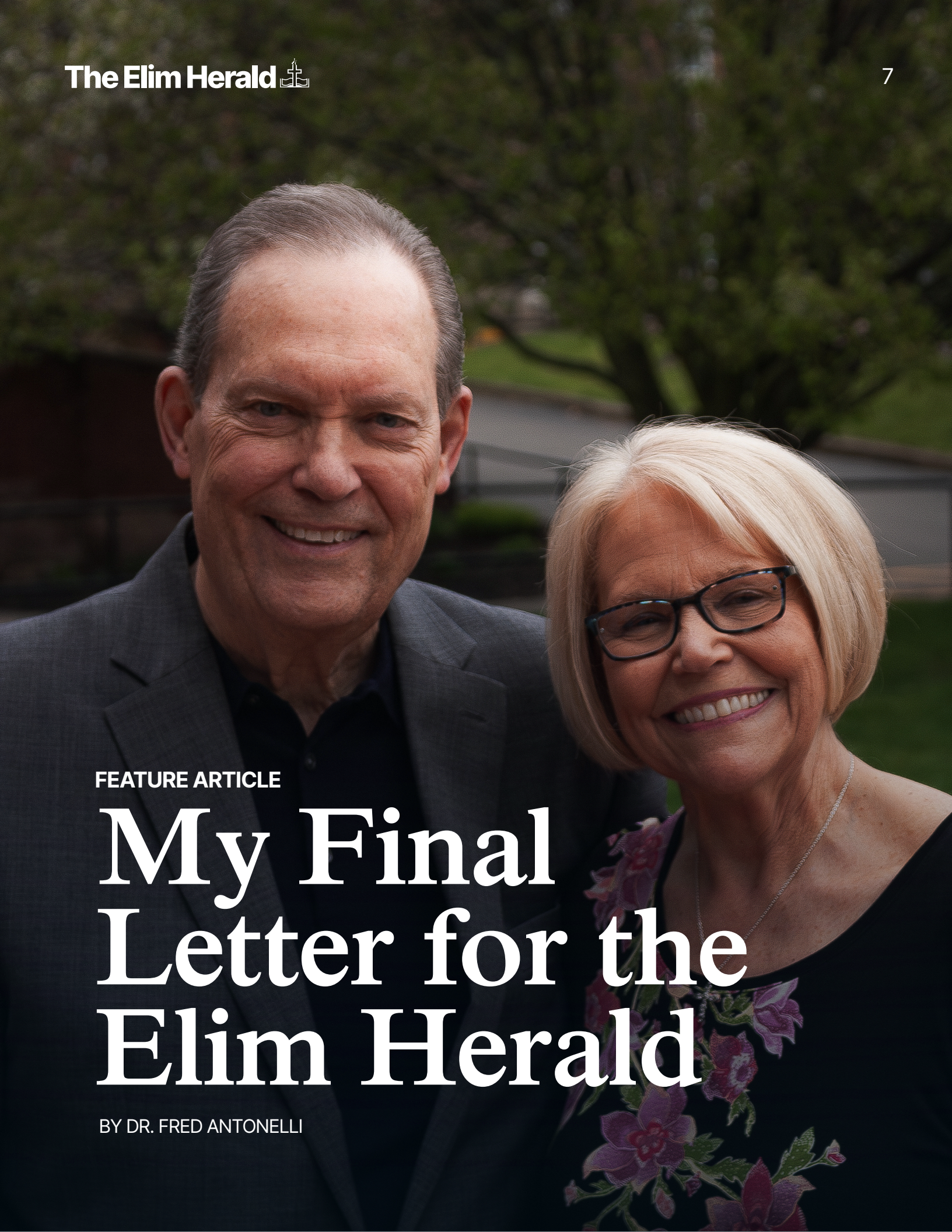
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Fall Term Ends

# My Final Letter for the Elim Herald

In 2011, while I was teaching a counseling course at Elim, I felt a strong desire to visit the Lima cemetery. Many former missionaries, pastors, and teachers are buried there. I found myself especially drawn to the graves of Elim's founders, Ivan Q. and Minnie Spencer.

As I stood there and prayed for Elim, I sensed the Lord speaking to my heart: "I am going to use you to raise \$5 million to help the school." I was overwhelmed with emotion and thought to myself, how could I ever do such a thing? Then I felt the Lord gently say, "Only believe, and you will witness My miracle power to provide for Elim." Indeed, though I couldn't imagine it at the time, by God's grace, we would come to see several million dollars raised for the school. I felt distinctly that my mission was to "set Elim free" financially so as to be unwavering for His glory in these last days.

*"For with God nothing will be impossible."*

**Luke 1:37**

I later shared that experience with President Mike Cavanaugh. We prayed and afterward I returned home to Easton, Maryland, where I founded and directed Life Counseling Center.

Sometime later, I was asked to serve on the Board of Trustees of EBIC. After a couple of years, God spoke to Mike that it was time to pass the baton to another president. My good friend and fellow board member, Joe Nettleton, asked if I would consider becoming the next president. After much prayer, Debbie and I both sensed that this was God's will for our lives, and the BOT confirmed this by unanimously voting "yes." We sold our counseling practice and our home and moved here to Lima on May 29, 2020—right in the beginning of the COVID-19 epidemic.

These past six years have been both challenging and deeply rewarding. We have seen God move in miraculous ways, physically, emotionally, financially and biblically. We have also watched students be transformed and their lives changed forever. We have also seen several students meet their spouses here, in keeping with the classic Elim joke, "ring by spring or your money back!" Along the way, we have made lifelong friends and reconnected with old ones.

Jesus has provided in ways we could never have imagined! Were there goals and prayers I had hoped would come to fruition? Yes. But it seems that God now has other plans for Debbie and me. He is calling us back to our home in Maryland, where we will spend more time with family and friends. I will semi-retire and return to part-time Christian clinical counseling.




We love Elim. We have loved Elim since the very first day we stepped onto this campus in 1972 for a summer camp meeting. We sensed the presence of God here then, and we still sense His presence here today. Though we are living in a different time and culture, we're confident knowing that the Lord has great expectations for Elim!

Dr. Danuta Case was placed in the role of President of Elim Bible College at our graduation service on Saturday, May 16<sup>th</sup>. She and her husband, Tim, have been with Elim for over forty years, and she has served for the past 14 years as our Vice President, then Executive Vice President and Provost. I believe she is a perfect fit for the next three years of building up enrollment for our residential students. My prayers and best wishes to Dr. Case as she begins her new job here as President of EBC!

It has been a privilege to serve as the eighth President of this great Bible college, and I know my wife feels the same. Elim will continue its mission of preparing Christ-centered, Spirit-empowered servant leaders for global ministry and worldwide revival. Debbie and I have been honored to play a small part in that story. Thank you, Jesus, and thank you, Elim. We love you!

# New Initiatives for 2026-27

I am deeply moved as I remember the faithfulness of God to Elim Bible College, to me personally, and to my family. I stand amazed by His goodness and provision. Not only did God inspire Ivan Q. Spencer, once a farm boy from northern Pennsylvania, to establish Elim Bible Institute, but against all odds, God has sustained this school for 102 years. Throughout Elim's history, God has called ordinary people to receive training here, and He has equipped them to do extraordinary things for His Kingdom.

He continues to do the same at Elim Bible College today. He called me, a little shepherd girl from a remote area of Poland; He opened a door for me to come to Elim as an international student while Poland was still under communism; and 40 years later, He has opened the door for me to lead this college - again, against all odds.

It was a great joy to combine the installation service with the 2026 graduation ceremony, where we were once again able to celebrate not just their achievements, but most of all the transformation that took place in the lives of our graduates during their time at Elim Bible College.

I am humbled to stand on the shoulders of the many leaders and presidents who faithfully served this school and the Kingdom of God before me. Their sacrifice, vision, and steadfast commitment helped shape Elim into what it is today, and I will do my best to continue what they so faithfully began. At times, I feel much like Gideon, chosen to do what seemed impossible—not because he was extraordinary, but because God desired to reveal His glory through him. In the same way, I recognize my complete dependence upon the Lord and His strength. As Romans 8:31 states:

**“What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?”**

I feel greatly honored to lead and to support a great team of faithful servants who currently serve as staff and faculty at Elim Bible College. Elim is not merely a college. It is a people called by God, committed to obey Him, and united by one mission: to raise more Christ-centered laborers who are ready to reap His harvest in the eleventh hour. It is a privilege to be part of this group. I hope you will join us through prayer, service, and support, and together we can boldly say:

***We are Elim!***

Let me share with you a few new initiatives that we would like to focus on in the near future:

## **1. The Triple Impact Match**

Elim’s mission is to raise up Christ-centered, Spirit-empowered servant leaders for *global* ministry and *worldwide* revival. Please notice the emphasis on “global” and “worldwide!” While sending missionaries to other countries remains vitally important, bringing international students with God’s call on their lives to Elim, training them, and releasing them back to their own nations can have an even greater impact. They already know the culture, speak the language, and can reach their own people more effectively and more quickly. However, most cannot afford to come to the United States to study. As a former international student who could not even afford her own plane ticket, I understand their predicament deeply. It is one of my great passions to help such students. **Will you join me?**

We are seeking partners who will match both the student's contribution and Elim's contribution:

- The student pays \$5,000.
- EBC provides \$5,000 in financial aid.
- A partner—whether a church or individual donor—gives \$5,000.

The student will also work 10 hours per week on campus, when school is in session, to help cover the remaining cost. Together, these commitments will cover the full cost of tuition, fees, housing, and meals for an entire academic year.

## 2. Full tuition scholarship for pastors' children

Pastors often sacrifice greatly as they faithfully pour into the lives of others. Now, we want to pour back into pastors' families. If you serve as a full-time pastor, we honor you and the ministry you are doing. Thank you!

We would like to bless you and your children as they transition from youth into adulthood, and Elim Bible College may be the training ground God uses to prepare them for what He has ahead. This opportunity will be limited to **10 incoming full-time residential students** per year and will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis as students are admitted to the College. ## 3. Local Church Cohort Scholarship

We want our students to minister in your church and gain practical experience while they study. Why not take advantage of Elim Bible College's distance education model? With **five or more** students, your church can create a local cohort. Students would enroll in distance education courses through Elim Bible College while participating in student ministry opportunities within your church. We want them to gather for a chapel during the week and create a support group for each other, for the pastor, and for the church. Each student within the cohort will receive a **20% tuition discount**, and the cohort facilitator will get a **50% tuition discount**. For more info, contact our admissions staff.

## 4. Bridging church ministry training with EBC degree programs

Do you train leaders in your church? Do you have a training curriculum that some of your congregants follow? Why not consider helping them receive academic credit for prior learning acquired through your local church training center or ministry leadership program? We would love to partner with you and help your students receive **formal recognition for the training they have already completed**, while enabling them to continue toward either an associate or bachelor's degree.

If you are interested, please let me know! We would be glad to explore the possibility of creating an **articulation agreement**.

## 5. Preparing a Bachelor of Science in Psychology

As you most likely know, we currently offer several certificate programs and the following degree programs:

- AAS in Biblical and Theological Studies
- AAS in Business Administration
- BS in Theology
- BS in Business Management

In response to the overwhelming mental health needs in our society, we are seeking to offer a Psychology program in which every psychology course is closely aligned with biblical teaching. Psychology shaped primarily by humanism, centered on self-interest, and placing the human ego at the center can be harmful and may even exacerbate the very problems it seeks to address. However, a better understanding of how the brain works, how family systems impact us, and how human behavior is shaped—when woven together with the redemptive work of Christ and aligned with biblical truth—can be deeply freeing and can bring much-needed healing to many.

For this reason, we are working on offering a Bachelor of Science in Psychology. Students enrolled in the Psychology program will be required to complete a minor in Biblical Studies, ensuring that they receive a **solid biblical foundation** alongside their psychology coursework. Students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science in Theology may also choose to minor in Psychology or Business Management, broadening their skills and equipping them to minister more effectively to diverse people groups. The program has already been approved by our accrediting organization, and we are currently awaiting approval from NYSED.

I am excited to see what the Lord will do at Elim in the near future. In the past, some expressed concern that, after becoming accredited, spiritual formation might no longer remain a priority at Elim. As the new president, I want to assure you that spiritual formation will always continue to be at the heart of who we are and what we do, because we are, first and foremost, a Christian college. At the same time, being a college also means that we must uphold strong academic standards and provide quality education to our students. We believe these two priorities—spiritual formation and academic excellence—can and should work together.

For those who prefer a pathway in the trades, we also offer a vocational certificate program that includes a hands-on, **six-month paid internship** experience! If you would like more information, please contact Admissions.

May the Lord grant each of us the grace to faithfully fulfill the calling He has placed on our lives, and may His name be glorified in all that we do.

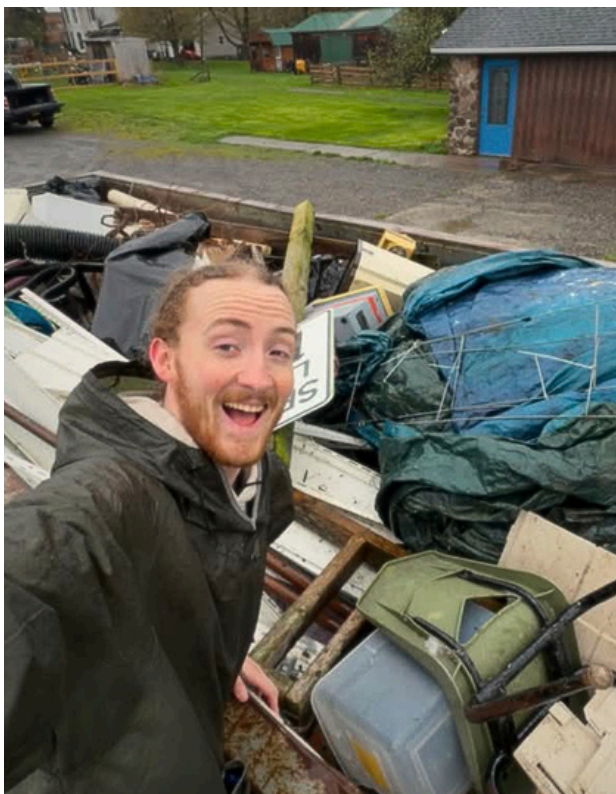

*It was an honor to serve closely with Robin for the past fifteen years. He was a co-laborer, a confidante, and a friend. Paul Johansson summed up Robin's life in classic style, noting, "Robin was the real deal...missions were in his blood!"*

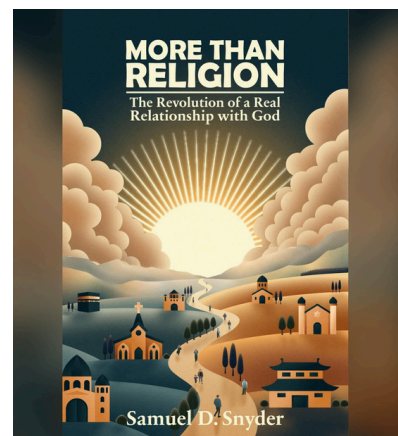


## Sam Snyder

The contrast in this book emerged from a breakthrough in my relationship with God 10 years ago when I realized that I was religious even though I used "relationship with God" language. 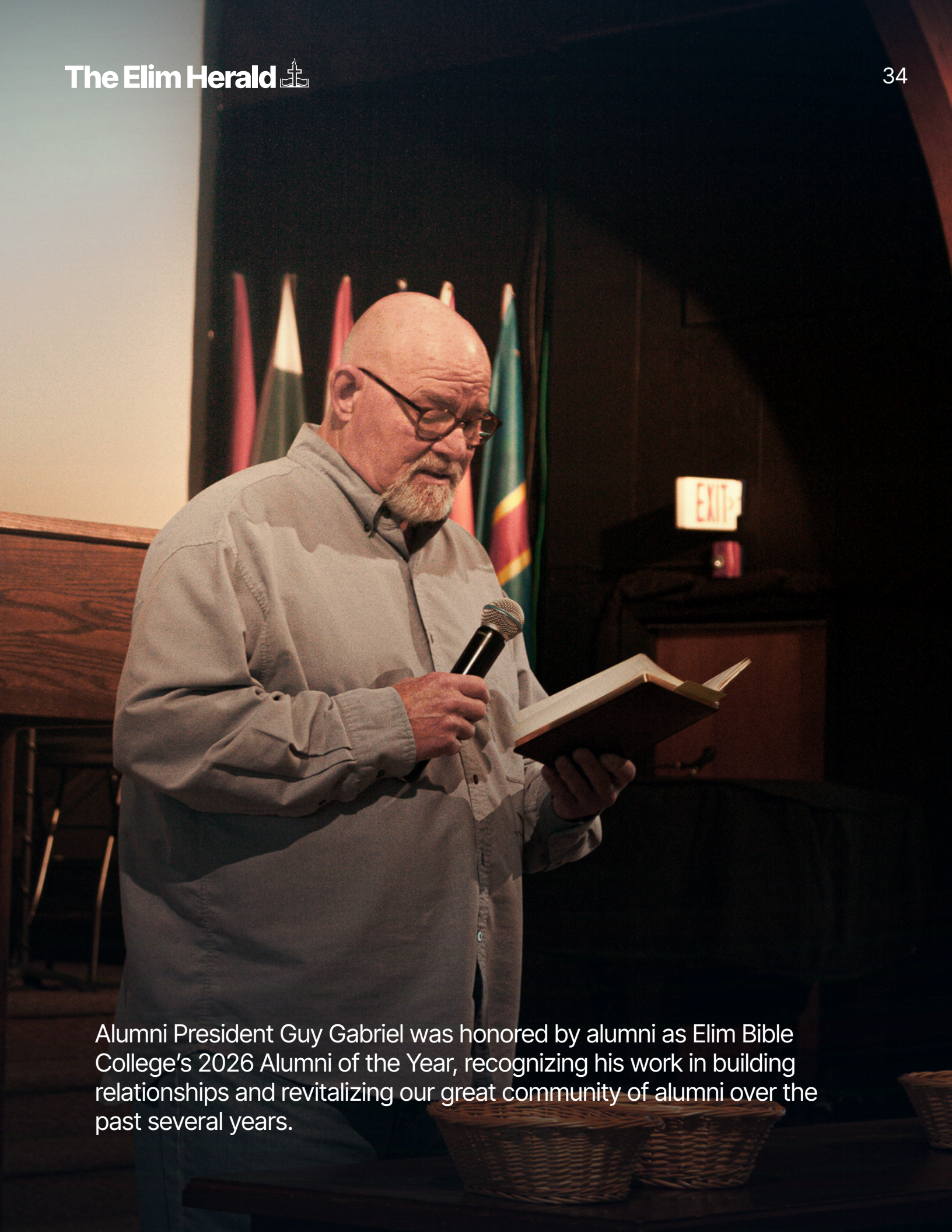
