Dear Friends,

With an enduring education mission at the Kalmar Nyckel Foundation, we continue to grow as both a cultural destination and an educational resource in Delaware. Thanks to your generous philanthropic support and community partnerships, our remarkable hands-on learning experiences on ship and shore are accessible to underserved youth across the region and visitors from far and wide.

In fiscal year 2024, we reached more than 33,000 students of all ages with our innovative educational programs: on field trips, in classrooms, through community events, public sails, volunteer training, and private programs on *Kalmar Nyckel* and the Copeland Maritime Center museum and campus.

- **MARITIME HERITAGE:** We hosted over 13,000 people aboard the Tall Ship of Delaware in Wilmington, Historic New Castle, and ports from Virginia to New England.
- **LEARNING:** More than 12,700 children and adults participated in our school field trips, classroom and community outreach programs. We offered free field trips and classroom programs to all K-12 Delaware public school students thanks to generous donors and sponsors.
- **COMMUNITY:** 7,200 children and adults visited our campus and our signature community events in Wilmington: Underground Railroad History Day, LEGO Shipbuilding Day, Captain Kidd's Pirate Day, and Halloween Ghost Ship.
- **VOLUNTEERS:** Our volunteer program includes 250+ devoted friends who give their time to sail and maintain our ship, deliver education programs and events, and support our growth.
- **MARITIME OUTDOOR EDUCATION COURSE:** We built and designed new team-building, leadership, and problem-solving group challenge programs for youth and adults thanks to generous support from Crystal Trust and The Laffey-McHugh Foundation.
- **NEW EXHIBIT:** We introduced a new *Join The Crew!* exhibit and a new audio tour at the Copeland Maritime Center.

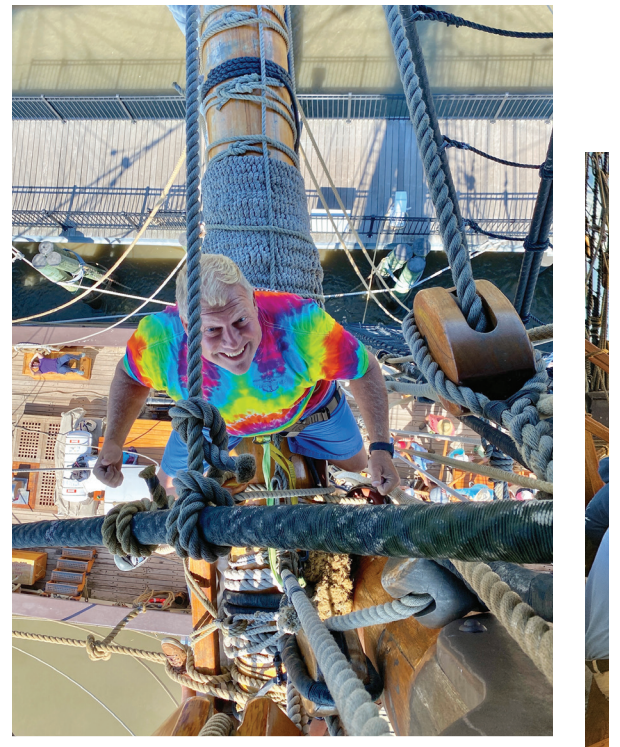

Arkadi Kuhlmann: Connecting Community and Heritage

An early supporter of the Kalmar Nyckel Foundation and its innovative education programs for school children, Arkadi Kuhlmann is a business leader, philosopher, and educator who wants to make a difference. The former CEO of both ING Direct Canada and ING Direct USA, he is best known as a banker.

In April 2022, Kuhlmann funded a new permanent exhibit for the Tatiana and Gerret Copeland Maritime Center. It began with commissioning an oil painting by award-winning marine artist Patrick O'Brien – to depict the Battle of Buchan Ness when the original *Kalmar Nyckel* was sunk protecting the Dutch herring fleet in 1652. This magnificent piece was also recreated as a wall-sized light box for all to enjoy in KNF's Main Deck Room.

"Developing cultural and historical programs that connect the community to our heritage will impact today and tomorrow in immeasurable ways," notes Kuhlmann. "I am ecstatic

about the opportunity to participate in the culmination of so much work and bring it to the public, and especially our community in Wilmington."

Kuhlmann's most recent philanthropic gift is helping create another beautiful permanent educational exhibit. "The Key's Maiden Voyage" will be a newly-commissioned painting and light box about *Kalmar Nyckel's* first chapter as a Dutch-built ship. It will be installed on the south wall opposite the *Battle of Buchan Ness*. "Having a supporter with the imagination and vision of Arkadi Kuhlmann has been inspirational," says Sam Heed, KNF's Senior Historian, who is developing the project.

We extend our gratitude to Arkadi Kuhlmann – a faithful believer in the mission and vision of the Kalmar Nyckel Foundation.





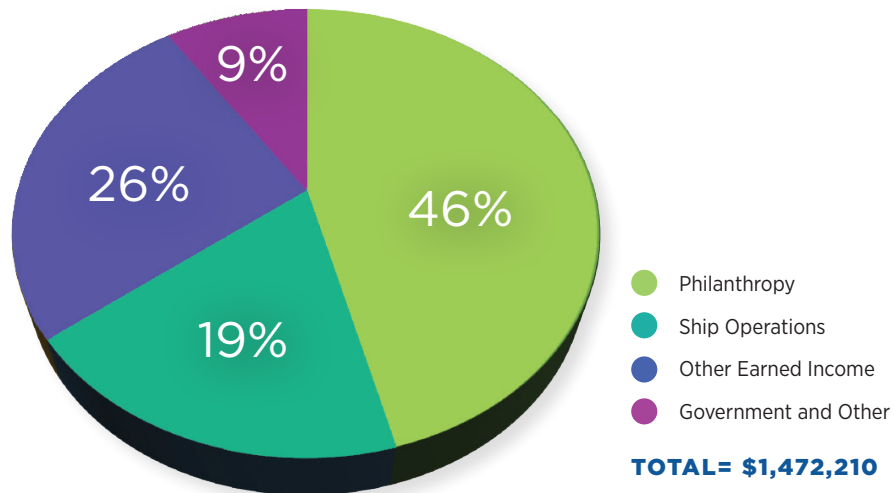
Fiscal Year 2024 Financials

KNF operated with \$1,472,000 annual operating revenue and 32 employees (9 full-time; 23 part-time/seasonal) during the 2024 Fiscal Year (November 1, 2023 to October 31, 2024). The Foundation continues to be supported by 250+ active volunteers who gave 41,150 service hours (valued at \$1,378,200) to sail and maintain our ship as well as deliver educational programming in 2024. Overall, FY24 delivered our best results since 2019, exceeding not only our FY23 results, but also our expectations. However, we did not achieve all of our revenue goals and some necessary costs were higher than planned, resulting in a \$23,800 loss. Capital expenditures totaling \$202,000 were largely covered by specific foundation and individual gifts.

KNF's long-term strategy continues to evolve by expanding partnerships and improving our maritime campus. On our 6.8-acre riverfront campus, we have invested more than \$15,000,000 in the ship, Copeland Maritime Center, permanent exhibits, modern dockage, and shipyard improvements. KNF is a significant and committed contributor to Wilmington's Christina Riverfront.

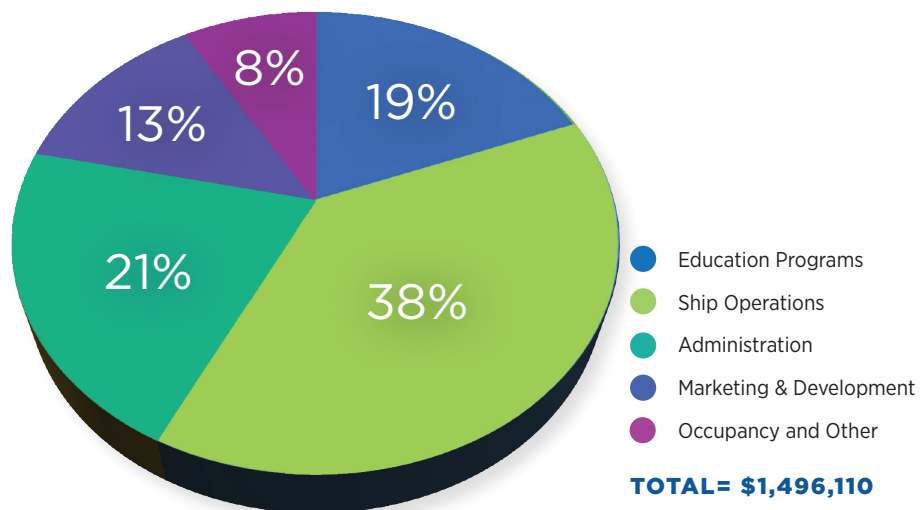
