Summer highs rather than winter lows pose the greater threat to battery life, according to the non-profit Car Care Council.




"When most motorists think of dead batteries that cause starting failure, they think of severe winter weather, but summer heat is the real culprit," said Rich White, Executive Director. To get the most life out of your battery, the Car Care Council suggests the following simple steps:


- Be sure the electrical system is charging at the correct rate. Overcharging can damage a battery as quickly as undercharging.
- If your battery is the type that needs to be topped off, check it regularly, especially in hot weather. Add distilled water when necessary.
- Always replace a battery with one that's
- rated at least as high as the one originally specified.
- Keep the top of the battery clean. Dirt
- becomes a conductor, which drains battery power.


DID YOU FORGET ABOUT YOUR VEHICLE'S ENGINE COOLING SYSTEM?

- Not everyone was on board with celebrating Independence Day on July 4th, the day Congress approved the Declaration. John Adams wanted to celebrate on July 2nd, the day Congress voted for independence.
- Only two people signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4th John Hancock & Charles Thomson, Secretary of Congress. Most of the others signed on August 2nd.
- America's 30th president, Calvin Coolidge, was born on July 4, 1872. Three US presidents have died on July 4th John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, & James Monroe. In a bizarre twist of fate, Adams & Jefferson both died on July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of the country they helped found.
- July 4th wasn't deemed a federal holiday until 1870, nearly 100 years after the nation was founded.
- "Yankee Doodle," a popular American patriotic song, was originally sung prior to the Revolution by British military officers in mockery of the unorganized & buckskin-wearing "Yankees."
- The "Star Spangled Banner" was written by Francis Scott Key & was
 originally a poem stemming from his observations in 1814 concerning the
 British attack on Baltimore's Fort McHenry during the War of 1812. It was
 later put to music, based on the English drinking song "To Anacreon in
 Heaven". It was decreed our official national anthem in 1931.



- The average age of those who signed the Declaration of Independence was 45. The youngest, at age 27, was Thomas Lynch, Jr., of South Carolina. The oldest was Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania at age 70. Thomas Jefferson was 33.
- The White House held its first 4th of July party in 1801.
- The oldest continuous Independence Day celebration in the United States is the 4th of July Parade in Bristol, Rhode Island. It began in 1785.
- 87.5% (\$2.8 million) of imported US flags are from China. 97% (\$190.7 million) of imported fireworks are from China.
- Other countries including Denmark, England, Norway, Portugal & Sweden celebrate the 4th of July because many of their citizens moved to the US or simply to attract American tourists.
