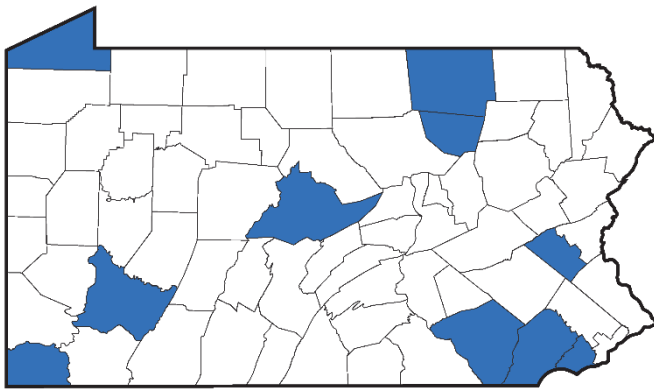


Office of Developmental Programs Intellectual Disability/Autism (ID/A) Supportive Housing Pilot

ODP's Intellectual Disabilities/Autism (ID/A) Supportive Housing Pilot began March 1, 2024 and includes ten counties from across the state. The Housing Pilot provides individuals with intellectual disabilities and/or autism with financial assistance coupled with supportive services to aid them in living in the community in their own homes.
