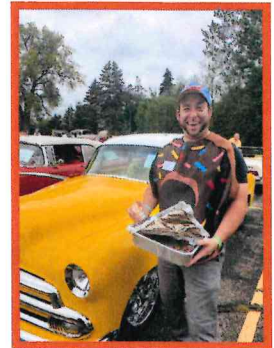

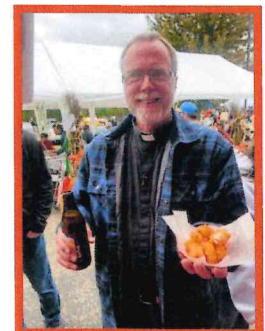

YOUTH

Diapers, crib mobiles, sleepers, teethingers, rattles, baby toys, blocks, pull toys, soft toys, cars and trucks, dolls, balls, board books, stickers, coloring books, crayons and markers, paints, Play-Doh, Slinky, stuffed animals, small musical instruments, puzzles, jump ropes, tennis balls, jewelry, hair accessories, wallets and purses, belts, sporting and fishing gear, camouflage vests, sweat pants and shirts, individually wrapped candy*

ALL AGES

Clothing, coats, socks, underwear, slippers, shoes, hats, scarves, mittens, books, games, craft kits, school supplies, backpacks, batteries, blankets, toiletries and cosmetics*

ADULT

Kitchen: cooking and baking equipment, home goods, bedding, towels, Christmas ornaments, wrapping paper, gift boxes and bags, sewing kits, flashlights, laundry soap

NOTES

- * All candy must be individually wrapped and placed in a plastic bag.
- * Toiletries and cosmetics must be placed in a Ziploc bag to prevent leaking.
- * Do not include frightening or war related items, such as guns or knives.
- * Articles that can be damaged by freezing, heavy items, or canned goods will not be accepted.
