The Greek word *ecclesiola* referred to "little church." The early Church understood that the home was fertile ground for discipleship, sanctification, and holiness.

- Light a candle.
- Slowly and solemnly read the words from the Bible.
- Allow for a moment of silence.
- Ask the children, 'What did you hear?'
