We will have our monthly fire drill along with this program.

Please bring your child's costume (NO WEAPONS) in a bag labeled with your child's name as we will change them after nap for the festivities !!! We will begin at 4:00pm. with a performance by the children... followed by a short costume parade... then our potluck =)

## Some reminders...

- 1. Please don't forget to label your child's belongings.
- 2. Please bring a light jacket every day or leave one in your child's cubby... Fall is here and the weather has been really cold in the mornings.
- **3.** Please remember to sign your child in and out. If you forget to sign in, we will contact you to come back and sign your child in by 12 noon. Otherwise, there is a fine of \$30 for missed signatures. This is very important as we look at the sign in sheet for emergencies and we want your child accounted for. Also, we can get fined approximately \$500 by the state if they pay us a surprise visit and our head count doesn't match up.
- 4. MOST IMPORTANT... we had an incident here in the past about someone breaking a car window of a parent and stealing a diaper bag and wallet. All in less than 2 minutes while the parent dropped their child off. On the day that it happened, there were 6 other similar incidents. We haven't had or heard of any other incidents since. Thank you for being more careful and bringing your belongings in with you when dropping off and picking up. This also includes younger or older siblings =) Anything can happen in a short amount of time. Not only that... It's illegal to leave a child alone in the car under any circumstance!!!
