As we step into the month of August, we find ourselves at a beautiful crossroads of summer and the anticipation of a new school year. Throughout August, we will focus on themes of exploration and discovery in our lessons, encouraging our children to deepen their understanding of faith and community.



Fun Facts:

- * The month of August was named after the Roman Emperor, Augustus Caesar. August is the last month of summer in the Northern Hemisphere and has 31 days. It is also the hottest month of the year.
- * Birth Flowers--Gladiolus is a vibrant multicolor flower, said to represent generosity and sincerity. The poppy is a bright flowering plant said to symbolize imagination and oblivion.
- * Birthstone(s)-- Peridot is the mineral oliven, formed under extreme conditions and found in hardened lava from Earth's mantle and meteorites. The Spinel is a gem alternate to the Ruby. Sardonyx is the original August birthstone made of chalcedony, a chrystaline quartz, sard and onyx. It has bands of brownish red to brown to dark orange sard alternating with typically white or black layers of onyx. The stone is said to represent strength of spiritual life.
- * The Anglo-Saxons also referred to August as the "weed month" due to rapid growth of weeds in the Northern Hemisphere during this time.

Important Dates:

- * Aug. 24, 79 AD--Mount Versuvius erupted, destroying Pompeii and all its inhabitants and burying it under 7 ft of lava.
- * Aug. 26, 1920--Woman's Equality Day-Celebrates the ratification of the 19th amendment, women's right to vote in the U.S.
- * Aug. 6, 1945--The first atomic bomb was detonated by the U.S. in the Japanese city of Hiroshima, marking a tragic day in world history. Three days later, Americans launched the 2nd atomic bomb on Nagasaki. The bombings are regarded as some of the most important historical occurrences of the 20th century.
- * Aug. 14, 1961--Marks U.S. 44th President, Barrack Obama's birthday


11 For I know the plans I have for you,"

THE LADIES BIBLE STUDY Bonnye Vidal

Meets 10am-12pm Wednesday mornings (except the first Wednesday, which is the Women's Luncheon). We welcome women of all ages, and you do not need to be a member of Dellview Baptist Church to attend.

What we are learning: Our current study is based upon God's heavenly pattern described at Hebrews 8:5. God's Word has always provided descriptions or blueprints of each pattern—which ALWAYS reflect an evolving picture of Christ. Today I want to shed light on some of the feasts celebrated by the Israelites.

The Israelites were required to keep several "appointed" festivals; see Leviticus Chapter 23. In the first month of the Jewish calendar is the Passover (usually April), followed by the feast of unleavened bread for seven days. The Passover is the day Death passed over the children of Israel in Egypt when they placed the blood of the lamb over their door post; see Exodus Chapter 12.

Leviticus 23:9-21: After the Israelites entered the promised land, they were commanded to bring to God an offering of the first grain of the harvest. Then, from the day that they brought that first grain, they were to count off 7 weeks (or 49 days), and on the 50th day they were to celebrate the new grain, offering bread as its firstfruits (Pentecost or Shavuot). It seemed to me that the first grain would vary from year to year, depending on each year's planting weather.

However...now pay close attention for God's Word is amazing: The CURRENT Jewish calendars, both 2024 and 2025, begin counting off the fifty days on the day following Passover. So behold, in their own feasts that they celebrate, there is no clearer picture that Jesus IS that first grain of the harvest (his resurrection). And exactly fifty days after his resurrection, the disciples obeyed Jesus and were waiting in that upper room on the day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit arrived; Acts Chapter 1. The Holy Spirit is the new grain, and those receiving the Holy Spirit are its firstfruits.

May God open the eyes of the Jewish people to see the glory of our Lord Jesus. Selah.

I Never Knew That Was in the Bible... Apple of One's Eye

If one or something is the "apple of one's eye," then they are a very precious or treasured possession. The apple is a metaphor for the pupil of the eye. The association of the eye - itself very precious - with a person or thing that is highly valued -- lies behind this expression. This phrase occurs three times in the KJV:

Deuteronomy 32:10, Psalm 17:8 and Proverbs 7:2 -- Look them up!
