Day 1: Sunday, July 5, 2026 Vancouver, British Columbia Take a remarkable journey through the stunning landscapes, charming towns and beautiful lakes of the Canadian Rockies. Your adventure opens in Vancouver. With arrival times varying, there are no scheduled activities today.

Day 2: Monday, July 6, 2026 Vancouver - VIA Rail Begin your Vancouver sightseeing tour at beautiful Stanley Park, Canada's renowned urban rainforest. Waterfalls, rushing rivers, glacial peaks, imposing cliffs and snowcapped peaks paint the breathtaking canvas - so have your camera handy! Enjoy a stop at the Athabasca Falls and marvel at its sheer beauty and power. Then, it's your choice! Stop at the Athabasca Glacier and choose a fun ride across this mass of glacial ice which is over 1,000 feet thick - the largest accumulation of ice south of the Arctic Circle -OR- take a walk on the Columbia Icefield Skywalk to experience the breathtaking views of the Sunwapta Valley and witness the dramatic landscape from the glass-floored platform. Continuing down the parkway, be on the lookout for bears, furry marmots and stately elk. Enjoy a stop at Bow Lake – a beautiful crystal-clear lake fed by Bow Glacier - before arriving in Lake Louise. The overall activity level of this tour is a level 2. This means you like a balanced approach to travel. Walking two to three miles over the course of a day is no problem for you. You can handle a variety of terrains, from cobblestone streets to moderate hills with relative ease and without assistance. You can climb two flights of stairs with ease. Expect some full days balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. You can handle altitudes up to 6,000 feet. While this level is appropriate for travelers that require mobility assistance devices, there could be times when you may have to sit out on some of the included activities.

Travel with an average of 37 people (maximum of 44).

Please note that maneuvering on the train will be difficult as you need to walk by 20 to 30 cars to get to yours. Assistance from VIA Rail attendants is limited and boarding the train requires climbing some large steps. Also, the sleeping cars are small and have bunk beds that require using a ladder. Additionally, making your way to the dining and dome cars on the narrow passageways while the train is moving can be challenging for those with balance issues. Once onboard, you will not have access to your wheelchair or walker due to the narrow corridors.

There may be 1 to 2 days on this tour when walking tours can cover 3 to 4 miles over uneven terrain.


