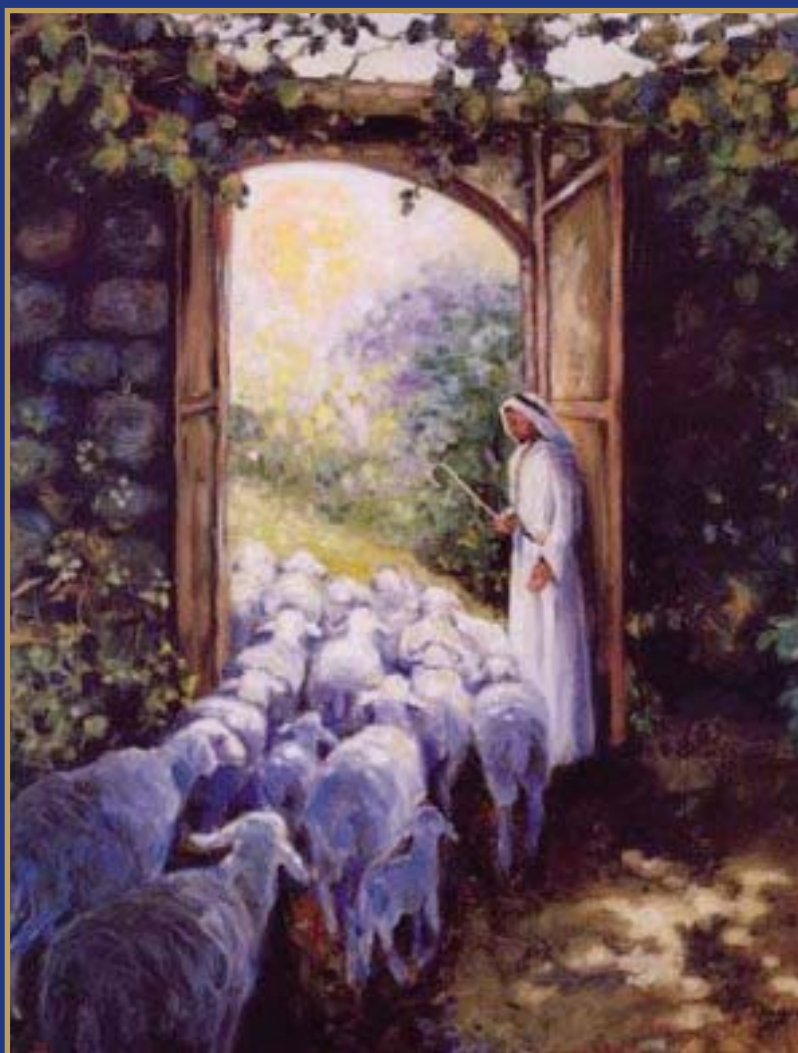

Greetings, brothers and sisters. This weekend, Catholic churches across the world, and many Protestant churches as well, observe this Sunday as Good Shepherd Sunday. Probably more than any other image of Jesus that I've seen, besides the Crucifix, is of Him as the Good Shepherd. We're probably quite familiar with this Gospel passage from today and we get the picture.

There are a few points I'd like us to consider in reflecting on the words of our gospel today that make the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd so profoundly appropriate. Besides being cute and adorable, sheep are also three things:

- a. Straying. Not always paying attention to where they should be, or what they should / shouldn't be doing.
- b. Copycats. If one does it and it looks like fun, they all do it.
- c. May not be the smartest. Kind of innocent, naive, and inadvertently get into trouble.

Can we see the similarities to ourselves? If this is sometimes what we're like, do you think having a shepherd is a good idea? Jesus is warning us that there are spiritual thieves and robbers out there who would easily devour us if we're not careful.

Have we ever felt we've been robbed – of happiness, comforts, and security – those things which perhaps our neighbors seem to be very blessed with? Do we sometimes feel that we may only be one step ahead of a disaster, or not know how tomorrow will ever be better? Are we consumed with real worry – for ourselves or our families? Maybe we can see no light at the end of our dark tunnel, and we're very alone.

Perhaps there are ways in which our very souls are threatened – with vices, anger and hostility. Have we strayed into places where we recognize now we should never have gone? Have we been copycatting others too much and found ourselves in jams very difficult to get out of? Darkness can take many forms, and the thieves can take many shapes. Are there experiences in our lives telling us that we need the help of a Good Shepherd?



This Sunday is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We could use more good shepherds. The need is great. Good shepherds bring peace in times of turbulence. They keep us from danger and lead us where we need to go. And very importantly, they are concerned about *each one* of their sheep! Please pray with us for God to continue to provide more good shepherds for our world. Lord, we thank you for the shepherds you have sent to us. Keep them always safe and under your protection. Inspire others among us to respond to your call to lead and guide our flock with faith and courage. We ask these things in your Holy Name.

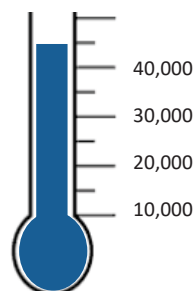

Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

Saudações, irmãos e irmãs. Neste fim de semana, as igrejas católicas em todo o mundo — e também muitas igrejas protestantes — celebram este domingo como o Domingo do Bom Pastor. Provavelmente, mais do que qualquer outra imagem de Jesus que já vi — com exceção do Crucifixo —, a que mais se destaca é a Dele como o Bom Pastor. Provavelmente já estamos bastante familiarizados com esta passagem do Evangelho de hoje e compreendemos bem a imagem que ela evoca.

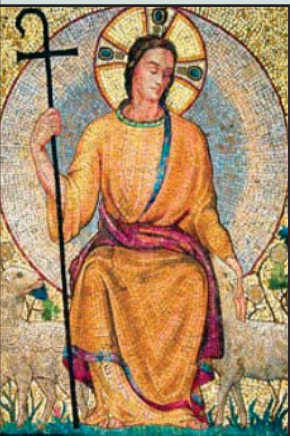
Há alguns pontos que gostaria que considerássemos, ao refletirmos sobre as palavras do Evangelho de hoje, que tornam a imagem de Jesus como o Bom Pastor tão profundamente apropriada. Além de serem fofas e adoráveis, as ovelhas também apresentam três características:

- a) Tendência a se extraviar. Nem sempre prestam atenção ao lugar onde deveriam estar, ou ao que deveriam — ou não — estar fazendo.
- b) Comportamento de imitação. Se uma faz algo e aquilo parece divertido, todas as outras fazem o mesmo.
- c) Falta de esperteza. São um tanto inocentes e ingênuas, acabando por se meter em encrencas de forma inadvertida.

Conseguimos enxergar as semelhanças conosco mesmos? Se, às vezes, somos assim, você acha que ter um pastor é uma boa ideia? Jesus nos adverte de que existem ladrões e salteadores espirituais por aí que nos devorariam facilmente se não tomássemos cuidado.

Já sentimos alguma vez que fomos roubados — da felicidade, do conforto e da segurança — daquelas coisas com as quais, talvez, nossos vizinhos pareçam ser tão abençoados? Sentimos, por vezes, que podemos estar a apenas um passo de um desastre, ou que não sabemos como o amanhã poderá ser melhor? Estamos consumidos por uma preocupação real — conosco mesmos ou com nossas famílias? Talvez não consigamos enxergar luz alguma no fim do nosso túnel escuro, e nos sintamos muito sozinhos.

Talvez existam maneiras pelas quais nossas próprias almas estejam ameaçadas — por vícios, raiva e hostilidade. Será que nos desviamos para lugares onde agora reconhecemos que jamais deveríamos ter ido? Será que temos imitado demais os outros e nos visto em apuros dos quais é muito difícil sair? A escuridão pode assumir muitas formas, e os ladrões podem ter muitos rostos. Existem experiências em nossas vidas que nos dizem que precisamos da ajuda de um Bom Pastor?



Este domingo é também o Dia Mundial de Oração pelas Vocações. Precisamos de mais bons pastores. A necessidade é grande. Bons pastores trazem paz em tempos de turbulência. Eles nos livram do perigo e nos conduzem para onde precisamos ir. E, o que é muito importante, eles se preocupam com cada uma de suas ovelhas! Por favor, orem conosco para que Deus continue a enviar mais bons pastores para o nosso mundo. Senhor, nós Te agradecemos pelos pastores que nos enviaste. Mantém-nos sempre seguros e sob a Tua proteção. Inspira outros, dentre nós, a responder ao Teu chamado para liderar e guiar o nosso rebanho com fé e coragem. Pedimos estas coisas em Teu Santo Nome.

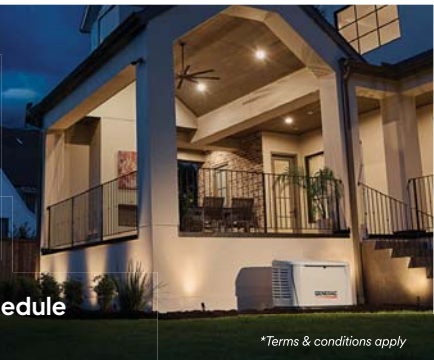


